



THE IRISH HARVEST .- The harves news that comes from Ireland is any-thing but satisfactory. Rains sadly in-terfered with the gathering of the wheat. To add to these mistortunes the potato rot had spread extensively, and altogether the appearances are that laboring classes must endure serious privations. The rise in the price of fuel and food, keenly felt by families with fixed incomes, has caused a slackness in trade. It is now beyond question that large importations will be required to make good the deficiency in the wheat crops throughout Great Britain and Ireland, and of course the drain of gold to pay the foreigners will tell in the money market.
