The sections are divisit into four quarters of 160 acres each. A settler is allowed to take as a free grant one of these quarters-this is called his homestead. The section corners are marked with a pyramid built up about two feet above the ground, set backs that I was completely disbartened. I was living on a rented farm that was partfrom the soil dug out of small pits adjoining. The number of the section is marked upon a post planted in the mound. It frequently happens that the posts in these mounds have been knocked or burnt out, so I advise the land-hunters to carry a

small compass. I spent a day or two in Mr. Marion's company, driving through the dis-trict. I was particularly struck with the prospect of getting a fair crop; unfortunately we had a very dry summer; any one familiar beauties of Oak Lake and the country joining. The lake was at the tim of my visit teeming with ducks and geese. I learn ed it was a favorite shooting groundsportsmen and others coming fromall of the Province to shoot water-fowl fall of the year. My guide informed me that it was not an uncom to average fifty ducks a day to each gun.




