ST. CYR WILL NOT SWING.
Minister of Justice Has Committed Sentence to Life-Long Imprisonment.

Ottawa, March 18.—Lord Minto approved the sentence of the Ontario Court today commencing death sentence passed upon George St. Cyr, Watson City, Yukon Territory, to imprisonment for life. St. Cyr and James Davis were both wood choppers. They had a dispute, and Davis was killed from the side of a gun, which was in the hands of St. Cyr. St. Cyr afterwards gave himself up, stating that he did not intend to shoot Davis, and that the gun went off by mistake. St. Cyr, however, was tried for murder, and was found guilty. The jury gave a recommendation to mercy, and the trial judge sent to Ottawa a report favorable to commutation, there being in the case a doubt as to whether the shooting was intentional or otherwise, and consequently the prisoner was given the benefit of the doubt. The Minister of Justice therefore made a recommendation for commutation, which has now been approved. St. Cyr was to have been hanged on June 7. He will now be taken to New Westminster, B.C., Penitentiary.
