

TYPES OF SHELLS FIRED BY THE GERMANS

DIFFERENT GERMAN SHELLS FIRED AGAINST ALLIES LINE

This view shows samples of the heavy metal which the Germans have been flinging against the lines of the Allies. It was obtained in the fortress of Ossovetz, which held out so gallantly and successfully for many months against huge odds. The biggest shell must measure fully 5 ft 6 in. in height. Compare with the height of the commander of the fortress, who is standing by. Note also the weight of the metal forming the nose of the shell lying at the feet of the commander:
