

The annual congregational meeting was held at 7.30 P.M., Rev. Dr. Williamson in the chair.

After devotional exercises by the Chairman, Mr. T. D. Minnes was appointed Secretary.

The Report of the Managers was then read, received and adopted.

Messrs. Jas. Minnes, C. Hamilton, Jro. McIntyre, and W. M. Robertson were elected Managers for the next three years.

Messrs. D. Fraser and Dr. Herald were elected Auditors.

The Report of Debt Fund was read by Mr. D. Fraser, and received and adopted, and Mr. Robertson was appointed joint Treasurer with Mr. Fraser.

The Organ Fund Report, submitted by Mr. W. G. Craig, was received and adopted, and the Organ Committee instructed to proceed at once to put in the Organ.

Mr. Jas. Pollie read the Sabbath School Report, which was received and adopted.

Mr. John Duff read the Session and Poor Fund Reports, which were received and adopted.

The Chairman read the Report of the Ladies Home Missionary Association, which was adopted.

Votes of thanks were given to the Superintendent and Teachers of the Sabbath School, to the Organist, and to the Ladi A Home Missionary Association.

Dr. Bell read the draft of the new Constitution, and the second Thursday in May was appointed for its consideration.

A vote of thanks was given to the Chairman, and the meeting closed with the Benediction.

KIRK-SESSION REPORT.

The Kirk-Session, in common with the whole congregation, regret that we are still without a Minister.

The Session mourn the removal by death of one of its members, the late John Creighton, of whom the resolution passed at a meeting of the congregation held shortly after his demise, fitly speaks.

We also regret the retirement from the Session of the Rev. Dr. Williamson, who by appointment of the Presbytery assumed the duties of interim Moderator when Dr. Smith's pastoral connection with the congregation terminated. The constant strain and anxiety of the office, which he filled with self-denying zeal and ability, pressed so heavily upon him as to cause him to resign. We cannot part with him without paying tribute to the wise counsel which he was ever ready and willing to give in our deliberations. The Presbytery on accepting Dr. Williamson's resignation appointed the Rev. T. S. Chambers interim Moderator.

The Session desire to express their thanks to those Ministers who have conducted the Sabbath services, and also the Clergymen connected with St. Andrew's, especially the Rev. Dr. Bain, for their kindly offices to the members of the congregation in seasons of sickness and times of bereavement.

They also tender hearty thanks to Miss Irving, as Organist, for her faithful and gratuitous services throughout the year.

The number of communicants on the roll is 315; there were added during the year 16, 8 by profession and 8 by certificate ; deaths and dismissions 16; number of deaths in the congregation 12; number of baptisms 14.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper has been dispensed quarterly during the year.

We pray that unity, harmony and good feeling may prevail in the consideration of the important matters that require to be dealt with in the ensuing year, especially in the choosing of our pastor We trust that the Great Head of the Church may so over-rule all our proceedings that we may obtain a Minister whose labours among us the Lord will abundantly bless.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, APRIL 8TH, 1885. It will be seen by the Financial Report now submitted that the Revenue from all sources, including subscription for Augmentation Fund, is \$240.23 less than it was last year. A falling off of about ten per cent, which the Managers regret.

The liabilities of 31st March, 1884, \$312.05, have been all paid and \$290.40 have been expended on repairs, and had the subscriptions not been reduced many other needed repairs would have have been made. Attention has again and again been called to the necessity of an improvement in the heating of the Church, and subscriptions for this purpose and repairs to property have been solicited. The repairs to Church and Manse property as stated in the last Annual Report were estimated to cost about \$600, and a previous Report estimated the cost of comfortably heating the Church at \$350, and in addition to these sums liabilities amounting to about \$500 have now to be provided for. The sum of \$52.08 which appears in the account herewith as "special collections for repairs" is the only response to your committee's request, and this sum has been collected on several special Sabbaths set apart for that purpose during the year.

Owing to the want of funds your committee did not feel justified in going to the expense of an entirely new heating apparatus, but as the present furnace has now become worn out and quite useless, it is absolutely necessary that this expense should be incurred.

We allude to these matters not by any way of complaint, but simply to point out the necessity of subscriptions being kept up to their former amounts, and we hope the congregation will consider these facts carefully. If contributors will do this, your Board has no doubt as to the result, and with the necessary funds, the comfort of the congregation in its Sabbath services will have prompt attention.

We would recommend that subscriptions for repairs be put on the plates in an envelope specially marked "Repairs," with the subscriber's name, in addition to the usual Revenue subscription, on any Sabbath throughout the year. Announcement of the amount contributed for this purpose will be made quarterly to the congregation.

The running expenses for the year, allowing \$1000 for pulpit supply, amount to \$2050.

The retiring Managers are Messrs. C. Hamilton, Wm. Fee, Wm. Shannon and Jas. Minnes, who are eligible for re-election. All which is respectfully submitted.

Although many of the teachers have severed their connection with our school, either on account of their health or their removal to other fields of usefulness, and many of the scholars have left us, some for other parts of the world, and others for that land where they enjoy a perpetual Sabbath and where parting is no more, still our average attendance is equal to that of last year, viz., 282; number of scholars on the roll 300; number in Infant class 60; number in Bible class 15; and our subscriptions to Missions have increased. We still continue to study the International Scheme of Lessons.

The names of the teachers, the loss of whose valuable services we all regret very much, are :--Mrs. G. M. Macdonnell, Mrs. Geo. Clerihew and Mrs. McClymont, Misses Gray, Dickson, Mitchell and A. Strange, and Mr. Calder. We trust that wherever these helpers may be placed in the future, their lives will be prosperous and happy and that the Lord will bless them in their work. We also hope that their places in our school will soon be filled by earnest volunteers.

The usual Entertainments took place. The Pic-Nic this year was held at Amherst Island, and was made particularly happy by the presence of our late Pastor and Superintendent, Dr. Smith. Many of the congregation accompanied the scholars. We are glad to record this growing interest in the children's outings.

The Christmas Festival was visited by Santa Claus, who claimed to be the only genuine, and the children were more than delighted with his story and presents.
