C. Miller, Ex-President of the C.L.A., Received the Money Yesterday for Fifteen Around-the-World Tickets - Names of Players Who Will Likely Make Trip.

ORILLIA, May 15.—Mr. J. C. Miller, ex-president of the C. L. A., received a cablegram this morning from Australia, telling him the money for 15 around-the-world tickets, to the Australian trip is now assured.

The team will play the first game in Orillia on Monday, June 8. Their opponents will be Newmarket, Peterborough or Leamington.

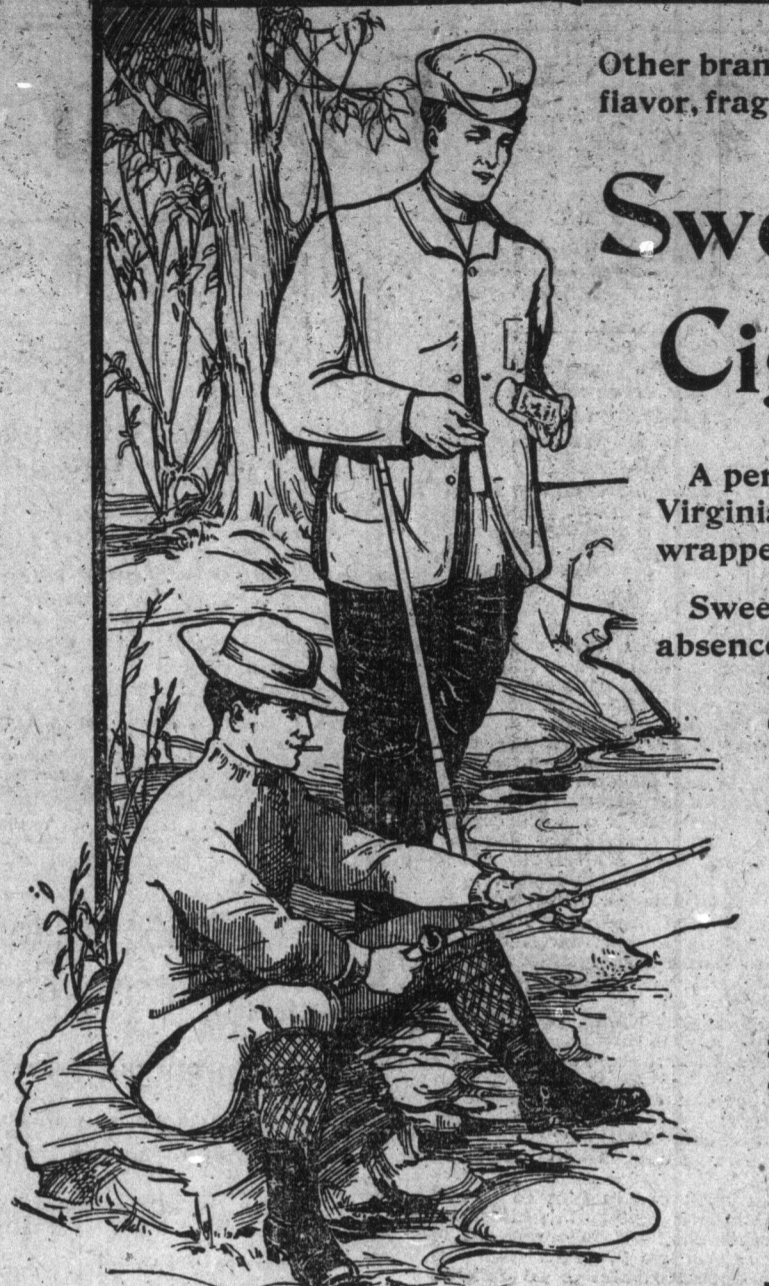
