





The building record in Toronto for 1906 is as follows: 3,439 permits issued, valued at \$13,160,396, while in 1905, 2,674 permits valued at \$10,347,910 were issued. For the month of December, 1906, 223 permits were issued having a value of \$969,783, as against 105 permits worth \$604,350 in 1905. There were 4710 new buildings erected in 1906, an increase over 1905 of 1645.

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Sectional View of finished One-piece Shovel, showing gauge or thick ness of steel at different points

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

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#### RESULTS OF MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS.

Numerous by-laws were voted upon by the different municipalities throughout Ontario on Monday last, and by the accompanying list it will be seen that in the majority of cases the by-laws were carried.

Southampton approved of a bylaw to extend the waterworks system at a cost of \$5,000.

Tweed carried the by-law providing for the construction of granolithic side-walks.

Napanee decided, by a large majority, to improve the sewerage system.

Waterloo ratepayers carried the by-law which provides for improvements to the sewer farm at a cost of \$23,000.

Peterboro carried a by-law to provide \$21,000 additional to the \$40,000 already in the hands of the Board of Education to erect a new Collegiate Institute.

Lancaster carried the Good Roads by-law.

Stratford defeated by-laws to provide money for a market shelter, trunk sewer and implement shelter.

Collingwood defeated by-laws to build a new public schoool and a fire hall.

At Morrisburg the by-law to provide \$20,000 for extension and improvements to electric power plant was defeated.

London defeated the by-law to extend the waterworks at a cost of \$575,000 and also the by-law providing for an expenditure of \$75,-000 on an Isolation Hospital.

St. Catharines voted favorably for extension of the water works to the cemetery.

Listowell decided to raise \$14,-500 to construct new bridges.

Brantford carried sewer extension by-law.

Woodstock endorsed a by-law to raise \$20,000 for sewer extensions.

Guelph decided to loan \$25,000 to Morlock Bros., to extend their factory.

Renfrew decided to raise \$6,000 for sewer extensions, and the county system of good roads was carried.

Bolton will raise \$2,500 for cement walks.

Lindsay defeated the water works filtration by-law by a large majority.

Harriston voted to raise money for school purposes.

Thorold carried water works bylaw.

Campbellford defeated a by-law to raise \$12,000 for improvement of sidewalks.

Paris defeated a by-law to raise \$12,000 for school purposes.

Windsor defeated a \$12,000 bylaw to improve the electric light plant, and a by-law to suspend macadam paving for five years was a time.


