It is reported that the John Adams post card, which is meeting with so little favor, is to be withdrawn. This is a good thing. They rould be a disgrace to the postal system of any other country. The U. S. has always prided herself on having the homiest post cards in the world, with this Jolm Adams emission she has beaten everything else she has attempted in that line. With the cheap card-board for printing, and the most hideous design that ever happened, beside which an afghanis$\tan$ is adream of beauty, the U.S. has the 'never' to call it a 'Ladies CaRd'. The withdramal mill make thenn exceedingly rare, butfew were issued and still ferser are the post-offices that hare them on sale.

Collectors mill do well to treasure the first printing of the Omalan's. This printing is distinguished by the richness of color, and in some cases,
in connection with a slight blurrin: of the design. The later printings are clearer and the color is in every case lighter.

The smas stamp has met with prime favor in Hastings. Nearly all local collectors specialize sumermat in Canadian and are never averse, no matter how much it may worrs somes to placing new rarieties of the interesting country in their collections, The colors might blend better, but in all things it is cass to find fault.

The $1 / 4$ cent prop. has been found in a distinct red-brown and in the shade has easily secured the price of ten cents. The $3 / 8$ cent in lemon has been sold for sir cents. Rumors that all revenues are soon to be per. forated has caused bounds in prices for all ralues.
$1 / 3$ cent each is the price which is easily secured for fine copies of the 1 cent Onuaha the 4 cent is selling for face, the eight commands a price oi fire cents. Pretty good isn't it? This is for used copies of course.

Our club hasrecently issued some fine invitations for circulation not only among collectors in Toronto, but throughouit Ontario. I see no reason why we shoald not have corresponding members. The invitation contains alist of officers and sets forth the objects, and advantages of bringing together collectors of matual benifits and social enjoyment.

The new stamp was placed on sale in Toronto on Dec., 8th, and three days' sale amounted to $\$ 1700.00$.

I have seen a copy of the 58th catalogue supplement, and prices are extremely 10 w. The Canada Mapleleaf issue 6 and 10c values, ased, are priced at 6 and 8 c respectively. altogether underpriced if the current market price can be used as a standard. As there is a steady demand for these values 6 and 10 c used, dealers can readily get $\$ 5.00$ and $\$ 9.00$ per 100 . Very few collectors therefore can expect to purchase copies from their dealers at the usual $30 \%$ as only 500,000 of each of these values were issued they will likely sell for full cataldgue in every instance.

The second auction sale of the

Philatelic Club of Toronto, was brought to a successful issue on Tuestay eve. Dec. 6th in their Club Rooms Forum B'ld'gs. I noted an attendance of 17 active collectors. Over 45 lots consisting chiefly of the medium class of stamps were disposed of. Price ruled fair, and I believe all buyers have since had reason to congratulate themselves on their bargains.


Scott's supplement has disappointed many with prices on the maple leaf issue. But few will take cat. for their stamps of that issue.

A writer in the Virginia Phil., is worrying about the fact that the Omaha Exposition is going to be held in '99, feluing that the use of the Trans-Mrississippi stamp will be extended to include that year. There need be no fear of this however, as the department made its last printing some time ago. As planned, that issue will be absolute after Jan. 1st although still available for postal use.
