Wherefore This Campaign? There is a naive admission in the letter of an insurance policyholder, published elsewhere to-day. He says that when he first saw our articles on insurance he thought the object in view was to provide a sensation for a dull season of the year.

Another reporter of the public mind comes in to say that some discerning people see in this publicity just a move to make political capital at the expense of a company whose heads happen to be Liberals.

A third caller supposes that this paper has some dark and evil designs upon the commercial stability of Canada, and adduces in support of that opinion a statement made to him in a remote town to the effect that no business promoted in Toronto is worthy to be trusted because "the Toronto crowd are so crooked."

The World is satisfied that neither of these three suppositions is at all extensively held by the public. As the Premier's speech, given in another column, it is evident that the public for a part of the time; but no newspaper man who knows his business believes that you can fool the public all the time.

It is true that the president of the Canada Life is a noble senator who has been described by The Investors' Review as the Liberal wire puller of Canada. There are innocent, well-meaning creatures who really think that to touch a business man is to prejudice the health of the body commercial. It is hardly worth while to argue with them; they are so honest, so ingenuous and so impossible.

Chamberlain, formerly general manager of the Both Railway System; the Continental Railway Construction Co., that includes Sir Montagu Allan and several other leading Montreal capitalists; a construction company in which Hon. J. M. Gibson of Hamilton and E. F. Pearson of Halifax are understood to be interested.

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WOULD NOT PAY TRIBUTE.

Saloon of Italian Wrecked After Threats Were Made.

New York, Feb. 14.—A dynamite explosion, declared to have been the work of the "Black Hand" fraternity, completely wrecked the interior of the saloon of John De Lesio, in Brooklyn, early to-day. The windows of houses adjoining also were broken by the concussion.
