- I. Of the Sun, February 12th, invisible.
- II. Of the Moon, February 26th, visible, as follows:
 - Beginning of the Eclipse - - 11h. 29m. P. M.
 - Beginning of total darkness - 0h. 35m. A. M. 27th.
 - Middle of the Eclipse - - - 1h. 28m. A. M.
 - End of total darkness - - - 2h. 20m. A. M.
 - End of the Eclipse - - - - 3h. 26m. A. M.
- Digits eclipsed, 20° 40' from South side of the Earth's shadow.
- III. Of the Sun, March 13th, invisible.
- IV. Of the Sun, August 7th, invisible.
- V. Of the Moon, August 22d, invisible.
- VI. Of the Sun, September 5th, invisible.
