THE TALL M.A. NOMINATED

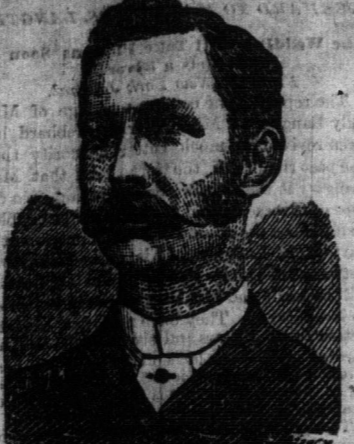
