CHINESE SHORES. China and Japan Must Not Hamper the Freedom of Foreigners -Concerted Action to Be Taken By the Powers to Protect the Lives and Liber-

London, Oct. 8 .- The Daily Graphic prints to-day a despatch from Shanghai saying that Japanese transports have landed a large force at Talien-Wan, on the Chinese coast, northeast of Port

Japanese Proceeding Cautionsly. The Tien-Tsin correspondent of The Times telegraphs: "The Japanese are pursuing their campaign toward Mouk-den cautiously, avoiding all dashing en-

Ping Yang fugitives describe the Japanese tactics at the battle as most scientific and the Japanese wea-pons as perfect, while the Chinese oper-ations were conducted in antiquated fashion. The Japanese, by paying for supplies and keeping descipline, are gain-ing the sympathies of the Coreans. The French admiral is here."

On Monday last N. R. O'Connor, the British Minister at Pekin, warned the Foreign Office by cable that the con-dition of affairs in China was such that the Government was not able to guar-antee protection to foreign residents at the treaty ports and the missionaries in the interior of the country. The Minis-ter, in the same despatch, stated that the Chinese Imperial Council was disorganiz-ed and that the collapse of the Gövern-ment was not looked upon as an impossi-bility, and advised that instant action be taken for the protection of the lives and property of British subjects in Chi-na. The substance of this despatch was at once communicated by Lord Rosebery to the Governments of France, Russia and Germany, with the suggestion that the powers co-operate in increasing the guard at the treaty ports, and in mea-sures for the protection of the mission-aries.
