## Information for Canadians Travelling Abroad

Canadians travel outside Canada for business, pleasure and other reasons. Most enjoy a trouble-free trip but others encounter difficulties varying from loss of a passport to lengthy detention in a foreign jail.

This booklet is based on the idea that careful preparation will do much to ensure your trip will be trouble-free. The sections, for example, on safe handling of passports and other important documents; on avoiding the more common problems with foreign laws and regulations; on dual nationality; on where to turn for help in case of serious difficulty, contain information you will find valuable before and during your trip.

The Department of External Affairs provides assistance to Canadians abroad through its diplomatic and consular posts. As part of its Consular Awareness program, it annually revises this booklet and distributes it free of charge through its passport offices in Hull and Ottawa and across Canada\*, major Canadian airports, travel agencies, Canadian diplomatic and consular missions abroad, and in response to requests addressed to:

## **Passports and Other Documents**

Canadians need valid passports for travel to most countries. Never assume otherwise. Check with your travel agent or other competent source of information. Not even babies are exempt. They may be included in one of the parents' passport but it is recommended that they obtain their own.

Canadian citizens do not require passports or visas to visit the United States, Mexico and some Caribbean countries. However, those countries require proof of your Canadian citizenship and in some cases require tourist cards or other documents about which you should consult your travel agent, airline representative or the diplomatic or consular posts in Canada of the countries you might visit. Although you may not be required to produce a passport for a visit to a particular country, you are advised to obtain one anyway. Your Canadian passport remains the best internationally-accepted evidence of your Canadian citizenship, and should facilitate your contacts with the authorities and other citizens of the country you will visit.

If your passport is lost or stolen, report the loss immediately to the nearest police authorities and to the Canadian diplomatic or consular mission. Before a new passport can be issued you will have to produce documentary evidence of your Canadian citizenship, new photographs, and the full fee. If you must surrender your passport to a government official or at your hotel and do not receive it back in a reasonable time, inform the nearest Canadian diplomatic or consular mission.

Before you leave Canada make sure that your passport will be valid well beyond your return date, that you have signed it on page 3, and that the section of the passport for your address and a person to contact in case of accident is complete and up-to-date.

You should bot cate your bassport, travel ticket, identification documents, money, travellers, cheques, insurance and credit cards all together. If you do, you risk being left entirely without identification and funds in case of theft or loss.



Carry your passport securely in an inside pocket or in your handbag. Never leave it unattended, such as in luggage, on a tour bus, in a car or hotel room.

## Foreign Visas and Other Entry and Exit. Requirements

Every country has the right to set entry requirements, limit the duration of a visit and, if necessary, deny admission. Visas often cannot be obtained at a country's border. **To avoid possible detention or delays on arrival in a country you might visit**, consult first the diplomatic or consular mission of the country concerned, or your travel agent, about visas, entry and exit permits, health certificates and other possible requirements. Ask whether your country of destination requires that your passport be valid for a minimum period of time. Some do. Visa applications

require time for processing and mailing; they should be submitted to the appropriate foreign mission well in advance of your intended departure.

Several countries maintain **exit controls** and require special procedures or documentation before allowing you to leave. In such cases notify the nearest Canadian diplomatic or consular post (see page 20) upon arrival and departure, giving your full name, permanent Canadian address, passport number and date and place of issue, and details of your itinerary. If you encounter any difficulties in obtaining the necessary departure authorization, contact the Canadian post at once.

You may not be able to use your passport for travel to Arab States and some African countries if it contains any evidence of travel to Israel. However, it may be possible to arrange, on request, to have Israeli visas, entry and exit stamps placed on a separate piece of paper.

As it is also possible that certain African states may refuse you admittance if your passport contains evidence that you have travelled to the Republic of South Africa before your departure, verify your admissibility with the diplomatic mission of each African state concerned.

On arrival in a foreign country you should be prepared to show evidence that you have funds sufficient to support yourself during your intended stay and to prove (for example, by being in possession of a visa) that you will likely be admitted to the country next on your itinerary (See also the Section on Money and Currency, page 12). Many countries will only grant entry if you are in possession of return or onward tickets.

A comprehensive source of information on entry requirements is the monthly publication, *Travel Information Manual (TIM)*, published jointly by several IATA airlines. TIM may be consulted at the ticket offices of certain airlines, travel agencies, and in major public libraries.

Canadians who have reason to doubt they can meet the entry requirements of any country they intend to visit should request advice, in writing, from the diplomatic or consular mission of that country in Canada. Addresses of foreign missions are given in the booklet *Diplomatic Corps and Consular and Other Representatives in Canada* available against payment from Canadian Government Publishing Centre, Supply and Services Canada, Ottawa, Ont., Canada, (KIA OS9). Copies of the booklet are available for reference at Passport Offices in Canada and at most main public libraries.

Hoping to **work in another country?** Most have restrictions or controls. Ask the foreign mission concerned before you leave Canada.

## **Vaccinations and Medical Advice**

Consult your doctor, your Municipal or Provincial Department of Health or an office of Health and Welfare Canada about vaccinations required or recommended for each of the countries you intend to visit. In many cases, the requirements will vary according to your planned itinerary. If you are travelling from an area of the world where yellow fever is endemic, you may be asked for proof of yellow fever inoculation before being admitted to the next country. Health 'regulations can change with little notice, depending on local circumstances or the occurrence of epidemics. You should re-confirm vaccination requirements just prior to departure and, if your trip is lengthy, during your travels.

Canada no longer requires the presentation of Interna-, tional Certificates of Vaccination upon your return.

Persons who require specialized medical treatment, including prescriptions for glasses or contact lenses, should carry a physician's report stating the ailment, the current treatment and the brand and generic names of essential medication. This will greatly facilitate obtaining urgent medical assistance if the medication is misplaced or the luggage containing it is delayed. Similarly, any allergies should be formally documented by a physician's report, as should the medical reasons preventing anyone from receiv-

ing any required vaccination (see also Health Care Abroad on Page 12).

# Travel in Areas of Political or Civil Unrest, or in Remote Areas

Canadians planning to travel in areas where their personal safety might be at risk are encouraged to contact the Department of External Affairs for information on the latest developments and on the risks involved. To do so, either:

- a) write or call the Department in Ottawa (telephone (613) 992-3705);
- b) call the nearest passport office (see inside front cover); or
- c) if outside Canada, contact a Canadian mission (see page 20).

Before travelling in remote areas or proceeding on mountain climbing expeditions, Canadians should consult the Canadian mission in or accredited to the country concerned and obtain special insurance to cover medical evacuation. Furthermore, they are urged to leave detailed itineraries with responsible persons before departure to facilitate the task of search and rescue parties in case of mishap.

## **Registering at Canadian Posts Abroad**

If you reside in or are visiting a country for an extended period, you should register with the appropriate Canadian diplomatic or consular post (see page 20 onward). You can do so by visiting or writing the post.

If you expect your visit to be short, you are encouraged to sign the visitor's book in the public reception area at the diplomatic or consular mission giving your local address or itinerary. This will make it easier for the Post to assist if they are asked by friends or family residing elsewhere to pass an urgent message to you.



Consular registration is particularly important in areas where political conditions are tense or unsettled, or where natural disasters may occur. Your registration card will help the post locate and contact you in an emergency. Having registered, you should also be prompt to give notice of departure or change of address.

## Warning ...

Canada does not have diplomatic or consular relations with, and therefore cannot provide normal consular services or assistance to Canadians travelling in: Albania, Cambodia (Kampuchea), North Korea, Taiwan, Namibia, and the so-called independent homelands in the Republic of South Africa.

## **Dual Nationality**

Through birth, derivation from parents, marriage or naturalization you may be regarded by another country to be one of its citizens even though, under Canadian law, you are a Canadian citizen. During a visit to the other country

you might find yourself in violation of local laws relating, for example, to compulsory military service, taxation or illegal emigration.

It is your responsibility to determine if you, your spouse, or other family member is also a citizen of another country and, if so, whether there will be complications during a visit there. Citizenship laws are complicated.



In a situation of "dual nationality" the ability of Canadian authorities to assist you may be severely curtailed because the foreign state has, within its boundaries, full jurisdiction over persons it considers its citizens.

Before leaving for a country whose citizenship you may possess or may have possessed, verify your status with the diplomatic or consular Mission of that country in Canada and enquire whether there are any outstanding obligations to which you will be subject on arrival.

## **Foreign Laws and Regulations**

Canadian travellers must bear in mind that they are subject to the laws, both criminal and civil, of the country they are in.

Many countries have substantially different local customs, legal systems and judicial processes. You should not expect that because you are a foreigner you will be exempt from local laws or enjoy preferential treatment. (N.B. Some countries do not afford equal treatment to women.) Your behaviour, dress and general appearance, an open expression of your political opinions or religious beliefs, the active or even symbolic participation in local political, liberation, or revolutionary movements, even the taking of pictures may be considered crimes under local laws and regulations. In certain countries, the penalties for disregarding local and religious customs are severe; corporal punishment has been administered to persons who violated the Islamic prohibition on the use of alcohol.

The criminal law of some countries provides for guilt by association under which someone may be charged simply for being in the company of a person suspected or found guilty of a crime (e.g. trafficking or possessing drugs, smuggling antiques, using counterfeit money).

A Canadian involved in a civil action abroad (for example in a dispute over a debt, contract or lease) may, in some countries, be put in jail or denied permission to leave (or alternatively, his/her possessions may be detained) until the matter is settled. Canadians conducting business where local practices are substantially different from those in Canada should be alert to the legal considerations.

If you are uncertain, it is preferable to seek clarification through local authorities before taking any action you feel may violate a local law or offend custom. In many countries, if you stand accused of violating a local law you will be presumed guilty until you prove your innocence. Imprisonment while awaiting trial is customary in many countries and pre-trial detention may last several months. Although the Canadian Government would protest against the imposition of cruel and unusual treatment or punishment, there could be no assurance in some countries that such representations would be effective, particularly if you receive treatment similar to that received by nationals of the country concerned.

You can enrich your trip and make it safer by taking time, before leaving Canada, to familiarize yourself with the customs, laws and general characteristics of the countries you will visit. Write to their diplomatic or consular Mission in Canada, consult travel agencies and your local library.

## **Illegal Drugs and Narcotics**

Very severe penalties are being imposed in most countries on persons convicted of possessing, smuggling or trafficking in drugs. As part of a major international effort to curtail the use and transportation of drugs, heavy fines and/or long prison sentences are now the rule, notwithstanding the facts that in many countries drugs are readily available, inexpensive and openly used. In late 1984 over 100 Canadians of all ages were being held in foreign jails for drug-related offences, either awaiting trial or serving lengthy sentences including life imprisonment. In some countries possession of even small amounts carries the death penalty.

Exercise extreme caution if asked to transport any parcel, however small, across a border. Remember that narcotic drug traffickers try to use respectable, innocentlooking tourists to carry drugs for them through customs inspection lines. Persons who innocently commit such offences can be held in jail, often in extremely distressing conditions, for long periods while awaiting trial. Because drug offences are particularly repugnant to some countries the suspected drug offender, regardless of nationality, may be last to be brought to trial! In Canada, the minimum penalty for importing narcotics is a seven-year prison sentence. If you are hitch-hiking or take a hitch-hiker on board you should, for your own protection, **separate and cross borders individually.** Though **you** may not be carrying any contraband or illegal drugs it is dangerous to assume your companion is also innocent. If anything illegal is discovered by border officials, all occupants of a vehicle will likely be considered as suspects; establishing your innocence may not be possible.

## **Consular Assistance for Travelling Canadians**



Travellers often run into obstacles or problems when abroad, and usually they can work out adequate solutions by themselves, or with the help of travel agencies, banks, or local government services. But if you find yourself in serious difficulty or distress, perhaps due to sickness, accident, arrest, or loss of funds, don't hesitate to seek assistance from the nearest Canadian mission. However **Canadian officials cannot provide you with legal advice or Interfere In the course of local justice.** In no circumstances is a Canadian mission authorized to post bail or pay fines;

it may, however, help in the transfer of funds from Canada for these purposes.

Canadian diplomatic or consular missions cannot provide you with services ordinarily performed by travel agencies, banks or hotels. They cannot make hotel reservations or travel arrangements, cash cheques or provide loans. Nor can they assist in finding employment, or in obtaining residence or work permits, or driving licenses.

If you are charged with an offence Canadian diplomatic or consular officials cannot set aside local law on your behalf. In general they can intervene only in situations where discrimination or a denial of justice is evident. It is, however, important that as soon as possible after the arrest you request the police or prison officials to contact the nearest Canadian Consul. Contact with the Consul is a right under international law. While unable to interfere with local justice the Consul can inform relatives or friends, provide names of local lawyers, assist in obtaining funds from family or friends, send back reports of the prisoner's condition, and attempt where possible to improve the conditions of detention.

In an EMERGENCY, be it a natural disaster, civil disturbance, hostilities involving the country in which you are, or case of urgent need, quickly get in touch with the nearest Canadian mission. If there is no resident Canadian mission, you may receive help from the mission of a friendiy country, e.g. Australian, British... You will be assisted in whatever way possible in the circumstances.

## **Other Information**

Money and Currency —Before leaving Canada, consult a bank or foreign currency exchange company about the most appropriate form in which to carry your funds. In some countries, including parts of the United States, traveller cheques in Canadian dollars and even Canadian currency may not be accepted by hotels, stores, or banks. Similarly, some credit cards, money orders and bank drafts may not be honoured. Banks and companies specializing in foreign exchange transactions can give you advice and services.

You may wish to obtain a small amount of different currencies you will need on arrival in each country. **Some countries require a currency declaration upon arrival**. You may be asked to prove when leaving that you are not taking out of the country more money than you imported. Most countries insist that currency exchange be carried out at officially designated banks or change offices and at approved and set rates of exchange. The authorities may consider any other type of currency exchange (such as between private persons) to be black-marketeering, an offence often punishable by confiscations, severe fines and lengthy jail sentences. Check with the foreign missions in Canada or with your travel agent about currency regulations in countries you intend to visit.

Keep a separate record of your travellers cheques or credit cards. In the event of loss or theft, they can then be promptly cancelled and replaced.

Health Care Abroad — The cost of medical treatment and hospitalization outside Canada is often prohibitively expensive. While no traveller wants to think of an accident or illness marring a trip, such things happen and it may prove a major shock to discover, for instance, that hospital and doctor's bills of many thousands of dollars must be paid in cash before securing release from a foreign medical institution. Check your present governmental, employer or personal medical insurance coverage and enquire about "Outside of Canada" medical insurance available from a number of Canadian Insurance companies. While travelling, carry your provincial insurance plan identification card and proof of supplementary travel medical insurance taken privately.



Health and Welfare Canada produces for travellers, "Staying Healthy in Warm Climates," "Immunization — A Guide for International Travellers," and "Malaria Risk Countries - Quick Reference." Write for copies to the Medical Services Branch, Health and Welfare Canada, Ottawa, K1A 0L3.

**Travel Insurance** — There are a number of companies in Canada offering individual and group travel insurance. Typical plans may cover part or all of hospital, medical and repatriation expenses, lost or damaged baggage or other valuables, and trip cancellation claims. Experienced travejlers consider such insurance to be an invaluable investment.

Mail — "Poste Restante" or "General Delivery" services exist at large post offices in most countries. You should use these for your personal mail. Canadian posts abroad may hold letters to be picked up but cannot provide mailforwarding service. Letters not claimed —within a reasonable period are returned, collect, to the sender. Lost Articles —If you lose valuable personal articles while travelling, promptly report the loss to the local police and inform the Canadian mission concerned. Canadian missions cannot search for lost items but if they are found and turned in to the post; you will be informed so that arrangements can be made for their return.

**Motoring** —If you might drive a vehicle abroad, contact an automobile association or motor league before leaving Canada. Ask about requirements (e.g. International Driving Permit, Carnet de Passage, Insurance) and for information about roads, routes and other conditions. In many parts of the world you need a Carnet de Passage before you are permitted to take a vehicle into the country. The "Carnet" is a temporary circulation permit issued by the country in which the vehicle is registered and accepted by the country of travel. A vehicle cannot ordinarily be disposed of outside its country of registration unless full import duties are paid. If renting a vehicle deal only with a reputable firm and enquire about its emergency services.

You will need a valid driver's licence and may also need to provide proof of comprehensive vehicle insurance. Canadian vehicle insurance may not be valid in certain countries. In these countries, motorists should purchase special comprehensive insurance policies covering accident claims, legal fees, bail, and medical evacuation. Several States in the United States have No-Fault Insurance legislation; you should, therefore, ensure you have ample collision insurance. The Canadian Automobile Association maintains a list of States where no-fault insurance provisions apply, as does the Insurance Bureau of Canada at its Headquarters, .181 University Avenue, Toronto, M5H 3M7, and at its regional offices elsewhere in Canada.

In some countries, if you are involved in a traffic accident you will be prevented from leaving the country, and may even be held in prison, until the civil and criminal aspects of the case are settled in court.

Students and Young Travellers -You can save substantially on transportation, accommodation and other costs if you have a valid International Student Identity Card (ISIC) or a Federation of International Youth Travel Organizations (FIYTO) Card. The International Students cards are available to university, college and high school students through student unions and from the Canadian Federation of Students-Services (CFS, Services)/Association of Students Council Headquarters: 44 St. George Street, Toronto, M5S 2E4 or from any office of Travel CUTS, the travel company of the Canadian Federation of Students. The CUTS offices are located in: Halifax, Montreal, Ottawa, Saskatoon, Edmonton, Vancouver and Victoria; in Quebec, information and travel services can be obtained from the Fédération québécoise de l'AJISME, 803 Mont-Royal est, Montréal, H2J 1W9. FIYTO cards are available to non-students and working youths up to the age of 26 from the Canadian Hostelling Association at 18 Byward Market, Ottawa, K1N 7A1 and its 13 regional offices across Canada; the CHA also has International Youth Hostel Cards for use in some 60 countries, and a complete two-volume listing of youth hostels worldwide. These organizations have much information and numerous publications of benefit to young travellers.

Some countries require, in addition to the above cards, further proof of student status. You should obtain and carry a letter from your school, college or student union confirming your current and continuing student status.

## **Customs Hints and Other Import Controls**

**BEFORE YOU GO** —Ask Customs to identify all your valuable articles, such as cameras, binoculars, etc... on a wallet-sized card (form Y-38) with their serial numbers. You can do so at your local Customs Office or at Customs at your point of departure; this establishes that you owned the articles before departure and can, therefore, re-import them duty and tax-free.

However, items such as jewellery, which are not 'uniquely identifiable' will not be documented. Because of its value and the difficulty in identifying it, we suggest that you travel with the fewest possible pieces. To facilitate re-entry of the items, we recommend that you obtain an appraisal report from a qualified gemmologist, jeweller or insurance agent, with a photograph signed, dated and accompanied by certification that the jewellery in the paragraph is the same jewellery identified in the appraisal report. When travelling, carry with you the appraisal report, certified photo and a copy of the bill of sale or, if the goods were previously imported, a copy of your Customs receipt.

**RESTRICTIONS.**—You may not bring in firearms that can easily be concealed, such as pistols and revolvers, without a permit from your local police authorities in Canada. Automatic weapons are prohibited entry. With certain exceptions, you may not import a **used or secondhand vehicle** of other than the current year model. Ask your local Customs Office for details.

WHEN YOU RETURN TO CANADA. —You must declare everything you have acquired abroad, whether as purchases or gifts, including goods still in your possession that you bought at a Canadian or foreign duty-free store. They should be easily accessible for inspection and it's wise to have with you receipts for goods purchased (to verify values), for accommodation while you were away (as evidence of the length of your stay) and for repairs done (or parts added) to articles you had in your possession when you left Canada, including your motor vehicle, outboard motor, camera, etc. Such repairs and parts may be subject to duty and taxes. If repairs or replacement parts for your motor vehicle, yacht or aircraft were essential to your safe return to Canada, a remission of duty and taxes may be granted, upon declaration of the repairs at Customs.

For more detail and a list of Regional Customs Offices, see the brochure *I Declare*, available from travel agencies, border points, airports, passport offices, Canadian posts abroad or from Public Relations Branch, Revenue Canada, Customs and Excise, Connaught Building, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A 0L5.

Canada is helping to preserve rare and endangeredplants and animals through the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES). Regulations now prohibit the import or export of over 1000 species, as well as their parts and products, without Convention permits. The following species and any articles made from them are just a few of those which require permits: elephants (ivory), monkeys, all cats except domestic cats, otters, alligators, crocodiles, orchids, American cacti, falcons, the larger sea turtles. Agriculture Canada controls or prohibits the entry into Canada of animals, birds, insects, plants and soil and their products or parts (such as seeds, roots, meat, milk and food made from these sources) to prevent viruses and other causes of disease from being introduced into Canada, potentially causing great damage to the economy by infecting and killing animals and plants. Many such items require permits or health certificates, with very specific requirements, which you must obtain in Canada prior to your trip. Don't assume otherwise. In particular, all birds and all animals (except dogs and cats) require an import permit from the Food Production and Inspection Branch for entry into Canada. General information on bringing such items to Canada is found in Agriculture Canada's "Don't Bring it Back" pamphlet, available at airports. For more details, contact the Animal Health Division, or Plant Quarantine Division of Agriculture Canada, Ottawa, Ontario.

**Motor vehicles** —If you buy a vehicle abroad intending to import it to Canada make sure that it conforms to Canadian safety and environmental protection standards. A vehicle that has been used abroad (other than in the continental United States) must be thoroughly cleaned to remove all soil before shipment to Canada. For further information on vehicle standards, contact the Department of Transport, Road and Motor Vehicle Traffic Safety Branch, Transport Canada, Place de Ville, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A 0N5.

**Explosives, Ammunition, Fireworks** —Blasting explosives and detonators, propellant explosives and ammunition, and all types of fireworks and pyrotechnic devices, save for a few exemptions, may not be imported into Canada without a permit. Check with your local Customs Office for exemptions. All other inquiries and requests for importation permits should be directed to: Chief Inspector of Explosives, Energy, Mines and Resources Canada, Sir William Logan Building, 580 Booth Street, Ottawa Ontario, K1A OE4.

**AFTER RESIDENCE ABROAD** ... Before returning to Canada after a stay abroad of more than one year, Canadians should learn from Canadian Customs officials about special provisions applying to the importation of household items and personal belongings. More information is contained in the brochure *Moving Back to Canada?*, available from Canadian posts abroad or from Public Relations Branch, Revenue Canada, at the above address.

## CANADIAN EMBASSIES, HIGH COMMISSIONS AND CONSULATES

Canada's missions abroad are responsible for protecting and promoting Canadian interests. Many are specially staffed to deal with trade or immigration matters and some have specialized personnel from other departments and agencies. If, during your trip, you will require specialized assistance from the federal government, consult the department or agency concerned well in advance of your departure.

The Department of External Affairs offers a broad range of programs and services to assist Canadian business and industry. For information contact the Department in in Ottawa at (613)593-7064.

#### NOTES:

1. The following addresses and telephone numbers are effective as of January 1985 and are subject to change. Telephone area codes are in parentheses ().

2. The entry "NEPAL See India." and similar entries mean that there is no resident Canadian representative in the first country named (Nepal) and that for assistance or other consular services you should normally address yourself to the Canadian mission resident in the second country (India). However, where an Honorary Consul for Canada has been appointed locally you may contact that person if necessary. 

## INFORMATION FOR CANADIANS TRAVELLING ABROAD

Nothing can ruin a trip abroad more completely than running into unexpected problems, especially those that could have been easily avoided. This booklet shows you that there are many things you can do to help ensure trouble-free travel. It can help you both before your departure and during your stay abroad. Read it before you leave Canada, complete the checklist on the centrefold and then keep it for reference while you are away.

## **TRAVEL DOCUMENTS**

#### Passport

You may be asked in any country to provide proof of citizenship or to show tourist cards or other documents. Your passport remains the best internationally-accepted evidence of your Canadian citizenship.

You and your family need valid passports for travel to most countries. Never assume otherwise. Children may have their own passports, or, under the age of 16, they may be included in one of the parents' passports. Children travelling alone must have their own passports. Keep in mind that some countries require that a child carry his or her own passport whether travelling with a parent or not. If there has been a separation or divorce, only the parent having been granted custody of the children may apply for a passport or include them in his or her own passport.

To obtain a Canadian passport, you must be a Canadian citizen and complete the passport application form that may be obtained at passport offices, post offices and travel agencies. The passport application contains information on how to obtain a passport. Contact the passport office or your travel agent about the fee.

Before you leave Canada, make sure that your passport will be valid well beyond your return date, that you have signed it on page 3 and that the section for your address and person to contact in case of emergency is completed and up-to-date.

Sometimes you will have to surrender your passport to a foreign government official or hotel employee. If you don't get it back in a reasonable time, inform the nearest Canadian mission.

Never carry your passport, travel ticket, identification documents, money, traveller's cheques, insurance and credit cards together. You risk being left entirely without identification and funds in case of theft or loss.



Your passport is a valuable document. Guard it carefully. Carry it securely in an inside pocket or a handbag. Don't keep it in your luggage, and don't leave it in cars, buses or hotel rooms when you are not around.

If your passport is lost or stolen, report the loss immediately to the local police and to the nearest Canadian mission. Before a new passport can be issued, you must complete an application form, produce documentary evidence of your Canadian citizenship (e.g., birth or citizenship certificate), present new photographs and pay the full fee. A photocopy of the identification page of your passport will also be helpful.

#### Visas

Every country has the right to set entry requirements, limit the duration of a visit and, if it sees fit, deny admission to foreigners. Visas can be difficult and even impossible to get at some borders. Canadian missions cannot help you obtain a visa and cannot tell you which countries require one.

To avoid possible delays at the border, find out about visas and entry and exit permits from the missions in Canada of the countries which you plan to visit or from your travel agent. Ask whether your countries of destination require that your passport be valid for a minimum period. Visa applications require time to process and mail, so submit your request to the appropriate foreign mission well before you intend to leave. Some foreign missions impose extra delay if a visa is applied for outside of your country of residence.

Certain Arab and African states may refuse to admit you if your passport shows that you have travelled to Israel or to the Republic of South Africa. It may be possible to request that Israeli visas and entry and exit stamps be placed on a separate sheet.

On arrival in a foreign country, be prepared to prove that you have sufficient funds to support yourself during your intended stay and that you will be admitted to the next country on your itinerary. (For example, have a visa on hand for that country.) Many countries will grant entry only if you are in possession of return or onward tickets.

Several countries impose exit controls. You must thus complete formalities or produce certain documents before you are authorized to leave their territory. In some countries, you must register with local authorities if you are not staying at a recognized hotel. Otherwise, your departure may be delayed or you may be fined when you leave. If you have difficulty obtaining an exit permit, inform the nearest Canadian mission immediately.

#### **Dual Nationality**

Through birth, derivation from parents, marriage or naturalization you may be regarded by another country to be one of its citizens even though, under Canadian law, you are a Canadian citizen. During a visit to the other country, you might be subject to certain local laws that apply to you because you are considered a citizen of that country. For example, you might be compelled to do military service, or pay special taxes. You may not even be allowed to leave.

It's up to you to determine if you, your spouse, or any other family member is also a citizen of another country and, if so, whether there could be difficulties during your stay.

If you are a dual national, Canadian authorities may not be able to help you in your country of other citizenship. Every country can decide who are its citizens and can enforce its laws within its boundaries. So before leaving for a country whose citizenship you may possess or may have possessed, verify your status with the diplomatic or consular mission of that country in Canada. Ask if there are any outstanding obligations you may be subject to upon arrival.

## PRECAUTIONS


#### Medical Advice

Ask your doctor or community health centre about required or recommended vaccinations for each of the countries you intend to visit. Health regulations can change with little notice. You should reconfirm vaccination requirements just before departure and, if your trip is lengthy, during your travels.

Any allergies should be documented by a physician's report, as should the medical reasons preventing anyone from receiving any required vaccination.

Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) has been reported in almost all countries. It is advisable to avoid behaviour that puts you at risk. Some countries have introduced AIDS testing for foreigners. The foreign mission concerned can provide information regarding conditions of entry.

Malaria is endemic in some tropical regions. This disease is transmitted by insect bites and can have fatal or lifelong consequences. Find out how you can protect yourself from this disease.

You no longer need to have the International Certificate of Vaccination for your return to Canada. However, some countries may require it as proof of immunization before allowing you to enter.

If you require medical treatment, be sure to bring all of the medication you need for your entire stay abroad. Bring your prescription and carry your prescription drugs only in the original dispensary container. Some drugs available over the counter in Canada may require a prescription in other countries. Check with your pharmacist.

If you intend to stay abroad for a longer period, bring your prescriptions and make sure before you leave that the medication you need is available in the countries in which you plan to stay.

#### Insurance

An unexpected accident or illness while travelling, having to return to Canada early because of a serious problem at home or the disappearance of your luggage could all translate into a ruined vacation. More importantly, it could cost you hundreds or thousands of dollars.

Many of these problems can be countered through the acquisition of good insurance coverage. There are three principal categories of insurance you may wish to consider.

Cancellation insurance protects you financially if you must cancel your trip or change your flight plans due to serious reasons such as the death or illness of a family member at home or in the case of civil or natural disturbances in the country you intend to visit.

Personal effects insurance covers the possessions that you carry with you when travelling and could protect investments such as an expensive camera.

Last, but perhaps most important, is health insurance. It is a common belief that medical misfortune may strike others, but never ourselves. If it does, you may be shocked to discover that medical bills of thousands of dollars may have to be paid before a hospital will release you or that proof of your ability to pay may be required even to be admitted.

You may also discover that the country you are visiting does not have the same level of medical expertise or facilities as we have come to expect in Canada and that a medical evacuation to another location is necessary.

Provincial health insurance plans have been unable to keep up with the rising cost of health care abroad and often cover only a fraction of the medical and hospital expenses you may incur.

It is advisable that you check with your insurance company to clarify what they will cover and, as necessary, supplement this plan through one of the many policies available to travellers. For more information on insurance coverage, call the Canadian Life and Health Insurance Association at 1-800-268-8099 (in Toronto: 777-2344).

Finally, don't leave home without the documents showing that you are covered by a provincial or private plan.



#### Foreign Laws and Regulations

Nearly 500 Canadians are currently imprisoned abroad. Do not expect that because you are a foreigner you will be exempt from local laws or enjoy preferential treatment. You are subject to the laws, both criminal and civil, of the countries you are in. You should also respect their customs and practices.

The legal system and judicial procedures abroad may be very different from our own. You may be detained for months before being charged. It could take months and even years before you are tried. In many countries, once you are accused of violating a law you will be presumed guilty until you prove your innocence. In several countries, releasing foreigners on bail is out of the question.

It should also be stressed that conditions of detention are often difficult, sometimes deplorable, especially in developing countries. Canadian missions can only ensure that Canadians detained are not discriminated against because of their citizenship. They cannot get you out of jail!

When you travel abroad, you may not enjoy the rights and freedoms that you consider universal. Some countries do not recognize or respect religious freedom, freedom of association, speech or the press, or the equality of men and women. In some countries, you must observe dress codes and local rules of etiquette. It is not advisable for foreigners to criticize or protest these situations.

The criminal law of some countries presumes guilt by association. This means you may be charged simply for being in the company of a person suspected or found guilty of a crime.

If you become involved in a civil action abroad, you may be jailed or denied permission to leave until the matter is settled. Check with local authorities before doing anything having legal implications. This is particularly relevant to Canadians doing business in other countries.

You can avoid trouble. Take time before you go abroad to get to know some of the laws and traditions of the countries you will visit. Write to one of their missions in Canada, or consult your travel agent or neighbourhood library.

#### **Illegal Drugs**

Drug use and trafficking are prohibited in all countries, even though drugs are readily available and openly used in some places. Most countries impose heavy fines and long prison sentences for possession or trafficking in drugs.

In some countries, possession of even small amounts of drugs carries the death penalty.

Refuse if asked by a stranger to transport any parcel across a border. Remember that drug traffickers try to use respectable, innocent-looking tourists to carry drugs for them through customs inspection lines. No reward that a trafficker promises you is worth the risk of spending long years in a damp cell.

Never cross a border with a hitch-hiker or as a hitchhiker. Separate and meet on the other side of the border. Though you may not be carrying anything illegal, the same may not be true of your companions. If anything illegal is found by border officials, all occupants of a vehicle will be considered suspects. Be cautious: in some Islamic countries, alcohol is seen as a narcotic. Penalties for trafficking or possession are very severe.

It is not unusual to run into difficulties while travelling abroad. Most will be minor, and you will usually be able to sort these out on your own, or with the help of travel agents, banks and local government services.

The best way to avoid problems, big and small, when you are travelling is to prepare properly before you leave. Get as much information and advice as you can about the countries you plan to visit. First-hand experience in a country is not always the best way to learn about it. You may be unpleasantly surprised, for example, to find out that you have unknowingly broken a foreign law. Knowing a few words in the language of the country that you are visiting is always useful.

While abroad, learn to handle basic day-to-day business, such as banking and travel arrangements. You might be a little baffled at first, but soon you'll be proud to know the in's and out's of the foreign systems. Some of these day-to-day dealings often add to the enjoyment of your trip!

Of course, if you have serious problems, such as sickness, accident or the loss of funds or your passport, our missions abroad will give you whatever assistance they can.



## CONSULAR ASSISTANCE

#### Limitations

Whether they be embassies, high commissions or consulates, Canadian missions abroad are ready to help you in case of emergency. However, there are limits to what Canadian missions abroad can do for you and there may be a fee for some services.

The mission *CAN* contact relatives or friends and ask them to send you emergency funds

The mission *CAN* notify next of kin regarding accidents or deaths and let them know whether and how they can help

- \* The mission CAN help you during emergencies, such as natural disasters and civil uprisings
- \* The mission CAN direct you to the sources of information about local laws and regulations
- \* The mission CAN inform relatives and friends of your arrest and try to ensure that legal rights and processes are extended to you consistent with the standards of the foreign country
- \* The mission *CAN* try to ensure equitable treatment under local laws
- \* The mission CAN provide lists of doctors and lawyers who have assisted Canadians in the past

#### BUT

- \* The mission CANNOT set aside local laws if you are charged with an offence, or intervene in the judicial process of a foreign country
- \* The mission CANNOT provide legal advice, post bail, or pay your personal bills or fines
- The mission CANNOT extend services normally provided by travel agencies or financial institutions, such as cashing cheques or making travel arrangements
- The mission CANNOT hold parcels or personal items for safe-keeping
- \* The mission CANNOT provide translation services
- \* The mission *CANNOT* help you find a job or obtain visas, licences or related permits
- \* The mission *CANNOT* help you get a driver's licence, visas to other countries or residence permits
- \* The mission CANNOT search for lost items

Canada does not have diplomatic or consular relations with certain countries, and therefore cannot provide normal consular services to Canadians travelling there. Those countries are Afghanistan, Cambodia, North Korea, Taiwan and the so-called independent homelands in the Republic of South Africa.

## Registration

If you are living in a foreign country, especially a developing country, or visiting it for a long time, we urge you to register at the Canadian mission there. You can register either by writing or visiting the mission.

Consular registration is particularly important in highrisk areas. Your registration card helps the mission locate you in any emergency. Remember to give the mission prompt notice of a change of address, or of your departure from the foreign country. The information given is strictly confidential.

For current news and possible risks about travel in dangerous and remote areas, please contact External Affairs and International Trade Canada before you leave.

You may also listen to Radio Canada International (RCI) when you are abroad. RCI provides you with the latest news and broadcast messages from the Canadian government during emergency situations. A program schedule is included at the end of this guide.

## **Emergency Consular Services**

Canadian missions abroad have an official on duty 24 hours a day to provide emergency consular assistance. After business hours, callers are usually asked by a recorded message to leave their name and phone number where they can be contacted, or are referred to a second number. The duty officer will call back upon receipt of the message. Such a system depends on the local communications system functioning effectively and on the caller leaving a clear message and being available to accept a return call. Duty officers worldwide are remarkably successful at providing emergency assistance to Canadians in all types of difficulty.

## **OTHER INFORMATION**

#### **Motoring Abroad**

Operating a vehicle abroad, whether you take it from Canada or rent it locally, often entails procedures and requirements quite different from those in Canada. International Driver's permits, carnet de passage and additional vehicle insurance may be necessary. Check with your local automobile club or with the Canadian Automobile Association (CAA) for details.

#### Currencies

Before leaving Canada, consult a bank or a foreign currency agent about the most appropriate form in which to carry your funds. In some countries, Canadian currency and traveller's cheques in Canadian dollars are not accepted by all establishments. It is often convenient to obtain in advance small amounts of the different currencies you will need on arrival in each country, except, of course, where the importation of local currency is a crime.

Some countries have currency regulations and require a currency declaration upon arrival. Many countries insist that currency exchange be carried out at officially designated banking institutions at approved rates of exchange. The authorities may consider any other type of currency exchange to be black-marketeering, an offence often punishable by confiscation, severe fine and lengthy jail sentence. Check with the foreign missions in Canada or with your travel agent about currency regulations in countries you intend to visit.

Keep a separate record of your traveller's cheques and credit cards. In the event of loss or theft, they can be cancelled and replaced.

## **TRAVELLING TO THE UNITED STATES**

Canadians make about 50 million trips each year to the United States, often for the day or for trips of longer duration. We sometimes forget that we are actually going to another country when we visit our neighbour to the south. Despite our close relationship, the United States has different laws and customs, which travellers should know before they leave home.

## **Customs – Zero Tolerance**

The United States' Zero Tolerance Policy imposes severe penalties for the possession of even a small amount of illegal drugs. U.S. Customs have confiscated thousands of motor vehicles since the implementation of this policy in 1988.

If you take prescription drugs, always keep them in their original container. Carry only a reasonable amount necessary for the length of your stay and do not forget your prescriptions. Some over-the-counter drugs readily available in Canada require a prescription in the United States. U.S. Customs can confiscate your car if you are in possession of such drugs without a prescription. Check with your pharmacist before leaving Canada.

## Immigration

You must be able to prove your Canadian citizenship when you are in the United States. Always carry your Canadian passport, or your citizenship certificate or your birth certificate. A driver's licence is not proof of your Canadian citizenship. American air carriers will not allow you to board unless you have proof of your Canadian citizenship. Failure to prove your citizenship, attempted illegal entry or taking employment in the United States without authorization from the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service (USINS) could result in penalties ranging from the impounding of your vehicle to detention. Detention centres can be very far from the Canadian border. Lengthy processing delays can ensue before you are allowed to return to Canada.

The USINS may seize the vehicles of those trying to bring inadmissible individuals into the United States or trying to enter the U.S. after having been refused admission at another port-of-entry.

Any country can bar certain persons from entering its territory. The U.S. immigration law excludes, among others, persons with past criminal convictions. This includes past

criminal convictions in Canada. Canadian pardons and for that matter any pardons are generally not recognized by U.S. authorities. Canadians who are inadmissible to the U.S. for any reason may be able to visit the United States if they obtain a Waiver of Excludability beforehand from the United States Embassy or the nearest United States consulate in Canada.

## CANADA CUSTOMS AND IMPORT CONTROLS

## Upon Return to Canada

You must declare everything acquired abroad, whether purchases or gifts, including goods bought at a Canadian or foreign duty-free store. They should be easily accessible for inspection.

It's wise to have with you receipts for goods purchased, for accommodation while you were away and for repairs done (or parts added) to articles you had when you left Canada. Such parts and repairs may be subject to duty and taxes, unless they were essential to your safe return to Canada.

Before you leave, ask Canada Customs to identify and list the serial numbers of all your valuables on a wallet-sized card (form Y-38). This can be done at your local customs office or at your point of departure. It establishes that you owned the articles before departure and so can reimport them duty- and tax-free.

Jewellery and other items which are not uniquely identifiable will not be documented. Ask your local customs office about identification procedures.

For more details and a list of regional customs offices, see the brochure *I Declare*, available at border points, airports, passport offices, customs offices, Canadian missions abroad or from Communications Branch, Revenue Canada, Customs and Excise, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A 0L5.

Call your local customs office in Canada if you need information on importation of goods acquired outside of Canada. Canadian missions cannot give you more than very basic information on this subject.

## Restrictions

Many hazardous products such as firearms, explosives, detonators and pyrotechnic devices are not allowed to be imported into Canada or are restricted. Ask your local customs office for details.

The importation of living species or their by-products is strictly controlled. The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) prohibits the import or export of more than 1,000 plant and animal species and their by-products without permits. For more information, contact the Administrator, CITES, Canadian Wildlife Service, Environment Canada, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A 0H3.

Agriculture Canada controls or prohibits the entry into Canada of animals, birds, insects, plants and soil and their by-products. This is done to prevent the introduction into Canada of viruses and other causes of disease. For more information, consult Agriculture Canada's pamphlet *Don't Bring It Back*, available at airports.

## **Motor Vehicles**

There are many restrictions on the importation of motor vehicles. Under Canadian customs law, for example, used or second-hand vehicles of other than the current model year are, in most cases, prohibited. This means you cannot import them even if you are willing to pay the applicable import assessments. There are some exceptions and to find out more, pick up a copy of the booklet *Importing a Motor Vehicle into Canada* from your local customs office.

In addition to the customs restrictions, motor vehicles must conform to Canadian safety and emission standards in order to be eligible for importation into Canada. Only the original manufacturer can certify that a vehicle meets these standards. For more information, contact Transport Canada, Road Safety and Motor Vehicle Regulations Directorate, Canada Building, 13th Floor, 344 Slater Street, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A 0N5.

#### After Residence Abroad

Before you move back to Canada after a stay abroad of more than one year, there are special import provisions for household items and personal belongings. More information is contained in the brochure *Moving Back* to *Canada*?, available from Canadian missions abroad or from Communications Branch, Revenue Canada, Customs and Excise, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A 0L5.

# CANADIAN EMBASSIES, HIGH COMMISSIONS AND CONSULATES ABROAD

Canadian missions abroad are responsible for protecting and promoting the interests of Canada and Canadians. Most provide what are known as consular services to Canadian citizens who travel or reside in countries around the world.

At certain locations, where Canada has no established missions, consular assistance may be available from an honorary consul or from the representative of the Australian government.

Honorary consuls are not salaried civil servants. They are not equipped to provide the same range of services as a full diplomatic mission, but they can assist in emergency situations.

In a reciprocal agreement signed in 1986, Canada and Australia agreed to extend consular services to each other's citizens in areas where only one government is represented. In countries where this agreement is in place, Canadians can seek emergency assistance at Australian missions as they would at their own mission.

The following list identifies where you may seek consular assistance in each country. The address and telephone numbers are effective as of September 1991 and may be subject to change.

## BON VOYAGE, BUT...

Canadians love to travel. Each year we make more than 90 million trips abroad. The vast majority of these excursions go off without a hitch.

But unfortunately all trips don't come with a hassle-free guarantee. Accidents, illnesses, legal problems and linguistic and cultural difficulties can occur when you're travelling.

Most problems are minor, and you can usually solve them yourself. But if you run into more serious obstacles, our Canadian missions are there to help you out.

If you're sick, in trouble or have lost your passport, our missions will do all they can to smooth your way.

*Bon Voyage, But...* will help you plan ahead. Read it before you book your next vacation or business trip abroad. And pack it in your luggage — it's a handy reference book of travel tips and addresses of Canadian missions around the world. BON VOYAGE, BUT...



# PART ONE: BEFORE YOU GO

Preparation is the key to a successful trip. By doing your homework before you leave, you minimize your chances of having something go wrong.

#### Learn About Your Destination

Before you board that airplane or train, take the time to learn about the political, cultural and economic environment of your destination. Learn at least a few key phrases in the country's language. Even a modest command of the local language will go a long way.

When you're travelling, the laws of the country you're visiting apply to you too. **Never** assume that because you're a Canadian citizen, you're immune to foreign laws.

Many countries around the world are experiencing ongoing wars, insurgencies or sporadic unrest. Find out if your destination is known to be dangerous for foreigners. Check with the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade before you leave:

- Call the Department's Consular Operations and Emergency Services Division in Ottawa at 1-800-267-6788. You can call this number for information on conditions in specific countries seven days a week, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Someone is always there to answer your questions. If you would like to receive this information by fax, dial 1-800-575-2500 from the handset of your fax machine and follow the instructions.
- If you're not in Canada, contact the nearest Canadian mission. Addresses and telephone numbers are listed at the back of this booklet. Or, call the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade's Consular Operations and Emergency Services Division in Ottawa at (613) 996-8885.

To reduce your long distance costs when you're travelling, you may wish to use Canada Direct, an operator-assisted service that allows you to place calls to Canada or to other countries via a bilingual Canadian operator. Simply dial the Canada Direct access number for the country you are in and you will receive immediate assistance. For a list of all the Canada Direct access numbers, call 1-800-561-8868 (toll-free in Canada).

While you are travelling, tune into Radio Canada International. It gives you the latest news, and also broadcasts messages from the Canadian government during emergency situations.

#### Make Sure Your Passport is in Order

Your passport is the best proof of your Canadian citizenship. You and your family need valid passports to travel to most countries. Often, your passport may be required for financial or legal transactions. Even if a passport is not needed, for instance when you're travelling to the United States, it is a good idea to take it with you anyway. It is a very valuable piece of identification. If you have any questions about passports, call **1-800-567-6868**. Locally you can call: in Toronto, **973-3251**; in Ottawa-Hull, **994-3500**; in Vancouver, **775-6250**; or in Montreal, **283-2152**.

Applications for Canadian passports may be obtained at passport offices, post offices and some travel agencies. Allow at least three weeks for delivery.

If your passport is due to expire within the next six months, check with your destination's embassy or consulate in Canada to find out their rules and restrictions regarding passport validity and expiration. Some countries might not let you enter if your passport is only a few months away from expiring.

#### BON VOYAGE, BUT ...

Make a photocopy of your passport's identification page and keep it separate from the original when you travel. For added security, leave a photocopy with a friend or a relative at home. These simple steps may speed the replacement process if you lose your passport.

If your passport is lost or stolen while you are travelling, contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately to get a replacement. Also report the loss to the local police. Before a new passport can be issued, you must complete an application form, produce written evidence of your Canadian citizenship (e.g. a birth or citizenship certificate), present new photographs and pay the full fee.

#### Do You Need A Visa?

You need a visa to travel to certain countries. Check with your travel agent or with the country's embassy or consulate in Canada to determine the requirements. Apply for visas well in advance of your trip.

When you arrive at your destination, be prepared to prove that you have enough money to support yourself during your stay.

Be aware of the rules and restrictions governing visas and your length of stay. This knowledge can save you both time and money.

Some countries will only allow you to enter if you can prove you will be leaving too — be prepared to show your return or onward ticket, or any visas you might have that will show that you plan to visit another country.

#### **Charter Flights**

Before you book a charter flight to your destination, check out both the travel agency's and the charter company's credentials with either the Better Business Bureau or a local consumer advisory organization.



#### **Check If You Have Dual Nationality**

To avoid unpleasant surprises, find out whether you, your spouse, or any other family member, are citizens of another country. If you are considered a "national", you may be compelled to do military service or pay special taxes. In extreme cases, you may not even be allowed to leave. Check your status with the country's embassy or consular mission in Canada before you leave.

If you do run into problems because of your dual nationality, contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately. Though they will be limited by the laws of the host country, they will help you where possible, and will keep relatives at home informed of your situation.

#### Access for People With Special Needs

Many countries do not provide access for people in wheelchairs or make allowances for those with special hearing, sight or other physical requirements. Contact your local access organization or talk to others who have travelled to your destination in the past. There are also several guides published on the topic of international travel for people with special needs. Check your local public library or bookstore.

#### Get Medical Advice Before You Go Away

Your family physician may be a good source of medical advice. As well, you can call the Quarantine Health Services division of Health Canada at (613) 957-8739 for information.

#### Vaccinations

Before travelling to exotic destinations, find out <u>well in</u> <u>advance of your trip</u> if you need any special vaccinations or preventive medications for such illnesses as yellow fever, typhoid, meningitis, Japanese encephalitis, hepatitis or malaria. Also make sure your tetanus shots are up-to-date.

Start your vaccination shots <u>at least three months before</u> you leave. In some cases, you may need several inoculations with waiting periods between each injection.

International Certificates of Vaccination as proof of immunization against yellow fever may be required by some countries as a condition of entry.

#### AIDS

AIDS/HIV is a global disease. Some countries have introduced AIDS testing for foreigners. Find out if you need a test <u>before</u> you travel.

When travelling, take all the same precautions you do at home. Do not assume that condoms will be readily available. Even if they are, they may not meet the safety standards set by the World Health Organization.

Remember: Using intravenous drugs is not only illegal but extremely risky — especially if you share needles.

#### Medication

If you take medication, be sure to pack an extra supply just in case you're away for longer than expected. Carrying a duplicate of your original prescription for this medication is a smart idea — especially when travelling to countries that are particularly sensitive about drugs. Also, carry an extra prescription from your doctor that lists both the generic and trade names of the drug, just in case your medication is lost or stolen. This is also a good idea if you wear glasses or contact lenses — having an extra prescription on hand makes replacing them easier.

#### Do not try to save luggage space by combining medications into a single container. Keep all medications in the original, labelled container to avoid problems.

Check to make sure that any medication you require is available in the country you are visiting. Also check to see that it is legal — some over-the-counter medications in Canada are illegal in other countries or require a prescription.



If you need syringes for a medical condition, such as diabetes, it is very important that you take along an appropriate supply. As well, you should carry a medical certificate that shows they are for medical use.

#### Pregnancy

If you are pregnant, talk to your doctor if you plan to travel abroad. Some vaccinations may not be recommended. Also, check your travel and health insurance plans carefully to ensure they cover health complications arising from pregnancy.

#### Upon Your Return

If you have been ill while abroad, or become ill upon return, contact your doctor immediately. Be able to provide your physician with the specifics of any treatment you received while you were away.

If you have a fever or a flu-like illness upon your return, see your physician as soon as possible, especially if you've just returned from an area where malaria is common. You can help your doctor by telling him/her the countries you have been visiting.

#### Supplemental Health Insurance Is Crucial

Don't make the mistake of relying on your provincial health plan to pick up the tab if you get sick or are injured in a foreign country. At best, your health plan will cover only a portion of the bill. It's your responsibility to obtain and understand the terms of your supplementary insurance policies. Some credit cards offer their holders health and travel insurance. Don't assume that it provides adequate coverage by itself.

Be sure to ask whether or not your policy:

Pays foreign hospital and related medical costs, and if so, whether it pays "up front" or expects you to pay and be reimbursed later.

#### BON VOYAGE, BUT ...



- Provides for your medical evacuation to Canada.
- Pays for any required medical escort (doctor/nurse or companion) to accompany you back to Canada.
- Excludes pre-existing medical conditions. If such conditions exist, notify your insurance company and get an agreement in writing that you are covered for these conditions. Otherwise, you could find your claim "null and void" under a pre-existing conditions clause.
- Covers premature births and related neonatal care. You may be covered, but is your baby if he/she is born while you're away?
- Allows for cash advances if a hospital accepts only cash in advance.
- Pays for the preparation and return to Canada of your remains should you die while travelling.

**Carry details of your insurance with you.** Also, tell your travel agent, a friend or relative at home and your travelling companion how to contact your insurer.

Get a detailed invoice from the doctor or hospital before you leave the country. There is nothing more frustrating than trying to get the proper paperwork from thousands of kilometres away.

#### **Consider Purchasing Other Insurance**

Lost luggage, theft of your purse or wallet, or flight cancellations are frequent occurrences. These annoyances can cause major disruptions when they take place in a foreign country. Think about purchasing a travel insurance package that will compensate you for these inconveniences.

#### **Travelling By Car?**

Keep in mind that each country may have its own driving regulations. You may be required to obtain an international driver's license or additional insurance. Be sure to learn the local rules of the road before you get behind the wheel.

In some countries, the driver may be detained and questioned by the police, following an accident that results in no serious damage or personal injury (such as in a fender-bender).

#### **Money Matters**

In many countries, Canadian currency and travellers cheques in Canadian dollars are not widely accepted. Before you leave Canada, consult a bank or a foreign currency agent to find out the most appropriate currency to carry. It's a good idea to have a small amount of the local money on hand when you first arrive — unless, of course, the importation of local currency is a crime. There may be restrictions on taking money in and out of the country. Check with the foreign embassies or consulates in Canada or with your travel agent about currency regulations in countries you intend to visit.

Don't rely exclusively on banking machine cards or credit cards. They won't necessarily be universally honoured.

#### Have a Great Trip! But Before You Go...

- Do your research. Learn about the country you plan to visit. Learn a few phrases in the local language.
- Get supplementary health insurance and travel insurance.
- Carry proof of insurance coverage, and give a copy to someone at home.
- Draw up a flexible itinerary and budget. Keep a copy at home.

- Make sure your passport hasn't expired. Photocopy the identification page, and keep it separate from your passport. Leave another copy with somebody at home.
- Make sure you have any visas you need.
- Find out whether or not you or any members of your family are considered nationals of any of the countries you plan to visit.
- Get all the required vaccinations. If you need to take medication with you, make sure you keep it in its original container. Carry a doctor's prescription for any controlled drugs, and if you use syringes, carry a medical certificate. Leave copies at home as well.
- Don't forget to pack this booklet. It could help you more than you could imagine.

# PART TWO: ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE

#### **Register at the Canadian Mission**

If your stay is going to be any longer than three months in one country, it is recommended that you formally register at the nearest Canadian mission. By doing so, you will enable us to contact you in case of an emergency or crisis. Normally, registration is not available in the countries of Western Europe, Japan, Australia, New Zealand and the United States.

In countries where Canada has no direct representation, there may be arrangements in place for you to register with another country's embassy or consulate. For instance, Canada has a formal reciprocal agreement with Australia.

#### Consular Assistance

Canada's missions abroad are ready to help you in case of emergency. In some instances, there may be a fee for services.

What can we do for you?

- We can contact, at your request, your relatives or friends and ask them to send you emergency funds.
- We can help you during emergencies, such as natural disasters and civil and military uprisings.
- We can direct you to sources of information about local laws, regulations, cultural customs and how to obtain visas.
- We can assist with medical emergencies.
- If you are arrested, we can try to ensure equitable treatment under local laws. We can inform relatives and friends about your arrest and try to ensure that legal rights and processes are extended to you consistent with the standards of the host country. However, we cannot set aside local laws if you are charged with an offence, or intervene in the judicial process of a foreign country. We cannot post bail, pay for a lawyer, or pay your fines.
- If you wish, we can notify your next of kin regarding accidents or deaths and let them know whether, and how, they can help.

# Check the listings in this book for information about the Canadian missions in the countries you plan to visit.

#### **Emergency Consular Services**

Canadian missions offer 24-hour assistance. During non-office hours, an answering machine will take your message. The machines are monitored regularly by an on-duty officer. It is essential that you leave a clear and detailed message, including a telephone number, if possible, where you can be reached. Duty officers worldwide are remarkably successful at providing



emergency assistance to Canadians in all types of difficulty. Certain missions will relay your call directly to the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade's Consular Operations and Emergency Services Division in Ottawa.

You can also call the Department in Ottawa yourself at (613) 996-8885. Use the Canada Direct service if it is available.

In some areas where Canada doesn't have a fully established mission, you may obtain emergency consular assistance from an honorary consul for Canada, or, at certain other locations, from the Australian mission. Though not equipped to provide you with the same range of services as fully established Canadian missions, they can assist you in an emergency.

#### Consular Assistance Around the Globe

A list identifying where you may seek consular assistance abroad is provided at the back of this book.

Please remember that addresses and/or telephone numbers could change for various reasons such as a move to a different complex or building, changes to local telephone system, etc. Should you fail to reach a mission through the number listed in this booklet, call the local operator for the latest information.

# PART THREE: WHILE TRAVELLING

#### **Respect Foreign Laws and Customs**

When you're travelling in a foreign country, familiarize yourself with the way of life there. Respect that country's laws, religions, culture, class structure and economic conditions. Though you may not personally agree with some of their beliefs, remember that you are a visitor.

In many countries, appropriate attire — for both sexes — is very important. In some countries, for example, there are laws governing what men and women can and cannot wear in public. Penalties for disobeying local laws can be quite severe.



Be especially respectful of temples, mosques, churches, synagogues and other religious sites. Many of these areas are off-limits to foreigners or people who are not members of that faith. Ask permission first if you would like to take photographs of religious artifacts or buildings.

Not everybody likes to have his or her picture taken. Local people may resent you for taking their photograph or they may demand money for the picture after it has been taken. Always ask first.

Never take photographs of military facilities, a harbour where there are naval vessels present or industrial installations such as oil refineries. You may lose your film and your camera, and could even come under suspicion of espionage.

#### **Take Precautions**



The same rules apply abroad as at home, only more so. Foreigners are usually at greater risk than locals — indeed, in many countries they are specifically targeted. Accordingly, do not wander into unknown areas — check out how safe they are first. Do not pick up hitchhikers or cross borders with people you have only just met. Watch your luggage and make sure it is locked — never take anything, even an envelope, across a border for someone else.

Do not flash large amounts of money in public. Use money belts and cases with concealed sections for valuables.

Leave a copy of your itinerary with somebody back home so that they can contact you in case of an emergency. Phone home occasionally if you're backpacking or if you have no fixed schedule, particularly if you have promised family members or friends that you would do so. The Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade receives thousands of calls every year from worried family members or friends who have not received a promised call.

cards. Never carry your passport, travel tickets, identification documents, cash, credit cards and insurance papers together. If you do so, you risk being left with no identification or funds.

Use the safety deposit box at your hotel. Never leave valuables in your room.

#### **Illegal Drugs**

Drug use and trafficking are prohibited in all countries, even though drugs are readily available and openly used in some places. Most countries impose heavy fines and long prison sentences for possession and trafficking.

In some countries, possession of even small amounts of drugs carries the death penalty.

Never transport any parcel that isn't yours across a border.

Choose your travelling companions wisely. Never cross a border with a hitchliker or as a hitchliker. Though you may not be carrying anything illegal, your companions may be.

#### **Crime and Punishment**

More than 1,000 Canadians are currently imprisoned abroad for various offences — 60 per cent of those are in the United States.

The laws and customs of countries around the world can be very different from those in Canada. Ignorance of laws is no defence from whatever penalties may be attached.

While in a foreign country, you are subject to its laws and regulations. Your Canadian citizenship offers no immunity. Canadian consular staff abroad must also follow the rules of the host country. If you do find yourself in trouble, they can help you find a lawyer, contact your family and friends, and ensure you receive fair treatment according to the standards of that country. However, they cannot pull any strings to reduce your sentence or fine.



#### **Judicial Process**

Never assume that the legal system of the country you're visiting is the same as Canada's. "Innocent until proven guilty" isn't a universally recognized idea. In some countries, you may not even have the right to legal representation or a trial in your mother tongue.

Some countries don't recognize or respect religious freedom, freedom of association, speech or the press, or equality of the sexes. For instance, guilt by association is presumed in some countries. This means that you may be charged simply for being in the company of a person suspected or found guilty of a crime.

Even if you're an innocent bystander at a demonstration or riot, you may be considered a participant and rounded up with those involved. **Your Canadian citizenship does not grant you immunity.** 

If you do find yourself in an illegal situation, contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately. If you cannot do so yourself, have someone else do it for you.

#### **Flight Reconfirmation**

At each stopover, reconfirm onward reservations to avoid being stranded. You can usually get updated flight information 72 hours in advance of your departure.

#### Mail

If you are travelling for an extended period of time, you can arrange to have your mail sent to a post office box or, where possible, to the nearest Canadian mission. In the latter case, the mission will hold on to letter-size mail (not parcels) for you to pick up <u>in person</u>. This mail cannot be forwarded to another address.

#### BON VOYAGE, BUT...



Canadians make more than 50 million trips each year to the United States. Because of our close relationship with our neighbours to the south, we sometimes forget that we're visiting another country. The same preparations should be made for visiting the United States as for travelling to any foreign country. And it should be remembered that their laws and customs are different from ours at home.

Always carry your Canadian passport, citizenship or birth certificate when you're travelling to the United States. A driver's licence is not valid proof of citizenship. When you're returning by air from the United States, you will have to prove that you're a Canadian citizen, otherwise you may not be allowed to board. We urge you to carry a Canadian passport, as it is the best form of identification.

Single parents travelling with children often need proof of custody or letters from the other parent authorizing travel. Kidnapping is high on the U.S. Immigration officials' agenda, and not having this documentation may prevent you from entering or continuing your trip.

The United States' Zero Tolerance Policy imposes severe penalties for the possession of even a small amount of illegal drugs. U.S. Customs has confiscated thousands of motor vehicles and vessels since the implementation of this policy in 1988.

Even prescription drugs and syringes used for medical reasons come under intense scrutiny. Keep all prescription drugs in their original container. Check with your pharmacist to find out which over-the-counter drugs in Canada require a prescription in the United States. Carry a medical certificate for your syringes, and declare them to U.S. Customs officials.

When travelling to the United States, keep in mind that:

As soon as you stop at the U.S. border, you are subject to U.S. law. Immigration laws in the United States refuse entry to, among others, people with a criminal record.

- What you say in answer to the immigration or customs officer can be used against you if you are considered to be, for any reason, inadmissable. For example, many people have had their vehicles seized because they pretended to be Canadian citizens when they were actually landed immigrants or visitors. Many others have had them seized because they did not immediately admit to having a criminal record (no matter how old), or they pretended to be visitors while looking for work in the United States.
- When a person is refused entry, the information is entered in the computer and if another entry is attempted, the person is again subject to fines and/or vehicle seizure.
- Canadian pardons are not recognized by U.S. authorities. Canadians who are considered inadmissable may apply for a waiver of excludability through the U.S. embassy or consulate in Canada.

# PART FOUR: RETURNING TO CANADA

#### **Departure Tax**

Some countries impose a departure tax at the airport or point of departure. Prior to leaving such a country, make sure you set aside enough money, in local funds, to pay for this tax.

#### **Canada Customs and Import Controls**

You must declare everything acquired abroad, whether purchases for yourself or gifts, as well as goods bought at a Canadian or foreign duty-free store. Keep your receipts for possible inspection.

If you've been away from Canada for 24 hours, you may claim C\$20 worth of goods, excluding alcohol and tobacco, duty-free. After 48 hours, you may claim C\$100. Once every calendar year you may bring in goods to the value of C\$300.

## BON VOYAGE, BUT ...

Certain goods are restricted from entering Canada. If you are considering importing meat or dairy products, weapons, plants, vehicles, or exotic animals or products made from their skins or feathers, please contact Canada Customs beforehand for guidance.

Obscene materials, hate propaganda, most weapons and firearms, and goods harmful to the environment are prohibited from entering Canada.

If you have any questions about what you can and cannot bring into Canada, call your local Canada Customs office. Someone is available 24 hours a day, year-round, to answer your questions. If you're calling in Canada, dial 1-800-461-9999 to reach the Automated Customs Information System. Outside Canada, call (613) 993-0534.

#### After Residing Abroad

After a stay abroad of longer than a year, there are special import provisions for household items and personal belongings when you move back to Canada. More information is contained in the brochure *Moving Back to Canada?*, available from Canadian missions abroad, your local customs office, or from the Communications Branch, Revenue Canada, Customs and Excise, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A OL5, telephone (613) 993-0534 or 1-800-461-9999 (within Canada).

### Canada Direct Access Numbers

When you're abroad, making calls to Canada or other countries can be difficult because of language problems or unpredictable long distance rates and hotel surcharges.

With the Canada Direct service, you get:

**Canadian rates** — which are lower than overseas long distance rates in most other countries. (Check country-to-country rates with the *Canada Direct* operator for calls to adjacent countries.)

Canadian operators - who will serve you in either English or French.

**Choice of billing** – to your *Calling Card*<sup>™</sup> phone card, or collect if you're calling Canada. Or, you can use a HELLO!<sup>™</sup> Phone Pass, the pre-paid long distance card (from May 1, 1995, pending CRTC approval).

A fast and easy way - to call home or to call other countries.

#### How to use Canada Direct

- Refer to the chart. Make calls to Canada from any country on the chart. Make calls within a shaded country, or from that country to most other countries in the world.
- 2 Find the Canada Direct Access Number for the country YOU ARE IN. Check the legend for an explanation of the symbols.
- 3 If you are in a hotel, follow hotel instructions to get an outside line. (Some hotels may apply a surcharge to each Canada Direct call.)
- 4 Dial the Canada Direct Access Number.
- 5 A Canadian operator will answer and provide service in your choice of either English or French. Use Calling Card service or HELLO! Phone-Pass to place calls (calls to Canada only can be placed collect.) For information on placing HELLO! Phone Pass calls, refer to its user guide.
- 6 Calls to Canada are billed at operator-assisted rates. Time of day discounts apply, based on the time and day in Canada. TelePlus Overseas™, Real-Plus™ and Advantage™ discounts also apply (except for collect calls).

7 For country-to-country calls, the first leg (from originating country to Canada) is charged at operator-assisted rates, subject only to time of day discounts. The second leg (Canada to terminating country) is charged at country-to-country calling rates. (N:B. Both legs are billed for the entire duration of the call.)




