MARITIME BAPTISTS
Sixtieth Annual Convention
Opened in Charlottetown Saturday.

Charlottetown, P. E. I., Aug. 19.—(Special)—The sixtieth annual meeting of the Maritime Baptist convention opened here this morning. An address of welcome to the delegates was made by J. K. Ross on behalf of the Charlottetown Baptist church.
Rev. R. G. White, of Charlottetown, was elected president, J. J. Wallace, of Moncton, Dr. McKenna of Wolfville, vice-president; Rev. H. MacDonald, of Fredericton, secretary; A. W. Sterns of Charlottetown, treasurer.
The report of the Baptist Foreign Mission Board was read by Rev. J. W. Manning and showed that the prospects of gospel progress in India are brighter than ever before, but great difficulty is found in securing suitable missionaries.
About \$4,000 was raised for foreign missions through the agency of the twentieth century fund. Legions have been numerous in India, amounting to \$6,567; total receipts were \$25,712, and of this amount \$21,188 was expended in salaries and other expenses of the foreign missionary board. It is estimated that \$23,038 is needed to meet the expenses of the current year.
There were eight churches in the Maritime provinces, and the following were encouraging. There are eight churches in the foreign field with a membership of 25.
Obituary reports contained references to Rev. Howard Ross, Rev. H. S. Swain, Rev. T. L. Higgins, Rev. James C. Steadman, Rev. James L. Reid, Chas. E. Knapp and Bowley Howat.

MAY ARBITRATE
Believed That President Has Suggested This Means of Adjusting Disputed Peace Clauses.

PORTSMOUTH, N. H., Aug. 21.—It is rumored by the Associated Press that the future of President Roosevelt's proposal to M. Witte through Baron Rosen and transmitted by the former to Emperor Nicholas was based on the principle of arbitration.
It cannot be stated positively whether the proposal contemplates all the articles on which the plenipotentiaries failed to agree or not, but it is more than probable that it relates only to the indemnity and the cession of Sakhalin. It is impossible to say whether or not President Roosevelt has made a similar proposition to Japan. In such a case the regular diplomatic procedure would be to submit the proposition to both courts simultaneously, but an advantage might be gained by securing the adherence of one before submitting it to the other.
The Emperor Nicholas, Emperor of the Hague peace conference, the suggestion of arbitration, which necessarily will eventually be submitted to the public opinion throughout the world, will be particularly hard to reject. If the Emperor agrees, Japan, who has not done so already, would more than ever be bound to submit her claim to an impartial arbitrator for decision. Acceptance by both sides would involve a great extension of the principle of arbitration, as heretofore military have declined to submit questions in which their "dignity and honor" are involved.
