A WORLD CONGRESS OF METHODISM.

No matter how cynics may view it, the present era is affording many opportunities for the cultivation of international amity.

To-morrow in Washington, D. C. the various Methodist bodies throughout the world assemble for the second time as an "Ecumenical Methodist Conference."
