IRISH NEWS AGENCY, Palace Chambers, Loudon, March 1 It may be stated at once frankly that Mr. G'adstone's sketch of the coming Reform Bill gave satisfaction to the Irish members. We understand, therefore, that the Irish members watched with a keen vigilance the Premier's allusion to their country; and their general impression is that his statements are emphatic and lucid enough to allow of no escape. He not only, as is known, pledged himself to stand by the Irish part of the bill, but even went so far as to declare that, in his opinion, no reduction should be made in the number of the Irish constituencies. This, of course, was only a

personal opinion; but, there is no doubt, it must exercise considerable influence on the question of redistribution when it the question of redstribution when it comes to be settled.

The future of the bill is absolutely uncertain. The Tories have intimated that they will exhaust every means of defeating the measure by obstruction, and any other weapon that comes to their hand.
