After a voyage of four days we reached Janean. It is a small mining town, has one principal street with the usual number of general stores, saloons, etc. Douglas Island, or Douglas, is directly across from Junean, and on it is the celebrated Treadwell gold mine, named after the discoverer, Treadwell, a Canadian. It is now owned by the Alaska Treadwell Gold Mining Com-pany. The mine is like a large quarry. They get out between six and seven hundred ton of ore each day. The quartz mill is the largest in the world, 240 stores, and runs day and night, Sundays and holidays, ex-cept 4th July and Christmas. The men change from day to night work every sec-ond Sunday. The company employs about 200 men. Indians do the rough work. The mill, boarding house, etc., are lighted by slectricity, eighteen arc and 136 incandes-cent lamps.
