ORIENTAL DIVISION, SONS OF TEMPERANCE. Pictou, N. S., Octr. 21st, 1850.

Whereas, it is the belief of this Division that God made of one blood all nations of men that dwell on the face of all the earth, and also that God created all men free and equal; and whereas M. W. P. Saml. F. Cary unequivocally and distinctly asserts in his report the seventh annual session of the National Division held in Boston, and which assertions, we have heretofore believed to be the genuine and sincere sentiments of all Sons of Temperance, viz.:—"that unlike any civil or ecclesiastical body of this vast country, we come with no sectional feeling to gratify, no party interest to subserve. We know no north no south,—our efforts are confined to no geographical boundaries—our labours of love and mercy know no limits but those which prescribe the wretchedness of man. To bind the family of man with the triple cord of love, purity, and fidelity."

Now these being the sentiments of us all, therefore,

Resolved, That to impose on Subordinate Divisions any other test of membership, than that which is already prescribed by the Constitution, is unnecessary and unwarrantable—an injudicious innovation which will eventually prove detrimental to the stability of our Order.

Resolved, That the National Division of North America in prescribing the colour of skin as a test of fitness or unfitness for membershap into Subordinate Divisions, has outraged propriety, justice, and ranson, stultified itself and nullified the declaration above cited of M. W. P. Samuel F. Carey, and therefore its enactments on this subject cannot be regarded as valid by this Division.

Resolved, That the National Division of North America has, in the estimation of this Division, far exceeded its legitimate authority in imposing its prejudices as law upon all Subordinate Divisions.

Resolved, That our representatives be instructed to bring the subject of the above resolutions to the notice of the Grand Division, at its first meeting, and to urge them to protest against the action of the National Division at its late session.

On motion, voted, to refer the above resolutions to a special Committee, with instructions to report at the present session.

REPORT:

The Committee to whom were referred the communications on the License Law, addressed to the Grand Division, beg leave to report as follows:-That they have given the subject their most careful and anxious consideration, and have found no difficulty whatever in coming to a unanimous decision on the general principles involved. With respect however to the application of these principles to the present state of the Province, great diversity of view has been elicited, and therefore your Committee would deem it to be the more prudent course in the mean time to aim chiefly at indoctrinating the public mind with such truths, as will of necessity, when thoroughly received, accomplish the end in view, both speedily and effectually. This might be obtained by free discussion in Subordinate Divisions, by appeals to the Legislature and the studious employment of that wholesome agitation, without which no question of vital moment to the well being of Society, can be reasonably expected to be carried.

The following summary of principles may for this purpose be confidently recommended:—

1st. That it is the duty of every wise Legislature to pass enactments for the entire suppression of the manufacture, importation, and sale of intoxicating liquors, so soon as this can be effected, with safety to the general interests of society.

2nd. That no legal sanction whatever ought to be given to any traffic, so injurious to individual and social prosperity, and therefore all License Laws are to be regarded as in principle unsound.

3rd. That any person who shall engage in the traffic, whether with or without legal sanction, shall be held both civilly and crimi-

nally answerable for all consequences.

4th. That the property of confirmed drunkards shall be dealt with by law in the same manner, as that of persons whose imbecility is the result of divine dispensation, and be protected for the benefit of relatives and creditors.

Your Committee would farther recommend the following practical details:—

1st. That a petition embodying these views shall be prepared by this Grand Division, and transmitted to the Legislature at its first session.

2nd. That every Subordinate Division be provided with a copy of the above, with an urgent request to seriously deliberate and report thereon, on or before the 1st of January ensuing, to the G. S.

3rd. That a general form of Petition, founded on the principles announced, be prepared and remitted to each Subordinate Division for signature, and transmission to the Legisture.

REPORT:

The Committee to whom the address of the Grand Worthy Patriarch was submitted, respectfully present the following report:—

The subjects to which that address invites the attention of this Division, are in the opinion of your Committee, of vital importance, not only as bearing on the prosperity of our Order, but also as being intimately connected with the progress of Total Abstinence, and the prosperity of our country. One of these subjects—the License Law—has been assigned to a Special Committee, and therefore does not come within our province; but on the others, after careful consideration, we have arrived at conclusions, which we now respectfully and

with diffidence lay before the Division.

The suspension and expulsion of members for non-payment of dues, appears to us to be not only harsh, but also exceedingly unwise. It tends to diminish the pecuniary resources of our Divisions, while it is at the same time a rude assault on the Temperance principles of those on whom it is inflicted, and must unquestionably have caused the ruin of some, whom it was the duty of their brethren to have preserved. It is our opinion therefore, that the National Division should be petitioned to repeal the law by which suspension or expulsion is inflicted for non-payment of dues. Instead of this we would propose that no member who is in arrears for one year's dues, shall receive benefits, or be eligible to hold an office, or to vote on appropriations of money, till two months after he has become clear of the books. This nearly corresponds with the resolution which was on the table of the National Division at its last session.

The Committee are deeply impressed with the vast importance of creating a fund, for the dissemination of our principles. That the glorious rule which is our bond of union, will yet govern the conduct of every dweller on this earth's surface, they firmly believe—when this may be, they regard as, to a great extent a money question. In moral, as well as physical conflicts money is the sinews of war, while it is also the best, and as far as most of us is concerned, the only test of sincerity. Without money, our professions of univer-

sal love are a hollow and delusive mockery—money changes them into realities which will introduce a golden age. Several plans for the accomplishment of this object have occupied our attention, but we believe the following to be liable to fewest objections:—That it be recommended to the Subordinate Divisions, that they permit those members who are so inclined, to appropriate to the dissemination of Temperance principles, a part of their monthly dues; if they consent to a corresponding reduction of their benefits in case of sickness. The money thus raised may be expended either by the contributors or by the Grand Division. If this regulation be adopted, it is our opinion, that no appropriation of the regular funds, for purposes foreign from the necessary expenditure, should be made, except by a unanimous vote.

To the contemplated change in the initiating ritual and other ceremonies of the Subordinate Divisions, the Committee are strongly opposed. They are aware of no reason for dissatisfaction with the present ritual, which they believe to be at once simple and impressive; and though other forms might at first possess the charm of novelty, they in their turn would soon become threadbare. Believing with the Most Worthy Scribe, that "our national legislation should bear the stamp of a fixed as well as liberal policy," and also, that "too frequent change of organic law is dangerous to stability," we would therefore recommend that no alteration be made in the

present forms and ceremonies of the Order.

The Committee are of opinion that a brother so circumstanced, is not entitled to benefits, and stands in the position of a brother initiated for the first time.

Brother A. W. McLennan asks: Can a person on payment of initiation fees and monthly dues be admitted to the order as a non-benefit member? This Committee report, that under a decision of the last annual session of the National Division, the admission of members under such circumstances is clearly unconstitutional.

Voted, that the thanks of this Grand Division be presented to Bro. Wm. Ackhurst, for the able manner in which he discharged the duties of Grand Marshal.

Voted, to appoint a Committee to report on the expediency of renewing the petition to the Legislature, for an Act of Incorporation for the Grand and Subordinate Divisions of the Order in this Province.

Bros. Hon. J. W. Johnston, John Campbell, W. M. Brown, C. B. Naylor, and Robert Noble, were appoint-

ed in accordance with the foregoing vote.

On motion, voted, to reconsider the vote, affirming the ineligibility of Bros. William Burrill, A. M. Gidney, and Thos. O. Geddes, to re-election as representatives to the National Division.

The following resolutions were moved by Bro.

P. G. W. P., J. McMurray:—

Resolved, That it is to be regretted that the credentials of the following brothers, viz.: William Burrill, Thos. O. Geddes and Angus M. Gidney, have not been presented to this Grand Division, to enable them to have been elected as representatives to the National Division.

Whereas at the session of this body, held on the 31st ult., a resolution was passed, (and on this morning reconsidered and again carried

in the affirmative) appointing Halifax as the place of the next annual session (to be held in October, 1851). And as the same appears to be in direct violation of a distinct understanding of members of this body, present at the last annual session, (when it was decided that the annual sessions be held alternately between Yarmouth and Halifax) and it also appears due to the Sons of Temperance of Yarmouth, to whose zeal in the cause we are indebted for the introduction of the Order into this Province.

We therefore protest against said action, as being likely to prove detrimental to the interests of the Order in that section of the Province.
