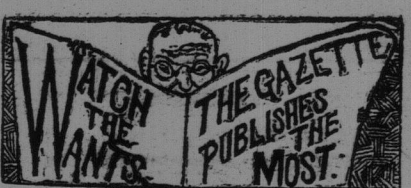

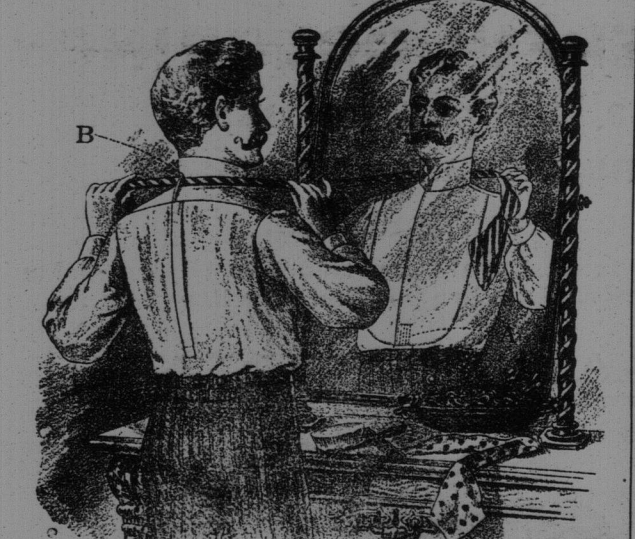

LOCAL LEGISLATURE.

MUCH TALK INVOLVED IN THE HOUSE YESTERDAY AFTERNOON.

A Question of Privilege Introduced this Morning by Hon. Mr. Blair. The other business this morning.

FRANCO, April 14.—After dinner the bill introducing Hon. Mr. Poppley, was further considered and agreed to with amendments and an amended title, as follows: "A bill relating to the Woodstock civil court."

MR. BURCHILL committed a bill in addition to and amendment of the law to regulate the railway companies, and to incorporate the Northwest Boon Co., Mr. Melanson in the chair.—Agreed to. The amendment of the Legislative Council to the bill passed for the abolition of that body, was considered and a motion passed that the amendment be read a second time.

The House adjourned until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.
