## THE HARBOR SQUARE DEAL.

Nothing more strong than the proposal to lease Harbor Square to the Baseball Club than the Board of Control's refusal to endorse the proposition. The board hope to escape responsibility in the matter, but their action is tantamount to a confession that public opinion is so hostile to the project that they have not put themselves on record as favoring it. The refusal of the board to vote the club's application will be rightly construed by the public as a sneaking attempt on the part of the board to grant a privilege in the face of public disapproval. There is no reason why the Toronto Baseball Club should be dealt with otherwise than in a purely business way. The club is in the baseball business for profit, not for the public benefit. It is certain the fencing in of the square and the erection of a big grand stand will be of credit to the quality or beauty of the park. We know that the fence and buildings will disfigure the water front. The public will be deprived of the use of the square for three hours on every day a game of ball is played. Furthermore the shouting which will be in evidence will be a nuisance to the people who live in the vicinity and divert the workmen in the nearby factories from their duties. Why should the city assume these and other risks for a paltry \$1000 a year? The abandonment of the square by a high board fence, in our opinion, the strongest objection to the project, is the only course sufficient to put the club's application out of court. Wooding Park will give an idea of how the fence and grand stand would disfigure the locality. While the park with its green oval and well kept grounds is beautiful on the inside, the outside of the park is hideous with its high fences, its sheds and stands backing up along the street. We would have a similar expense along the Esplanade if Harbor Square were fenced off. The view of the wharves and bay would be shut out from the city side, while the enclosure would greatly detract from the appearance of the water front as it is seen by passengers on incoming steamers. It is to be hoped the Council will not run counter to an almost unanimous public opinion. The club should be politely requested to look out for another site. There is no dearth of them in the city.

## TORONTO AND THE DRESSED-MEAT INDUSTRY.

Among the industrial possibilities of Toronto is the establishment of a big dressed-meat trade in connection with the cattle market. This city is the collecting and distributing centre of the cattle trade of the province in relation to its position as the leading packing and exporting city of the continent. The recent annual report of the Union Stock Yards and Transit Company of Chicago gives some interesting figures as to the possibilities of this industry. It is stated that 225,000 of Chicago's population get their living directly from the stock yards, and nearly as many indirectly.
