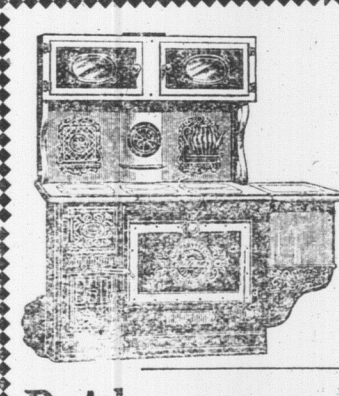

OBITUARY.

REV. HOWARD H. ROACHE. The death occurred at St. John on Wednesday evening last of Rev. H. H. Roach, pastor of the Main St. Baptist Church, and son of Mr. J. F. Roach, of Clarence, resulting from a complication of illnesses after an acute illness of only ten days.

He was a liberal-minded and well-versed man, generous almost to a fault, a hard worker, and an enthusiast in whatever line of work came under his attention. His self-sacrifice during the smallpox epidemic of three years ago, and the devotion which he displayed in carrying on his ministrations to the sick at that time, won for him the respect of all citizens.

Born at Clarence, Annapolis, thirty-seven years ago, he had a common school course, entered Horton Academy at Wolfville, and from there went, in 1892, to Acadia University, where he attended college he preached for a time at Annapolis, then at Wolfville. At the end of his first year in college his health failed, and he was compelled to leave for a time.

He remained with the Tabernacle Church till October, 1903, when he accepted a call to Main Street Baptist Church, which pulpit he has since filled. He is the second minister of the church to die in active service, the other being Rev. Dr. Corey, who had filled the pulpit only a few weeks.

He was a man of high character and high ability. He was a member of the Young People's Union. His relations with his people and his other congregations have always been most cordial, and there will be a general feeling of sincere sorrow at his death, when he was evidently entering upon a most successful career.

He leaves a wife and son, 13 years old, father, mother and brother, besides a large circle of relatives and friends to mourn his early death. His remains were brought home and laid in the Lawrenceston cemetery.

Before leaving Chicago, Rev. Austin K. deBlois, pastor of one of the churches in that city, conducted a service, taking as his topic, "In my Father's house are many mansions."

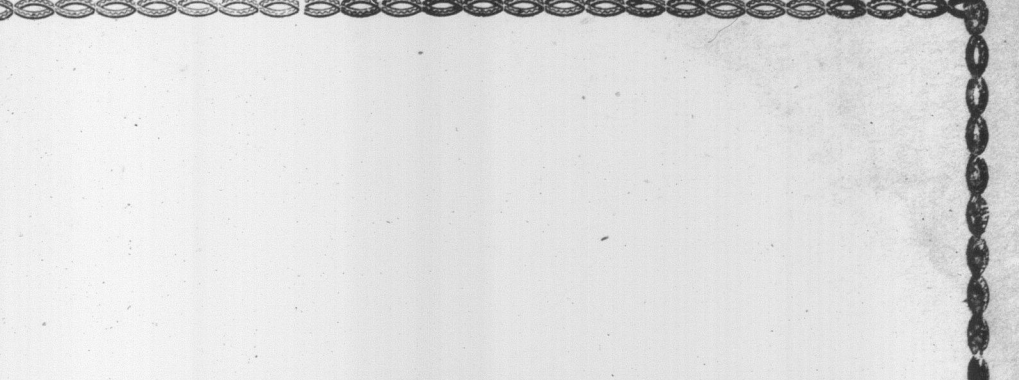
