ALBERTA'S NEW CONSTITUENCIES HAVE BEEN WONDERFULLY MADE BASED ON VOTE OF NOV. 3 LAST.

Premier Reluctantly Gives Some Statistics Showing Queer Attempts to Carve Out Safe Division—McCarthy Wants the Judges to Do It.

Ottawa, June 20.—(Special.) The chances of the attorney general's plan to carve out twenty-five constituencies in the Province of Alberta for the election of its first legislature, were under consideration in the house today. The premier started out with the assurance that all the opposition was to be carried out in the constituencies were detailed in the bill and projected upon a map. But registered inquiries from the opposition for information as to the basis on which the new province is to be carved out, so as to favor the chance of the Liberal capturing the legislature, caused Sir Wilfrid to relent and statistics, such as they were, were ultimately supplied. From these it appeared that several tests must have been applied to ascertain what scheme promised the best party result. The return of the registered voters for the Dominion election of 1904 was taken as the basis of the division, and comparisons made of the number of postoffices in the several proposed constituencies.

Mr. Foster asked how many had been kept absolutely as they are now. Sir Wilfrid could not answer exactly at the time. W. F. Maclean observed that it would thus appear there were no political considerations in making these divisions. "The only political considerations are justice and fairness to the people from crossing. Mr. Oliver said that the census of 1901 was unreliable, owing to the influx of population, the divisions were made on the basis of the vote cast at the last election, which would amount to \$90 as the unit of population. Mr. Oliver had more information to offer than Mr. Foster proceeded to complain that this was treating the opposition unfairly, observing that the government would get very few votes if full explanations were not forthcoming. This Mr. Oliver treated in kind. Eventually the prime minister produced a map and some figures of population. He also showed where constituencies had been carved out of former constituencies. The vote polled on Nov. 3, 1904, was taken as the basis of representation, the number of voters in each of the proposed constituencies.

INVESTIGATING SCRIP CHARGES.

Commission Starts July 26—Witnesses Will Be Heard to Get.

Winnipeg, June 20.—(Special.)—The commission to inquire into scrip charges preferred by Hon. Mr. Foster in the parliament will sit in Kilmurray, Man. Judge Myers will preside and the first session will be held on July 26. It is expected that the commission will sit for at least a week. A prominent citizen remarked today on hearing that Judge Myers was to investigate the scrip scandal that there was plenty of evidence to offer. He did not see the sense, however, of appointing a judge to investigate, when the principal charge is that there has been collusion on the part of interior department employees, who rear Ottawa. He thought the investigation should be conducted by a parliamentary committee and an attorney who the departmental records and departmental clerks would be handy.

SEMAPHORE SAVED HIM.

Also Quickwitted Gateman—Motor-Man Was Reckless. An accident was narrowly averted yesterday morning at 10 o'clock at the East Queen-street crossing. It appears that the semaphore was up to stop a train from the east from nearing the crossing, and while preparing to get everything in order to drop the semaphore so as to allow the train to cross Queen-street, the gateman lowered the gates to prevent people from crossing. Having done this, and while about to drop the semaphore, he noticed a private motor car from the west, coming toward the gates. Knowing that the train was still held back, and fearing that the gates would be closed, he left the semaphore as it was, lifted the gates, and the car passed over.

THERE'LL NEVER BE WAR.

Sir Charles Dilke Says Britain and U. S. Will Arbitrate. (Canadian Associated Press Cable.) London, June 20.—In an article in the Standard on "Imperial Defence," Sir Charles Dilke says the recent changes in the dockyards of Canada were based on policy rather than on strategy. The government must be of the opinion that all future disputes between Great Britain and the United States will be settled by arbitration.

TRANSPORTATION MEN CONVENE.

Busy at the King Edward Dismissal Routine of Their Calling. From almost every state in the union and from every province in Canada, the Association of Transportation and Car Accounting officials gathered at the King Edward Hotel yesterday to hold its semi-annual meeting. Besides the 150 representatives of nearly 100 roads of the continent, they brought with them their wives and children to a like number.

T. F. Brennan of the Buffalo, Rochester & Pittsburgh Railroad presided at the morning session. G. F. Chant of New York acted as secretary. The meeting was opened with a greeting from the city to the visitors.

At this meeting there are no officers elected, this falling to the lot of the fall meeting. The general business sessions made at this meeting are limited to the meetings of the American Railway Association, composed of the general managers of the different roads, through which they are carried. They will meet in the city this morning, after which the two sessions will be held.

BAKERS' DRIVERS GET IN LINE.

Organize a Union in Affiliation With the Journeymen's Branch. The executive of the bakers' union declare themselves well satisfied with the progress of the strike, and with the results of their efforts to swing public sentiment towards the patronage of bread bearing the union label.

What is regarded as an important step in strengthening the hands of the journeymen bakers was taken last night, when, at a large meeting of the bakery drivers, a branch of the international union to be known as the local union No. 287 of bakers and confectionery workers, was formally organized.

A charter had been secured, and the new body enters upon its life with a membership of 42. In enrolling applicants, the rule that only employees of union shops should be deemed eligible was strictly enforced to the detriment of the drivers in the employ of the three firms affected by the strike.

STRIKE WILL BE OVER BY TO-DAY SAYS SHERIFF.

Chicago, June 20.—Sheriff Barrett got in close touch to-day with labor leaders and gave out the following significant statement: The strike will be over within 24 hours. I expect to make speedy arrangements for decreasing the force of deputy sheriffs.


Zola's Property Scattered.

BROKER KEPT CREDIT HIGH BY RAISING OF CERTIFICATES.

In Winding Up Estate, Forgery is Revealed Which Runs up to Million Dollars.

Philadelphia, June 20.—One of the most sensational cases of forgery, that has ever been brought to light in financial circles here, is that disclosed today, after it was announced that certificates calling for small numbers of shares of stock had been fraudulently raised to hundreds of shares, causing a loss to certain banks and trust companies here of from \$500,000 to \$1,000,000. The forgery involves the name of Benjamin H. Gaskill, who died four weeks ago. Gaskill was the sole member of the banking and brokerage concern known as Benjamin H. Gaskill and Co. His credit was considered gilt edged, worth about half a million dollars. He left no will and administrators began to close up his business. A patron of the firm bought from the estate one hundred shares of Philadelphia Stock Co. stock and 100 shares of traction of the United States Steel Corporation. The Philadelphia Trust certificates did not agree with the Co.'s books, and an investigation showed that the certificate had been raised from six shares to one hundred. Further investigation revealed the fact that Gaskill had credited himself in his own books with six thousand shares of Philadelphia Trust certificates valued at approximately \$600,000, while the Tractor Co.'s books show he had only four hundred shares. "IMPERIAL LIMITED" IN WRECK WITH STOCK TRAIN; 2 KILLED; PASSENGERS ARE NOT INJURED.

Winnipeg, June 20.—(Special.)—Two men were killed, another perhaps fatally injured, many passengers were badly shaken up, and 11 cars of valuable stock were derailed in a head-on collision that occurred at 5:15 this afternoon on the C. P. R. at Kalmr, 200 miles west of Rat Portage, between the Imperial Limited, westward bound, No. 97, and a freight train, eastward bound, No. 11. The dead are: Engineer John Perry of Imperial Limited, aged 45, of Winnipeg, and Express Messenger M. F. Stacey, also of Winnipeg. Fireman Bertram Watt of Imperial Limited of Rat Portage, Ont., was severely injured, and may die. Byron A. Parson, mail clerk, is slightly injured, and Engineer Sam Bird of the stock train was slightly injured, apparently saving his life by jumping, as did also his fireman, Conductor Fogg of Winnipeg, in charge of the stock train, also injured. The passengers on the Imperial Limited got nothing worse than a severe shaking up.

At all events, Morse will definitely fix the G.T.P. entrance to Winnipeg on this trip.

BEHEADED BY A TRAIN. Farm Hand Near Rat Portage Had Been Drinking.

Portage la Prairie, June 20.—(Special.)—The body of an unknown man was found beside the C.N.R. track near Portage la Prairie this morning. The head had been completely severed from the body and the arms and legs badly mutilated. The gruesome find was made by Conductor Cook, in charge of a C.N.R. freight train. The body was brought into Portage la Prairie and was being worked for a farmer near Jeddway and had been drinking heavily.


