



## TOBACCO DUTIES

Sensational Story From New York May Cause An Investigation.

New York, Jan. 24.—Great interest has been aroused by the reports in the Tribune today to the effect that a country-wide investigation which the treasury department has started has disclosed discrepancies in the wrapper and filler statistics of tobacco imports from Cuba, which have deprived the Government of between \$3,000,000 and \$5,000,000 annually for the nest five years. \$3,000,000 and \$5,000,000 annual \$2.50 the past five years.

According to the Tribune, tobacco trade statistics show that makers who turn out pure Havana cigars must have six per cent of their stock in "wrapper," while the statistics of

must have six per cent of their stock in "wrapper," while the statistics of the treasury department show a fraction under one-fifth of one per cent of the importations classified as and paying duty as "wrapper."

Collector Loeb is quoted as saying: "We know that the tobacco trade has been getting the best of us, but we do not know to what extent, and the investigation has not proceeded far enough to determine that yet."

The probable result of the inquiry, he said, would be an amendment to the customs regulations, by which the customs house could arrive more exactly at the amount of each class of tobacco leaf imported from Cuba than was possible under the present regulations, and at this stage of the investigation neither criminal prosecutions nor civil suits were contemplated.

He declared that the commis-sion had forced him out of business, and had diverted trade from its nor-The board listened to the charges

The board listened to the charges, but no action was taken. In his opening remarks Mr. Robinson asked if the commission were responsible to the board of health, and Chairman Clarke answered that he did not think such was the case.

"This is in itself wrong," said Mr. Robinson. "The commission should be directly responsible to some higher body, in this case, of course, the board of health. I charge that this body of men have used their powers to discriminate against me, and divert the nullk trade from its natural channels."
