Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society.

34TH ANNUAL REPORT.

In presenting their 34th Annual Report, the Lady Managers of the Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society desire to express their deep sense of gratitude to a kind and over-ruling Providence for the many blessings vouchsafed to the Home during another year. Throughout this period it has been almost entirely free from any serious illness, and quite so from infectious disease. During the present year there have been as many as 157 inmates in the Institution at one time. Since June, of 1884, 82 children have been admitted, 34 removed by relatives, 6 apprenticed, and 1 adopted. The average number for the year has been 148, though for the past five months there have not been fewer than 151, an increase of 31 since the date of the last Annual Report.

It is satisfactory and encouraging to find that, on the whole, good reports have been received of the children who have been apprenticed. In several instances two sisters or brothers have been placed in the same household, and have succeeded, through their amiability and good qualities, in securing true friends in their employers. Many of the children are improving fast in those things which will be serviceable to them when they leave the Institution. The larger girls who are able assist the cook, housemaid and laundress in their several duties, and it is to be hoped that still greater progress will be made in future in regard to those important matters, as the Managers are most anxious that both girls and boys should be trained in careful, industrious habits, suitable to their future condition in life. The Home was visited this year by a youth who had been a former inmate, and who spoke in the most gratifying manner of the benefits and blessings which he had enjoyed there; while many of the children who have now become prosperous men and women write frequently to the friends of the Institution, expressing their gratitude for the thoughtful care and shelter given them in their helpless childhood. Within a month past a most pleasing letter was received from one of these young men, who had succeeded in accumulating \$2,000,

with which he intended to buy a farm in Dakota, and who gave all the credit of his present prosperity to his early training in the Home.

The demands made upon this Institution have been greater than ever this year, the Managers having been obliged to receive many children who were eligible for the Girls' Home, but could not be admitted, owing to the outbreak of an infectious disease among the inmates, as well as the alterations still in progress in that building. For many years past the Home has sheltered and cared for the orphans of several Freemasons, and, with the exception of \$20 (twenty dollars) occasionally for the Gregory children, there has been nothing given for their maintenance, though the Managers have applied several times to the Society in the City, representing that these children are being kept upon public charity, while at the same time they have a large fund reserved for the support of the widows and orphans of the members of this fraternity. Under these circumstances, the Home feels it is entitled to some remuneration for what it has done in the past, and is still doing. Acting upon the suggestion of a gentleman who visited the Home, the Managers arranged to have a gymnasium for the boys, who, during the long and severe winters, have felt the want of some indoor exercise. In the pleasure which it has already given them, the Managers feel more than repaid. As in previous years, the Matron, Miss Wheelwright, has shown unwearied care and attention in her general oversight of affairs; Miss Armstrong, too, under whose judicious management the children are making marked progress; not only is improvement noticeable in their studies, but the order and discipline maintained by her in the schoolroom have been a source of much satisfaction to the Board. The Managers take this opportunity of thanking Mr. Huson Murray, their Solicitor, for his unremitting attention to the affairs of the Institution; as well as Doctors Macdonell and McConnell for their consideration of those requiring medical attention; also to the kind friends who assist in the religious instruction of the little ones the Committee beg to tender their sincere thanks. Many friends of the orphans have, with their accustomed consideration for the children, given them numerous opportunities of enjoyment during the summer. Nor have the usual thoughtful contributions to the comforts of the children been

omitted. Donations have been gratefully received from the victuallers, bakers and grocers of the City, who have assisted in supplying the needs of the orphan.

Two of the Committee of Council have been removed by death, the late Bishop of Niagara, who was closely identified with the early workings of this Institution, and Mr. Andrew Fleming, who, from the first opening of the Home, has been one of its warmest friends, always ready to give his time and means for its benefit. He each Christmas collected from merchants and farmers gifts of good cheer for the children, and shortly before his death, when ill and suffering, he went about with the boys in the bitter cold that donations in kind might be sent in as usual; his name and memory will always be held in affectionate remembrance by those who knew of his unceasing interest in all connected with the Institution.

Two of our oldest Managers, Mrs. Samuel Taylor and Mrs. Crombie, have passed away, both of whom retained to the last their interest in the Home work, contributing as liberally to its support as when active members of the Board.

The Managers have to regret the retirement of three of their number, Mrs. Harvie, Mrs. McMurrich and Mrs. Cameron; the latter desires to have her name placed among the Patronesses, and promises as warm and liberal an interest in the Home as she has hitherto shown. Professor Schneider, the popular visitor to the Sunday School, who is about to return to England, will be greatly missed by the children, who lose in him one of the kindest of friends. There has been an addition to the funds of the Home through a bequest of \$500 from the estate of the late Mr. Williams, of Owen Sound, which sum will partially replace that usually netted by the Annual Ball, which was indefinitely postponed, owing to the strong sympathy felt at the call of the Volunteers of our City to the North-West.

Annexed will be found the Treasurer's Report, with a full and satisfactory statement of the financial condition of the Home.
