SPAIN ACCEPTS CONDITIONS.

New York, Aug. 2 .- A special cable to The Evening Journal from Madrid, published in a late extra edition of that paper, says : "Spain accepts the principal conditions of peace as set forth by

the American Government, and only the peace details are needed to cause all hostilities to cease at once. "A peace delegation will be chosen at once to confer with the repre-

sentatives of the United States. The peace conditions set forth by President McKinley were discussed at some length to-day by Minister Sagasta, and at the conclusion it was given out officially that the terms of the United States would be accepted. There are one or two amendments in the proposition of the United States that Spain will ask to be made, and if this is done peace will be declared at once."

THE NEWS CONFIRMED FROM LONDON.

London, Aug. 3 .- The Madrid correspondent of The Daily Mail says: "The Government has accepted the principle of the American conditions, but the acceptance will not be made public until enquiries to Washington on matters of detail have been settled, thus rounding off the preliminary basis."
