JOHN COOK, a resident of the Mohawk Valley in the State of New York, m.——Carman, and had issue, three sons, George, Michael and John, all of whom served in Loyalist Corps in the revolutionary war, and afterwards came to Canada as U. Bastedo, U.E.L.

The Bastedo family derive descent from a Spaniard named De La Bastida,* who, having embraced the Reformed faith was forced to leave Spain and took refuge in Holland, whence, about 1628, he or his descendants emigrated to America and ultimately settled at Schenectady, New York. Of this branch of the family was Jacob Bastedo, as the name became anglicised, who, abandoning a valuable estate in Schenectady, came to Canada as a U. E.
