Halifax Debt Three Times Greater

As Halifax Debt Inree Times Greater As Halifax is a city of about the same population and about the same oppor-tunities it is interesting to compare the figures for the two cities and the com-parison shows that the net per capita debt in the sister city is just three times as great as in St. John. It is almost more interesting to note that St. John is credited with a population of 56,000, while Halifax is shown as including only 46,000 residents. It is difficult to discover on what basis

It is difficult to discover on what basis the net total debt of St. John is placed at \$1,322,184 as this does not agree with the amount of bonds outstanding and if the assets and liabilities are compared it will be found that the city has a credit balance of more than \$2,500,000. As it is probable that the figures for all the cities are compiled on the same basis it is likely that the comparison between them is fair and that St. John's relative position is as indicated.
