The following sections of an Act relating to the Coast Fisheries, &c., are published for the information of Fishermen, Coasters and Pilots:

Sec. XXI.—The owner of every vessel or boat under the burthen of fifteen tons belonging to this Province, and employed in fishing, coasting, or piloting, shall furnish a written description of abode, and occupation, to the chief officer of the rovincial Treasury of the district wherein the owner resides; such officer shall thereupon grant to the owner a certificate, that the requisite description has been filed with him, and that a certain number has been fixed thereto; which number shall thereafter be painted conspicuously on both bows in figures not less than nine inches it length, and on the mainsail of such vessel or boat in figures not less than three teet in length.

XXII.—Vessels or boats belonging to owners residing within the Bay of Fundy, shall be distinguished by numerals in red on the bows and mainsail.

XXII.—Every vessel or boat under the burthen of fifteen tons, be onging to this Province, and found fishing, coasting or piloting near its shores, without bearing a distinguishing number on the bows and mainsail, as above provided, shall be seized and detained until properly numbered, and until the jayment of a fine not exceeding five pounds.
