PORT CONFERENCES ARE PROCEEDING SATISFACTORILY

Ottawa, Ont., March 6.—
Conferences between Mayor Hayes, Commissioner Bullock, and R. W. Wigmore, M.P., representing the City of St. John, and Hon. F. B. Carvell, Hon. A. K. MacLean, and Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, of the Dominion Government, in regard to the Nationalization of St. John harbor, are proceeding satisfactorily, but the matter has not yet been closed. Opposition developed today from Hon. Dr. Ballantyne, who is not wholly convinced that the government should raise its original offer of \$1,125,000, and this, despite the fact that the report of his own departmental enquirer, Col. W. P. Anderson, said the property was well worth the price at which the city held it. In consequence of the protraction of the negotiations, Mayor Hayes and Commissioner Bullock did not leave for St. John this afternoon as expected. Instead, another conference has been arranged for tomorrow morning, and the matter is expected to be closed up then. The St. John visitors, accompanied by Mr. Wigmore, will leave for home on Friday afternoon, arriving in St. John on Saturday.



UNCIVIL SERVICE.

This is how the Civil Service Commission handles appointments in the Post Office Department here. Form erly the post master, the superintend ent of railway mail service, or the post office inspector, when in need of men or women to fill vacancies, were permitted to report to Ottawa on the qualifications of the applicants. They did not necessarily make recommendations, but mentioned how each person seeking the position was qualified, and leds the selection to Ottawa. To day they are prevented from doing anything of the sort. The heads of departments notify Ottawa that a vacancy exists and that is as far as they are allowed to go. Nor is the federal representative for St. John permitted to recommend any candidate for the position. BOOTLEGGER DOES SOME SHOOTING

Is Toronto Policeman With I a Blow to the Jaw and Fires Revolver Shot at Street Sweeper-Has New Scheme

Toronto, March 6.—In the arrest, in the heart of the city here today, of an alleged "bootlegger" from Montreal, one citizen was shot and a constable severely battered on the jaw. William Mend, a street sweeper, now lies in St. Michael's Hospital suffering from a wound in the arm, which caused much loss of blood, and Vasil Belonski, a Russian, is under arrest on three charges, a breach of the Ontario Temperance Act, carrying a revolver, and shooting with intent.

Belonski attracted the attention of P. C. Holmes at the Union Station, when he got off the train from the east, and he was escorting the man to the police station, when Belonski hit the constable a stunning blow, and made a break for liberty. The street sweeper tried to stop him with a shovel, and received a shot in the arm from Belonski's revolver.

When searched a specially made apparatus, something similar to a life was a found under Belonski's vest. here were two nickel containers, each of which the police estimate contained a gallon of liquor.
