



ANNUAL REPORT.

HE Board of Management of "The Toronto Home for Incurables" now respectfully submit to its friends, and to the community generally, their fifth Annual Report. In doing so, they are thankful to be able to state that the operations of this Institution have been satisfactorily conducted during the year that has passed, and that it has been accomplishing the design of its promoters, in so far as the capacity of the building and regard for the comfortable accommodation of the inmates would permit.

Nothing of an untoward character has occurred in the proceedings of "The Home." On the contrary, the Board have reason for congratulation in the fact, that the public support has been generously accorded to it, and that all connected with it have been anxious to maintain it in efficiency and to increase its means of helping the helpless. It would not have been surprising, if in the midst of the great depression, to which the country for several years has been subjected, the funds had somewhat suffered; but it is gratifying that, whether from the strong and prevalent feeling in favour of such an institution, or from the active efforts of the ladies on the Board in carrying on their benevolent work, the necessary supplies have been found for the unembarrassed maintenance of "The Home."

The Board would take the opportunity of expressing their thanks to generous friends for their sympathy and aid in seeking the welfare of a class of persons who would otherwise be left, in many cases, in a very miserable condition; whilst, at the same time, they would regard it as an encouragement to prosecute the work of alleviating the sorrows of such as urgently stand in need of their help, and, if possible, to extend their endeavours in that direction. "Let us not be weary in well-doing, for in due season we shall reap if we faint not."

There have been admitted into "The Home," since the period of last Report, three male and three female patients. During this time two have died and three have left, the latter to be taken care of by friends.

There are at present in "The Home" nine women and six men—all afflicted with various diseases, and pronounced by the medical staff to be incurable.

The Board gratefully acknowledge the liberal grants of \$454.37 by the Ontario Legislature, from the public funds of the Province, and \$500 from the Mayor and City Council of Toronto. Mr. Wallace, the Warden of the County of York, has kindly sent a personal contribution of \$20, as he did last year.

The Board desire to refer with satisfaction to the fact that Mr. Langmuir, the Government Inspector, in his report, speaks so favourably of the Institution and of the manner in which it is conducted, and that he also gives every encouragement to take steps for having a larger and permanent building, in the confidence that it will be productive of much benefit in the city and throughout the country.

It connection with this it will be remembered, as intimated in last year's Report, that the Board had been constrained, because of the limited capacity of the present building rented for the purposes of "The Home," to contemplate the erection of a larger and more commodious structure and one specially suited to the objects in view. Accordingly, a piece of land at the western limits of the city, in as fine and healthful a situation as could be found, was purchased. This lot consists of fully four and a half acres, at the cost of \$1000 per acre. It could not now be obtained at anything near that sum. The ground has been fenced and also prepared for building, and all paid for. A plan has been selected by a committee of competent gentlemen connected with the Board—a plan which, when carried out, will

present a very handsome, roomy building, capable of receiving sixty or seventy patients at once; and a plan which, at any future time, can be uniformly enlarged without any disfigurement to the part first erected, but rather to its improvement.

Nothing stands in the way of immediately proceeding to build, but the want of the necessary funds. The estimated cost would be about \$22,000, and, of course, a considerable portion of this would require to be in hand before commencing the work. After paying the price of the ground (over \$4,500), and the expense of preparing it, there are available a few thousand dollars from sources which may be enumerated in the accounts; but the Board do not deem it advisable to enter upon the work of building with that limited amount. They are of opinion, however, that the time has now arrived when an appeal should be made to those whom GoD has blessed with the means, to enable them to forward a cause which has never failed, whenever it has been presented to Christian hearts, to awaken their deep sympathy-viz., the care and comfort of such as are, humanly speaking, incurable, and at the same time have no earthly friends or relatives to attend to them.

There is, perhaps, no institution for the relief of our suffering fellow-creatures which ought so powerfully to open the hearts and hands of those who are favoured with health and worldly means as a Hospital or Home for destitute Incurables. Hence, it is the general experience that wherever they have been established, such Institutions have gathered around them the sympathies and prayers and benefactions of those who have the same mind that was in CHRIST, so that they have been largely instrumental in brightening the lives of many who might have been pining away in discomfort and pain and misery; and it is earnestly hoped that this may be the result in the case of this one, whose claims the Board of Management would take the liberty of commending to the benevolent and charitable of the City and the whole Province. "Blessed is he that considereth the poor: the LORD will deliver him in time of trouble." "Honour the LORD with thy substance." "Inasmuch," says our LORD, "as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto Me."

The medical gentlemen, who regularly visit "The Home," have laid the Board under great obligations by their disinterested and valued services. These services have been essential to the comfort and relief of the patients.

To the clergymen and others who have so kindly conducted religious services on Sabbaths and other days, the grateful acknowledgments of the Board are made.

The Superintendent and Matron, Mr. and Mrs. McKenny, continue to discharge their duties to the satisfaction of the Board. "The Home" is kept in good order, and its arrangements are carefully and efficiently attended to for the benefit of the patients.

There has been collected in subscriptions throughout the year the sum of \$2,356.40, as in the Treasurer's Statement appended to this Report.

MEDICAL ATTENDANTS' REPORT.

THE Medical Officers of the Incurables' Hospital beg leave to submit the following Report:

During the past year the inmates of "The Home," though suffering from various chronic incurable complaints, have been remarkably free from acute intercurrent attacks, so serious to persons of advanced years and those whose constitutions are weakened by protracted disease and suffering; consequently little active medical treatment was required.

There are at present in the house six men and nine women, labouring under various complaints of an incurable nature, chiefly rheumatism and paralysis. Two deaths took place during the year, and one man and one woman went home to their friends.

It gives the Medical Staff great pleasure to report most favourably of the cleanliness and general good management of "The Home;" the almost entire absence of any complaints by the patients being very noticeable. This satisfactory state of matters they consider to be, in part at least, due to the care and attention of the Matron and Superintendent to the wants of those placed under their charge.

ANNUAL MEETING.

THE Annual Meeting of The Toronto Home for Incurables was held in Shaftesbury Hall, on Tuesday, the 25th of March, 1879, and was largely attended. His Worship, James Beaty, Esq., Q.C., Mayor of Toronto, in the Chair.

The Rev. Henry Powis, of Zion Church, having opened the meeting with prayer, the Report of the Board of Management was read by the Rev. Dr. Topp, along with the Report of the Medical Staff.

I. The Hon. John McMurrich having submitted the Treasurer's Financial Statement, it was moved by him, seconded by the Rev. A. J. Broughall, of St. Stephen's Church, and carried—

"That the Reports now read be adopted, and ordered to be printed and circulated for the information of the friends of the Institution and of the community generally."

2. It was moved by the Rev. Dr. Potts, seconded by James Lesslie, Esq., of "The Willows," and agreed to—

"That a Home or Hospital for Destitute Incurables is deserving of the sympathy and support of all who desire to alleviate the sufferings of their fellow-creatures; and especially in a new country like this, where there are many without family connexions, to any great extent, to afford them aid in time of trouble and helplessness." 3. - 3. It was moved by T. W. Thomson, Esq., seconded by the Rev. Dr. Hamilton, and agreed to—
 - "That there is much reason of thankfulness to God, who has the hearts of all in His hands, for the generous support which has been accorded to this institution during the few years, in which it has been in existence; and, also, for the encouragement which its friends thereby have to endeavour to extend its usefulness."
- 4. It was moved by John Macdonald, Esq., seconded by Professor D. Wilson, LL.D., and agreed to—
 - "Considering that the house now rented as "The Home" can supply only limited accommodation, and it is desirable to make the Institution more extensively useful; considering also that, with this view, a lot of ground has been purchased by the Board for the erection of a permanent building, and that they have obtained a suitable plan for the same; considering further, that they have a few thousand dollars in hand devoted to building purposes: be it resolved, therefore, that an effort should now be made to raise a sufficient sum to enable them to proceed with the erection of said building, and that the gentlemen on the Board of Management be appointed a Committee to take such measures as may be deemed best fitted to secure that object."

A vote of thanks having been passed to the Mayor for his kindness in presiding and for his conduct in the chair, the meeting was closed by Dr. Potts pronouncing the benediction.


