REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED.

Your Committee, in presenting this report, wishes to express its deep sense of the loss sustained by the Society in the death of Mrs MacCoy, the efficient and beloved President of the Nova Scotia Branch. At the request of the Committee, a letter of sympathy was written by the President to the Secretary of the N. S. Branch.

At the last meeting of the Board, a request from Rev. Dr. Eby for the establishment of a central home for evangelistic work in Hongo could not be granted; but it was recommended that a home be provided for two Bible-women, and that the ladies from Azabu visit in the district. The Council in Japan acted upon this, but it was found unsatisfactory, and the Bible-women were withdrawn, believing that their time could be more profitably employed in Komagoma, Shytaya, and Kakigara, three other districts. Dr. Eby then applied to the General Society to send a lady worker to that especial This the General Society thought unadvisable. A committee was appointed from the Committee of Consultation and Finance, to confer with your Executive on the subject. After a minute and careful consideration of the requirements of the work, and the desirability of such an appointment being clearly recognized, it was agreed to recommend the establishment of a second centre for woman's work, which would meet the needs of the Tabernacle and adjacent churches, to be under the direction of the Woman's Missionary Society; the General Society to aid in providing the Home, the W. M. S. to appoint and maintain the women workers; also that representatives of the two Societies confer together and lay down certain general principles as a basis of co-operation.

In view of information received later, and the probability of changes being made in regard to the Tabernacle at the Japan Conference, it was

Resolved,—That this Committee does not see it way clear to proceed with the plan agreed to previously, but would desire to continue work along the line laid down by the Board of Managers.

A letter was received from Mrs. Large, tendering her resignation. This was followed by one addressed to Mrs. Large, and signed by all the ladies in Japan, urging Mrs. Large to withdraw her resignation. It was

Resolved,—That no action be taken at present in regard to Mrs. Large's resignation, believing that her good judgment and deep interest in the work will, directed by our heavenly Father, lead her to a right decision.

Mrs. Large has since withdrawn her resignation.

The resignation of Miss Shoultz, referred by the Board to the Executive, was accepted, and her return expenses, amounting to \$190.22, were paid.

The resignation of Miss Cushing was received. It having already been accepted by the Council in Japan, the Executive was asked to

endorse the action of the Council, which was done.

Miss Wintemute's resignation was received, accompanied by a report of work done during the year's furlough. Miss Wintemute had travelled 11,736 miles (including 8,525 from Japan); addressed fifty-eight public meetings, eight Auxiliaries, four Mission Bands, eight Sabbath Schools, and assisted in ten Japanese entertainments. From these meetings the Society received about \$550, and between forty and fifty new members were added. This report was considered highly satisfactory.

The following resolution was carried unanimously,-That Miss Wintemute's resignation be accepted, and that we assure her of our prayers for continued success in her new sphere in life, trusting that the kind Father above who has so abundantly blessed her labors in our Woman's Missionary Society may guide and direct her in what-

ever part of His vineyard she may be called to labor.

A resignation was received from Miss Lund also. A resolution was passed declining to accept it, at the same time assuring Miss Lund of our high appreciation of her self-sacrificing spirit and the valuable work done by her in the past, and expressing the earnest hope that under the guidance of the all-wise Father she may see fit to withdraw her resignation.

Miss Lund's resignation has been withdrawn, but her health is

not sufficiently improved to permit her to return at present.

The Committee was authorized to send two ladies to Japan during the year. But only one was available. Miss Crombie, of Juvenile, N. B., accepted on the recommendation of the N. B. and P. E. I. Branch, was appointed to Japan, and accompanied Miss Cunningham on her return in August.

It was with sincere regret that the Committee learned that Miss Lizzie Hart's health was not satisfactory, notwithstanding which she strongly desired to remain in the work. Permission was given her to return at any time Dr. McDonald might consider it necessary.

PORT SIMPSON, B.C.

The time for Miss Hart's well-earned furlough having come and Miss Smith, of Maitland, N.S., designated by the Board for this work, not yet being at liberty, Mrs. Redner, of Hastings, was appointed matron, having been accepted on the recommendation of the Central Branch. CHILLIWHACK.

Miss Elderkin, whose resignation was accepted by the Board, very kindly remained until July, Miss Smith, of Nova Scotia, taking her place in August. Miss Somers having withdrawn, Miss Burpee, being recommended by Miss Clarke and having furnished satisfactory testimonials, was appointed sewing teacher until the annual meeting. Mrs. Strachan and Mrs. Burns were appointed to prepare rules for the government of the new Union Institute.

The Committee on Indian Work was authorized to lay before the Committee of Consultation and Finance the memorial from British Columbia, asking an extension of the work among the Indians.

CHINESE RESCUE HOME.

At the first meeting of the Committee a letter was received from Miss Leake—then on furlough—tendering her resignation. A resolution was passed expressing high appreciation of the good work done by Miss Leake in establishing the Rescue Home, regret at her resignation, and a hope that she would reconsider it. Mrs. Morrow, who was temporarily in charge, having furnished approved testimonials, was appointed matron for the year, and to have associated with her Miss Florence Wickett, of Toronto, who was recommended by the Central Branch. The improvements, sanitary and otherwise, required in the Home, have been completed at a cost of \$554.77.

The authorized petition re traffic in Chinese girls in British Columbia, was prepared by a Union Committee, signed by the President and Secretary of the Woman's Missionary Societies of all denominations, and of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union; and by request of the Committee was presented by our President to Hon. Mackenzie Bowell, Minister of Trade and Commerce, who, in in a personal interview, assured her that he would give the matter his careful consideration.

A medical outfit being required by Dr. Gifford, it was provided for her at a cost of \$265.03. One hundred dollars each were allowed to Dr. Gifford and Miss Brackbill for house-furnishings—instruments, permanent supplies and home furnishings to be the property of the Woman's Missionary Society. Authority was given these ladies to employ a teacher of Chinese at the expense of the Society.

LITERATURE AND PUBLICATIONS.

Miss Smith, of St. John, N.B., who was appointed editor of Our Quarterly, having declined to accept the appointment, Mrs. Bascom, Mission Band Corresponding Secretary of Central Branch, had in the intervening emergency prepared the first number. The preparation of the remaining numbers was referred to the Mission Band Cor

responding Secretaries of the Eastern, Western and Nova Scotia Branches respectively. A request from the Literature Committee for permission to issue a new life-membership certificate for Auxiliaries was referred to the Board meeting.

CANDIDATES.

1. The Executive of the Branch in which a missionary candidate resides shall designate the physician whose opinion shall be procured.

2. Missionaries on furlough shall procure certificate of health

before being permitted to return to their fields of labor.

3. The age at which candidates shall be eligible for appointment shall be twenty-five, instead of twenty-two, as formerly, discretionary power, however, being left with the Executive. It was recommended that hereafter candidates be required to pass an examination in Theology. Arrangements for the carrying out of this was left to Mrs. Burns, to be presented at this meeting.

Your committee was waited on by a deputation from the Methodist Young People's Union, who presented resolutions adopted by the Methodist Young People's Convention, expressing a desire for affiliation with the W.M.S. A committee was appointed to formulate a basis of union, but after consultation it was decided to leave the question in abeyance until the General Conference, as no legal affiliation could be effected without legislation from that body.

A recommendation from the Central Branch, "That during the meetings of the Board, morning sessions be devoted to business only,"

was approved.

Official correspondents for the *Outlook* were appointed, viz.: For French Work, Mrs. W. E. Ross; Coqualeetza Home, Miss Clarke;

Port Simpson, The Matron; Chinese Home, The Matron.

The Society is indebted to Miss Greene, of the Indian Home at Elkhorn, formerly a missionary in China, for a number of valuable Chinese articles—garments, photographs, paintings on silk, etc., which have been placed in "Room 20," Wesley Buildings.

An invitation to send representatives to the World's Woman's Congress, held in Chicago in May, was responded to by the appoint-

ment of the President and Corresponding Secretary.

The arrangements for the Woman's Missionary Conference in September, allowed each Society to send two members of the Executive Committee, and one delegate for every one hundred auxiliaries. In order to distribute the representation, each Branch was given the privilege of nominating one representative. Those appointed from the Executive were Mrs. Carman and Mrs. Willmott.

Some additional instructions to missionaries were authorized,

which will be found elsewhere.

Invitations for the annual meeting were received from the auxiliaries in Guelph and in Ottawa. The invitation from Ottawa was accepted.

The opening devotional exercises were conducted by the President. after which she gave her annual address, which was listened to with deep interest.

The report of the Executive Committee, read by the Secretary,

was discussed, amended and confirmed.

The report of the Corresponding Secretary was presented by Mrs.

Strachan, and adopted.

In the absence, through illness, of the Treasurer, Mrs. Thompson, her report was read by Mrs. Willmott, and adopted by a standing vote, after which the doxology was sung, and prayer was offered by Mrs. W. E. Ross. The following resolution was carried unanimously:

Resolved,—That we desire to convey to our absent Treasurer, Mrs. Thompson, our loving sympathy with her in her illness, which has

deprived us of her genial presence.

Satisfactory reports from the different departments of the Society's work were received and adopted.

On motion the following message was addressed to our missionaries:

We, the members of this Board, desire to express to our dear fellow-workers in the different fields our deep interest in all that concerns them; our anxious solicitude when hearing of debilitated health or over-taxed powers; our sympathy when long and patiently repeated sowing apparently yields no harvest; our rejoicing over the tidings of any soul turning to the Lord, or of the growth in Christian character of those under their care; and we desire to assure them that our prayers do ascend for them that they may be guided in perplexity, encouraged when disappointed, strengthened physically and spiritually, and that their work may be prospered. May each one realize that the Lord is to her "As the shadow of a great rock in a weary land," then can she, to some extent, become the same to other burdened, thirsty souls.

Instead of having the usual committees appointed, it was decided to do all the committee work, except that of the Candidates Committee, in a business session of the whole. The following memorials were presented—

- 2. That the publication of the Monthly Letter be discontinued. This was rejected by a standing vote.
- 3. That a committee be appointed to confer with the General Conference in view of asking for a monetary interest in the Outlook. Not carried.
- 4. That any memorial not entertained by the Branch meeting shall not be passed on to the Annual Board meeting. This was amended to read, Any memorial affecting the Branch only, and not entertained by the Branch meeting, shall not be forwarded to the annual meeting of the Board. Carried.
- 5. That the salary of a missionary returning home on furlough cease with the expiration of her term of service. Not carried.
- 6. That sums paid by gentlemen to auxiliaries be entered as donations, and not as membership fees, thereby avoiding the confusion of honorary and active members. Carried.

Also resolutions in relation to the liquor and opium traffic, which were referred for revision to a committee composed of Mrs. Carman, Mrs. G. Wright, and Mrs. G. P. McKay, and afterwards adopted as follows:

Resolved,—That we do record our solemn protest against the iniquitous methods used to raise the revenue for the Anglo-Indian Government by way of the opium and liquor traffics, believing that the ruling power that makes merchandise out of the vices of its subjects is below the level of a savage nation. And also we deeply deplore the opium traffic that was forced upon China by the British Government, the evil effects of which are so wide-spread they are proving one of the most serious hindrances to the progress of missionary work in that country. Further, we earnestly entreat the English Government to make the pending examination of Indian military authorities for violation of English law in their cantonment immoralities as searching as possible, and with consequences to offenders that may deter from such further crimes.

Resolved,—That the Secretary of this Board forward copies of the above resolution to the English Government, signed by the President, Vice-President, Recording and Corresponding Secretaries of the Board, in behalf of the 19,000 represented.

From the Mission Band Committee of Western Branch:

In view of the fact that Epworth Leagues and other Methodist young people's societies are, in their missionary committees, working along the same lines as Mission Circles and Bands, and in view of the further fact that a union of these societies might be in the interests of the cause of missions, your Committee recommends that the Board of Managers appoint a representative or representatives from each Branch to confer with a Committee of the General Conference. This was left to the Executive Committee to consider, and if thought advisable, to appoint such a committee.

Notice of motion given in 1891: That Mission Band Corresponding Secretaries be members of the Board of Managers, but not of the Executive Committee. Not carried.

Notice of motion in 1892: That Article V., Section 1, of Constitution be amended to include as a member of the Board of Managers ex officio the Secretary-Treasurer of the Literature and Publication Department. Carried.

Notice of motion in 1892: That Article II. of the Constitution be amended to read "women and girls," instead of "women and children." Not carried.

Memorial from British Columbia Branch in 1892, asking that as the Auxiliaries are so widely separated, the Branch be allowed to change the date of holding the annual meeting to correspond with the date of the British Columbia Conference. Carried.

From the same:

lst. Whereas, the people of Bella Bella and Upper Skeena are pleading for more light for their children, and are willing to give their land for a Home in Kitzegucla, in Upper Skeena, as well as assist in the building, we especially memorialize the Board to take into consideration the establishment of a Home at both these points. The Committee on Indian Work was requested to lay this case before the Committee of Consultation and Finance again.

2nd. That Gertrude San Kam be allowed to return to college, and that a grant of two dollars per week be given for her support. Carried.

Mrs. Strachan submitted a by-law adopted by the British Columbia Branch, providing for increased delegation to the Branch meeting. As this was not in harmony with the Constitution it could not be endorsed.

From Central Branch:

P.

1st. Asking that the names of Auxiliary members, excepting those of President and Corresponding Secretary, be omitted from the annual report. An amendment was carried, that this be left over for a year, and the question be brought before the Auxiliaries.

2nd. Recommending that the annual report be sold at ten cents, the cost price. Not carried. But Branches will be required to pay for the reports furnished to their organizers.

1st. Recommending that a more useful paper for Bands be substituted for Our Quarterly, and that it be issued monthly. It was decided by a standing vote that the Society adopt the Palm Branch as our Mission Band paper, and that it be issued monthly; also that the subscription price be ten cents, and that it be ordered from Room 20, Wesley Buildings.

2nd. Recommending that in cases where Auxiliaries present lifemembership, the names of the life-members be retained on the roll of the Auxiliary paying the fee; and in case of removal that such names be marked with an "R" in addition to the asterisk, but that these names be counted only in the Auxiliary to which they have been

transferred. This was not carried.

A request was presented, through the Japan Council, from the missionaries there who have entered on their second term of service and those now on furlough, that the resolution passed three years ago increasing their salaries in their second term, be rescinded, and that the salaries remain as formerly. The reason given for this request was that they could live on \$600, and could not find it in their hearts to accept any more, as there is so much need of more workers. The following resolution was carried: That this Board desires to express its appreciation of the self-sacrificing action of the Council in Japan in asking us to rescind the resolution passed at their request three years ago re salary for agents in their second or third terms, and that we hereby rescind said resolution.

The question of establishing a contingent fund was referred to the favorable consideration of the Executive, as was also a request received by the Council in Japan, and forwarded to the Board, to open

work in Nangano.

The report of the Literature and Publication Committee was presented by Mrs. McKay and adopted.

Statements and recommendations from the Committee led to the following resolutions:

That the resolution allowing an auxiliary a copy of the Monthly Letter free be rescinded. Carried.

That the Branch Secretaries write to the Auxiliaries not taking the Monthly Letter and urge them to subscribe for it. Carried.

That the August and September Letters be issued together. That the Committee issue another edition of "An appeal to the women of the Methodist Church" and that it be free. Carried.

That the Committee issue a new set of books for the use of Auxiliaries, leaving out the Corresponding Secretary's book, the proposed changes in the books to be submitted to the Executive before

being published. Carried.

That the Treasurer's tabulated statements be discontinued, and that in future the Treasurer's published reports be modelled after the Treasurer's report of the Central Branch of last year. Carried. Liberty was afterwards given those Branches desiring it to publish the tabulated form.

That the Committee issue an envelope for self-denial week, thank-

offerings and Easter-offerings.

Amendment,—That a separate envelope be prepared for each of Neither was carried.

That the order of business for monthly meetings be changed (see

order of business). / Carried.

That the prayer card be revised and submitted to the members of

the Executive in Toronto for approval. Carried.

The question of stationery with a printed heading for the use of the Society was referred to the Literature and Publication Committee.

A statement of the Literature Department was presented by Miss Ogden, and adopted. A standing vote of thanks was accorded to Miss Ogden for her faithful painstaking and onerous work in "Room 20."

In Mrs. Parker's absence, owing to illness in the family, her report of the Outlook was read by Mrs. Strachan. The following was carried unanimously: That, having received with great pleasure the excellent report of Mrs. Parker, editor of our department in the Outlook, we desire to express our appreciation of the efficient work done by her for us, and also our regret that we are deprived of her presence

at our annual meeting.

The Secretary read a report from Miss Lund of work done during furlough. Miss Lund had travelled over 3,600 miles, had spoken at fifty-four public and six Auxiliary meetings. Collections at these meetings amounted to \$609.49. It was moved and seconded, and carried by a standing vote, that we desire to express our sympathy with Miss Lund and to assure her that we shall hail with delight the time when her health is sufficiently established to permit her to return to Japan.

The Secretary was requested to send to Miss Morgan an expression of our sincere sympathy with her in her illness, and our

earnest hope that her health may soon be restored.

1. That the General Society assume entire charge of the Institute, and that our Board pay annually such proportion as may be agreed upon.

2. That the Principal be a practical Christian layman.

3. That we retain as our agents the three ladies now in the Home, and if in the rearrangement so many are not needed, we have the power to transfer them to another home.

A letter from Dr. Sutherland stated that the McDougall Orphanage greatly needed increased accommodation and furnishings. The six hundred dollars appropriated conditionally, is not this year required for maintenance, but should be used for equipment.

The report of the Committee on Indian Work was presented by Mrs. Burns. In regard to memorial from British Columbia Branch in 1892, the Committee ascertained that there is not at present any law by which compulsory education can be enforced. But amendments to the Indian Act are anticipated, which will meet the requirements. A grant of \$600 had been obtained from Government for the Port Simpson Home. The following resolution was carried unanimously:

Whereas, the Committee on Indian Work has done a great deal of faithful work, and gained much valuable information which will be of service to the Society; therefore,

Resolved,—That the thanks of the Board are due and are hereby presented to the said Committee, consisting of Mesdames Burns, Sutherland and Cunningham.

The question of obtaining a grant from the British Columbia Government for the Chinese Home was referred to the Committee on Indian Work.

The Committee on Missionary Candidates, viz., Mesdames Carman, Strachan, Burns, Cunningham, Fowler, Howard, Kendry, J. A. Williams, Campbell, Ryckman, T. G. Williams, Whiston and Miss Palmer, reported through Mrs. Burns. The Western, Central, Eastern and Nova Scotia Branches had no accepted candidates to present. New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island Branch had accepted Miss Alexander, of Stanhope, P.E.I. On motion Miss Alexander was accepted and placed on the reserved list. A communication from a lady in London was referred to the Western

Branch. The Corresponding Secretary was authorized to make an appeal through the *Outlook*, *Guardian* and *Wesleyan* for missionaries and trained nurses. Miss Leake's resignation was accepted.

Resolved,—That this Board requires of the candidates for our work that they pass a satisfactory examination in Biblical Study,

doctrines of the Methodist Church and our Catechism.

That in view of the fact that a training school for Christian workers is about to be established in connection with the Deaconess Home in Toronto, and realizing that a preliminary training would be extremely useful to those accepted as candidates for the work, be it

Resolved,—That each candidate be required to attend the Training Home such time as the Executive Committee shall specify, taking up the course required in Theology, and actively engaging in Christian work, as directed by the Superintendent of the school, the expense of such training to be borne by the Society when necessary.

Dr. Gifford having written to the President of the need of a native assistant, and that one was available, the President authorized her employment, and paid to the Treasurer the sum of \$50 for

that purpose.

Dr. Hart asked that Dr. Gifford might take charge of the female ward in the hospital.

He also stated that a small school had been opened, and he desires our co-operation.

Resolved,—That the Executive be empowered to act in regard to work in China, after receiving information from our missionaries.

The Executive Committee was authorized to send during the year two missionaries to Japan and another medical missionary and a trained nurse to China, and to provide for their salaries and travelling expenses; also, to supplement Miss Spence's salary by \$50, if necessary; also to consider, and if deemed advisable, to make such arrangements as will enable us to make the date of closing our financial year the same as the financial year of the Church.

A letter, enquiring if Victoria College would make the same offer as made by Kingston Medical College, last year, re education of mis-

sionary candidates, was referred to the Executive.

The need of perfect rest for our returned missionaries being impressed upon the Board, it was decided that they should work only under the direction of the Executive.

Regular meetings of the Executive Committee were fixed for the

third Wednesday in January and in April.

Resolved,—That in view of the approaching plebiscite, this Board expresses its sincere hope that all women who have the right to vote will make use of their privilege in endeavoring to stamp out the iniquitous liquor traffic.

Resolved,—That the local Auxiliaries entertaining the General Board be invited to assist in preparing the programme for the public meeting.

Dearly Beloved Sisters,—We are met for the important business of another Board meeting, and again to sing, "Blest be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian love." I believe we realize the responsibility resting on us on this occasion, and the need of that wisdom which is promised to all who ask in faith. In looking over the names of the Executive Committee, we are reminded that "one is not"—our dear sister Mrs. MacCoy, the President of the Nova Scotia Branch, having been taken from labor and suffering to rest during the year. She has gone "to be with Christ, which is far better." "Our loss is her gain." "We a little longer wait, but how little none can know."

This is a representative gathering from all the Branches, and I trust we have all come in the spirit of prayer and expectancy, so that we shall have the presence of the Master, and be taught of Him, and be able to say, "It is good for us to be here."

My visit to the Central Branch meeting convinced me that there is no diminution of interest there, and from what I have read from the others, the same may be said of them. For this we are thankful.

The general depression has affected many of the religious and philanthropic institutions throughout the country, but our women are still unwearied in their efforts to sustain the record of the past, not only in the matter of income, but also in the interest taken in the work. They provide and circulate missionary information, and thus enlist the sympathy and secure the co-operation of the women in the Church, in this important duty so plainly taught by our Lord, of carrying the Gospel into the uttermost parts of the earth.

I am pleased to find that our income is derived chiefly from membership fees, voluntary contributions, thankofferings, mite-boxes, and legacies, rather than from concerts, teas, etc., etc. These latter, under proper conditions, are useful for social purposes, but cannot be considered as reliable sources of income.

I expected to hear from the Vice-President and the Recording Secretary some interesting facts regarding the Congress of Missions which was held in Chicago recently, and I very much regret that indisposition prevented their being present at those meetings.

The visit of the Corresponding Secretary and myself to the Woman's Congress was a rare treat to us. I shall not soon forget the representative women I met through the kindness and courtesy of our American sisters, and I cannot speak too highly of the hospitality of the women, or of their ability in the management of such a large number of visitors. The platform was a broad one, admitting

women of every nationality and faith, and woman's interests were considered from every side. The elevation of woman, and, through her, the uplifting of humanity, was frequently dwelt on, nor were we permitted to forget that the interests of men and women are identical and inseparable, and the family the most sacred of all human relationships.

Our Dominion has been honored in having the Countess of Aberdeen elected President of the International Council of Women, which is likely to embrace, in the near future, all the associations of women

having for their object the general advancement of woman.

If this Council can help to bring before all Christian women a correct understanding of the disabilities of women and girls outside the pale of Christianity, so as to hasten the time of their emancipation from physical and spiritual bondage, it will serve a good purpose and deserve the support of every organization of women.

Whatever may be the result of that unique gathering, the World's Parliament of Religions, I hope that some good will accrue to the

women so long secluded and downtrodden.

The reports I have read lead me to hope that many truth-seekers were there, feeling after God, if haply they might find Him, and from some of the addresses I would infer that it is still true that God hath not left himself without a witness among any people.

With regard to the operations of our Society, the field has been

enlarged by having China added to our other foreign field.

The home work in the Dominion has been cared for, and may be said to be fairly prosperous, but of this we shall hear more in detail later.

From British Columbia comes the news of a greater interest in spiritual things, giving hope of a truer conception of the obligations pertaining to the profession of Christianity and what it implies.

From Japan we hear, "The harvest has come," and an invitation is extended to establish woman's work in Nagano; but the return of so many on furlough, and the resignations and illness of other members of the Japanese Mission leaves us short-handed, and how the need is to be met will be a question for this Board to answer.

In the past we have proved that "man's extremity is God's opportunity." He has commanded us to "pray the Lord of the harvest that He will send forth laborers into His harvest."

Difficulties and perplexities should be incentives to prayer and tests of faith, instead of excuses for discouragement.

Our pioneer women while detained at Shanghai met a great many missionaries, and learned much of the needs and habits of the people, and a little of the language. They are now slowly working their way into the interior, hoping to reach their destination about Christmas.

It is for this Board to consider the character of the work they wish them to undertake—not an easy task, with so little information to guide us.

Hospital and medical work awaits Dr. Retta Gifford. The medical missionary has a great advantage in China, and Dr. Gifford has made a request that a nurse be sent out, qualified to teach her profession to the native women.

A school must be thought of, evangelistic work arranged for, and a solid foundation laid. If any department appeals to us specially

for prayer, this does.

The prejudice against foreigners is not likely to be removed as long as Christian nations falsify the teachings of the Founder of Christianity. "I hope you will treat my countrymen as kindly as you have treated me," said the Secretary of the Chinese Legation at Washington, at the Parliament of Religions in Chicago, by way of a mild rebuke to the obnoxious legislation regarding the Chinese in the United States.

I met a lady who had been driven out of the province our agents are appointed to labor in. Let us remember them before the Lord.

Dear sisters. God has honored us in calling us to this work; it is great, for it is His work. It is His vineyard, and He has called the harvest His. We ourselves cannot perhaps go into the fields, but we can maintain and uphold those who go.

"He that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life

eternal."

TWELFTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY.

The statistical statement, with the important addition of the Treasurer's Report, give an idea of the state of the Society as far as it can be tabulated. They represent much quiet labor, prayerful thought, earnest conversation, carefully planned meetings, and attendance sometimes under difficulties; but would not each one who has made the slightest effort in this cause rejoice were she here to-day in the summing up of the year's work?

We cannot note the gain to individual character in the extended information, the enlarged sympathies, the greater power in prayer, the increased faith, and the growing willingness to let voice, pen, influence, time, and means be ready at all times for the Master's use. We did not think of these gains when beginning our work, but the promise with its condition is still verified, "Give, and it shall be given you."

Beyond the statistical summary it seems almost superfluous to submit a general report, as each department and each field of labor furnishes its

own statement.

The most marked feature of the year in our work has been the entering of a new field, that of West China. While we are here in comfort and security, our two pioneer missionaries, Miss Gifford, M.D., and Miss Brackbill, with representatives of the Missionary Society of our Church, are taking their somewhat perilous journey of 1,800 miles up, the Yang-tse to the city of Chen-tu, Province of Se-chuen, the scene of their future labors. The journey will not probably be completed much before Christmas.

During their stay in Shanghai for some months, waiting for a suitable opportunity to proceed, they have improved the time by studying the languige and visiting several schools and hospitals under the management of other denominations; this has been a good preparation for the work which may await them. They crave our prayers that they may be led in the right way, their steps guided, and the best plans pursued.

Dr. Gifford, in her medical work, required a native assistant. Providentially one was forthcoming just at the right time; one educated in the Methodist Episcopal Mission, and who, being a native of the Province of Se-chuen, was familiar with the dialect. Through the liberality of our President this helper was secured. Dr. Hart writes that a number of girls, already gathered in a school, can be handed over to us, so that plenty of work awaits our representatives.

JAPAN.

Our four stations in this empire continue to be faithfully worked up to the limit of strength and opportunity by a noble band of young women.

There have been several changes during the year. Miss Wintemute, after nearly six years' service in Japan and one at home on furlough, sent in her resignation, and has returned as the wife of Rev. H. H. Coates, one of the missionaries of our Church. Miss Cushing has also resigned and

Misses Munro and Preston, pretty thoroughly wearied after their five years' work, are at home on furlough.

· Through the considerateness of the Auxiliaries in the East during her stay in the home land, Miss Cunningham has returned to her loved field of labor rested and invigorated. Accompanying her was Miss Crombie, of Juvenile, N.B., who has just begun her life as a foreign missionary.

It has not been all sunshine during the year. Perplexities and discouragements have tested the faith and tried the patience, but steadily our missionaries have kept before them the object of their toil, not only the conversion of individuals, but the development and training of strong Christian womanhood. In this there has been gratifying success, some of the girls taking great delight in imparting what they have received to poor children whom they have gathered into day and Sunday Schools, twentytwo from our Azabu school every Sunday going out to teach; and another very commendable teature is that their sympathies are being drawn out beyond their own neighborhood and country, so that they have already of their own earnings sent a contribution to our work in China.

In Tokyo, Shizuoka and Kofu we have boarding schools with about 130 in attendance. In Kanazawa the new building for a day school was taken possession of last December and another district entered in March.

Twenty-six stations are occupied, some new Sunday Schools having been started this past year. Twenty-two baptisms are reported and others on trial. Industrial work has also been carried on with profit.

To all our workers is due the expression of appreciation which we feel, and especially the one on whom rests the chief burden, Mrs. Large. We cannot review the work of the year without recognizing that much is due, under the blessing of God, to her faithful and wise administration, as well as to the cheerful courage and patient labor under sometimes perilous

FRENCH WORK.

The report of this department is encouraging. The French Institute in Cote Ste. Antoine, Montreal, is proving well adapted to the need.

There has been a good attendance, the majority being girls, and they are proving apt and diligent students. What is most gratifying is that some of them are being developed into teachers and Christian workers.

Two Bible-women have been employed in the city, and, as in previous years, two schools in the country have been aided.

INDIAN WORK.

The two houses and schools at Port Simpson and at Chilliwhack, B.C., have been maintained, and encouraging word comes from them as to progress in study and in Christian character. In the former a very gracious revival of religion last winter affected the whole school, as well as the village, bringing almost all to repentance and faith in the Lord Jesus.

During the year Miss Sadie Hart, after five years of work and responsibility at this post, returned home, her place being supplied by Mrs. Redner, of Hastings, Ont. At Chilliwhack also ti ere has been a change of workers, Miss Elderkin having resigned and married. Miss Maggie Smith, of Maitland, N.S., has gone to this Home, where she is taking charge of the school. Miss Clarke, who has been so energetic and efficient, still attends to the Home department. Miss Burpee has been secured for the sewing, and with twenty-six boys and girls there is no lack of

After two years of cramped quarters there will be great rejoicing when possession is taken of our fine new building, now nearly completed.

In Dr. Bolton's hospital, at Port Simpson, the sick are still receiving the kind and efficient services of Miss Spence.

CHINESE WORK.

VICTORIA, B.C.

This Home, like so many of our fields, has changed its workers. Miss Leake having retired on furlough, her place has been filled by Mrs. Morrow, who has with motherly kindness cared for those entrusted to her. Miss Wickett, of Toronto, has taken charge of the school department, and has also found access to a number of women in Chinatown.

Considerable expense has been incurred in the endeavor to rescue other poor victims of cruelty and oppression, sometimes without success; but when evil men, to defend their wretched traffic willingly and freely spend money, surely the followers of Christ will not grudge what may be necessary to liberate those who are striving to escape from bondage. There are now twelve in residence.

METHODIST ORPHANAGE.

ST. JOHNS, NFLD.

The managers of this institution have appreciated the aid rendered by this Society, especially since suffering from the great losses occasioned

This covers the ground of our operations. The great need seems to be more workers, both foreign and native. Shall we not more earnestly "pray the Lord of the harvest that He will send forth more laborers into His harvest," and to put it into the hearts of our people at home to give liberally for the prosecution of His cause, at the same time acknowledging with grateful hearts His unbounded go dness in permitting us to have any share in such a work, and in blessing our imperfect efforts.

More than one of our Indian Missions last Christmas had the best and happiest gathering they had ever held, because of the gifts from our Woman's Missionary Society.

We have not time to tell of all the good done or the thanks received. Not until we reach Heaven shall we know what a blessing this Supply

Committee has been to hundreds of people.

About 120 Auxiliaries and Mission Bands have engaged in this labor of love during the year, and the aggregate value of the contributions has been nearly \$2,000. The Indian Department at Ottawa has refunded to Auxiliaries \$61.23, which they had paid on freight to Missions in the North-West. The Committee received in cash the sum of \$1950, which was used in the purchase of goods for our missionaries supplemented by valuable gifts of beautiful clothing. We regretted that for want of funds we were unable to do as much last Christmas in this way as had been possible the two previous years.

At one of the sessions of the Central Branch meeting, the Rev. W. F. Wilson presented to the Supply Committee a little red bag filled with coppers to the amount of \$6.58, which had been given to him by the crippled children in the Sick Children's Hospital; they wished the money to be spent for the benefit of some sick child. Kind-hearted friends sometimes give these little ones cents, coins, etc., and now freely, willingly out of their poverty, these sick ones laid their offerings at the Master's feet.

With confidence in the generosity of our Auxiliaries and Bands, we look forward with faith to the coming year, as one rich with blessings for

REPORTS FROM MISSIONS.

THE JAPAN WORK

The Sixth Annual Meeting of the Japan Council of the Woman's Missionary Society was held in Karuizawa, July 17th and 18th, 1893. The following members were present: Mrs. Large, Misses L. Hart, Hargrave, N. G. Hart, Blackmore, Robertson, Cartmell, Veazey and Alexander.

After the devotional exercises, led by Miss Hargrave, the minutes of the Council Executive Committee meetings held during the year were read; also instructions to missionaries received during the year from the Corresponding Secretary of the Woman's Missionary Society.

The reports from the various Branches of the work were read and

received as follows:

TOKYO BRANCH SCHOOL.

In reviewing the work of the past year our hearts are filled with thankfulness, and we say, "the harvest has come." Growth expresses the results of the year's work.

In the hearts of our girls the work has been deepened and intensified. Some who were content with half-hearted service and imperfect knowledge have come into the light and have become whole-hearted and active. Some who were last year receiving training are this year training others. Many are beginning to feel that praying and giving for the good of one's own country only, is neither self-denying nor Christian-like, and now frequently we hear fervent prayers for China. One-tenth of the earnings of the King's Daughters' Society is consecrated to the work of the Lord in that country, and our Wednesday meeting includes a monthly missionary meeting, in which all are much interested.

Our Sunday School work requires twenty-two workers from the school, and thus every Sunday an average of about 225 children, women and men receive instruction from our students. In March, at the request of these workers, a Sunday School Normal class was organized. It is increasing in interest and benefit as the workers develop. Our King's Daughters' school has an attendance of forty-five; sixty yen (about \$45) a year is required for running expenses. But the girls, by hard work and much self-denial, are able to raise this amount. In connection with this school, every Sunday evening a Mothers' Meeting is held, with an average attendance of ten women and thirty children.

Once a month, in our Literary Society, we have had addresses from outside people on subjects calculated to awaken an interest in and give a knowledge of the world at large.

Anyone coming into contact with the women of this land must be impressed with the emptiness of their lives and the works of supererogation done to fill time and thought, for they love to be busy. Christian work, in some measure, supplies the need, but we have greatly desired the girls to

For those who understood English, the difficulty was not so great, but for the great number who do not, the lack of Christian, or indeed of pure literature, in the Japanese language, was sadly felt. This year the number of suitable books has greatly increased, and we have added a number to our library; and now, for all students of the Academic classes, private reading is compulsory.

Our Industrial work reports a profit of over 125 yen (about \$90), besides a saving in school-servants' wages, and is arousing in the girls some thought of the dignity of labor and the honor of self-support. There have been four baptisms among the servants.

The greatest attendance during the year has been for May and June—seventy-seven. This is the highest number reached since December, 1891.

At Christmas, six students graduated. All of these are working either in their homes or in connection with the Woman's Missionary Society for the spread of Christ's kingdom.

Thirty students are being supported in the school, either by the Woman's Missionary Society, private contributions, or the earnings of the Industrial class.

This is the direct report of the year. The indirect carries us out into city and country, where, as daughters, sisters or wives, those who have gone out from us are laying the foundations of Christian Japan. Our hearts overflow when we hear of church work aided, women's meetings established, Sunday School classes organized and taught, mothers and fathers being led into the light by those who are our daughters in Christ.

Evangelistic.—We began work in September with five Bible-women. In November we secured a new worker, Mrs. Hasegawa, who was sent to work in Komagomi. In the spring Hasegawa and Inomata san were laid aside because of ill-health.

We opened a poor school in Shitaya in March. A gift of ten dollars from a young man in the home land, has covered all the expenses except the salary of the teacher, a graduate of the Methodist Episcopal school at Aoyama, Tokyo.

In February, work was opened in Koishikawa District. A little later we opened two Sunday Schools in the poor district in Azabu. Since early in March, Yoshida O Yu San, one of our own graduates, has given her afternoons to work in this district.

Two hundred and sixty-three meetings have been held on week-days during the year.

Miss Cartmell has had charge of the meetings in Azabu, Ushigomi, Kakigara-cho and Kobiki-cho; Miss L. Hart of those in Hongo, Shitaya, Negishi, Komagomi and Koishikawa.

Two Sunday afternoon meetings have been carried on since early in April by Kato Sentare and one of the girls of the school.

The attendance at the week-day meetings varied from three to thirty.

Visits made during the year, 2,479; of these, 223 have been to homes before unvisited. Thirteen have asked for baptism. We have marked during the year the regular attendance of the women at the meetings, the deeper interest taken; the pastors, too, have borne witness to this as having been a year when a closer relation has grown up between the foreign worker and the Japanese women than ever before.

SHIZUOKA BRANCH.

School.—During the year nearly closed, the names of thirty-four girls have been entered on the roll. Of these, two have been sent to Azabu school to continue their studies there. Three have graduated, and four have withdrawn for various reasons, mostly satisfactory. The number attending this term, twenty-five.

We are happy to report six baptisms during the year, one Japanese

teacher, four students, and one servant of our household.

Though we have to report a falling off from the attendance of last June, we are not discouraged. We feel that the spiritual life is developing and a good foundation being laid among the girls for future usefulness. Those who have left us to come back no more have carried the Gospel to their homes with them, and we have encouraging reports of faith clung to in the midst of opposition and many temptations.

Evangelistic.—The evangelistic work is steady. We have not much increase at the various meeting places to report, but those who attend are

regular and we feel their faith is strengthening.

Meetings are held weekly at Hirona and Ejiri alternately, conducted by Miss Hart and the Bible-woman; fortnightly at Shimada, by Miss Hart; three times a month at Jonakoshi, and monthly at Fujieda, where the Bible-woman also visits twice a month.

The Bible-woman goes monthly to Omiya for meeting and visiting. Faithful visiting is done among the families in Shizuoka and other places

where meetings are held.

During this term we began an afternoon meeting, held fortnightly in our house, for the women of Shizuoka, the chief object of which is definite study of the Gospel. We have four Sunday Schools under our control, in which the teaching is done mainly by the oldest girls trained in our school. The attendance at these fluctuates considerably, and for various reasons it is not as good as last year.

We have but one Bible-woman employed at present. After the fire

at Christmas, Mrs. Sato felt it necessary to withdraw from the work.

Total number of visits for the year, 912; new homes reached, 27; visits to seekers, 45; baptized as result of Bible-woman's work, 7 (there are still 4 on trial for baptism); meetings held from November to June, 117; average attendance at the four Sunday Schools, 85.

We hope in due time to see the results of our labors.

KOFU BRANCH.

School—The indifference with which Christianity and its work were viewed last year in this province has changed during the year into dislike and opposition. The Buddhists have been diligent in warning the people against the "greedy" foreigner, and against the religion which (they say) teaches disloyalty to the Emperor. But opposition is a better atmosphere than indifference, and our work has had a more healthful growth, and the prospects are in every way brighter than last year.

The number of pupils has increased from twenty to twenty-seven, and a steady growth of Christian character is evident. Of our twenty-two boarders eighteen are regular attendants at the class-meeting; they still need much careful training, but I believe they are all sincerely trying to follow Christ. This year has seen the beginning of our pupils doing regular outside Christian work. Since November all who are old enough have

been teaching in the Sunday Schools under Miss Preston's care, and thus giving out of what they have themselves received, has been a real means of grace. The three resident teachers, the matron and the school cook also assist in these schools.

There are twelve baptized Christians in the school, but these all come from Christian homes. Non-Christian parents, though they freely consent to their daughters helping in Christian work, will not permit them to be

baptized.

Evangelistic—This past year has been one of the happiest and most satisfactory yet vouchsafed us. While in certain of the country appointments we can report no improvement, on the whole the outlook is hopeful and inspiring. In Kofu there has been a steady, healthy growth, and the attendance at church on the part of both Christian and Non-Christian women is most encouraging. We report but a small number of baptisms this year, but we hope for a large ingathering next year, when we will be surer of each woman being established in the faith. Various causes bring us new inquirers—sometimes the husbands of the women wish them to become Christians. They believe that if they become so, they will be better women and more capable mothers, although they themselves find it inconvenient to believe.

A prosperous society among the churchwomen partially supports a student in our Girls' School, besides contributing occasionally to other objects, and they pay in regularly a third of their earnings to the church. The money contributed is supposed to be earned by self-denial or work in

some shape or form.

Through the year we have opened up five Sunday Schools, besides continuing to help in the Church Sunday School. Average attendance, twenty-seven. The teaching is largely supplied by the teachers and students of our school, and thus in this and in other ways the school and evangelistic work inter-act helpfully.

Country meetings have been held more or less frequently in nine places, and one trip was made to Gunnai, the far eastern part of the province.

Baptisms, 5; on trial, 2; besides some 15 or more who are interested

in the truth, or are really Christians, but not yet baptized.

Meetings held, 223; average attendance, 7; visits, 458. We have reason abundantly to utter the memory of His great goodness and to sing of His righteousness, for He has opened His hand and given us richly of His good treasure.

KANAZAWA BRANCH.

The year has been one of varied experiences, and we rejoice to report

it one of growth in all departments of the work.

The work in connection with the "charity schools" is encouraging. Our efforts have been honored of God and greatly appreciated by the parents. Still there are many who look upon us with suspicion and think we must have some "deep and secret meaning" to be so charitably disposed.

We have often felt our lack of wisdom in dealing with this poor class. They are indeed needy, their poverty is distressing and amazing, and forces them to sacrifice all opportunities for education. And they are such "shams" one has to be wise in one's givings. If they think they can get a penny they can don a pious face and a pious tongue on short notice, and to in any way bribe them to even listen to the story of the Cross would be a curse to them and to the cause, as has been proved.

They received them gratefully, I assure you. Clad in these old-new garments they attended school for two or three weeks, where we tried to "clothe" their minds also. One day they were missing. On inquiry we found the mothers had pawned the dresses for food, so they were again naked. The winter had more than set in, the weather was cold, but no word was to be found, and they had to perish with cold in order to have the little food for present need—no telling what the future would bring in the way of added misery.

Early in December we took possession of our new building; had a very successful and enjoyable opening. For the three previous and two succeeding months our average attendance was twenty. The building is two stories high; the downstairs room, which is used for a class-room and for the Monday evening service, will seat thirty-two pupils, and by removing the seats and spreading "goza" (straw matting) will accommodate over lifty at the evening service.

The upstairs room has "tatami" (straw mats) on the floor, and is used for the embroidery class and women's meetings. Behind are three rooms where the teacher lives. The lot, building, furnishings, including fence and well, cost yen 404.94 (almost \$300).

In January, February and March we met with very bitter and decided persecution from the Buddhists. They did everything possible to try to slose up our school. With increased trust, we are glad to be able to report that, though for two months there was a decided decrease in our attendance and considerable damage to our property, the Truth has withstood all their opposition and we now report our former average twenty-one.

In connection with this school we have industrial work—making handkerchiefs and envelopes. The children are remunerated for their work; for the latter they receive 7 sen a thousand.

In March we opened work in another poor district. Here during the day the children are employed in making match boxes, for which they are paid at the rate of 6 sen a thousand. In the evening they meet for classes. In both these schools we have Bible lessons twice a week, and Sunday Schools and preaching services once a week. We rejoice that it is our privilege to work among this class, but, as we go in and out among them and see their great need, we often "sow in tears," but, trusting in the Lord, we wish to continue knowing "duty and to-day are ours, results and futurity belong to God."

There has also been an industrial class organized with Mrs. Yamazaki, one of our Christian women, which promises to be the means of reaching a number. So far eight have entered. They are required to attend one women's meeting during the week, and to rest and attend church on Sunday, also to be at the Sunday School. They are paid so that they can afford to rest on the Lord's day.

Early in June our hearts were saddened when two of the girls (sisters, one sixteen, the other nineteen), who had attended this class from the first, came to inform us that their parents were in financial difficulty, and had decided to sell them into a life of shame. We did all we could in the way of teaching them the evil of such a life, and also offering financial help, but not being able to lay down the "purchase money"—190 yen—to use the father's words, "they must go." They had heard a good deal of the story of the Cross; may the Lord be merciful.

ers, rst, had way but the cory The work among the women has been carried on faithfully and perseveringly. But here, also, the opposition has been more open and violent this year than any experienced before. Many there are who wish to attend the meetings, but are prevented. Others have attended secretly, but, their whereabouts being suspected by their friends, they have often been sent for and called out of the meetings. Nevertheless, amid it all, we feel our influence is widening, and a few have been added to the regular attendants, proving it is useless for them to "kick against the pricks."

In March a meeting was opened especially for Non-Christians, with a hope that a number of the teachers and students from the Government schools would attend. For a time they did, but as soon as it was known they were coming persecution began, and, having "no root," they yielded, and consequently have absented themselves for the present.

We regret to report that some who were taken into the Church a year or more ago failed to show that they have any knowledge of a personal Saviour.

Many of our women are daily growing in the knowledge of His love, and give evidence of the fact that they are studying to make themselves workmen approved of God.

During the year 465 visits have been paid; 106 meetings held, with an average attendance of 10; applicants for baptism, 3.

The Treasurer then read the financial report, the total receipts for the year being yen 15,851.86; total expenditure, yen 15,532.73; cash on hand, yen 319.13. This report was accepted. The accepted report of the Stationing Committee is as follows:

The following questions were discussed and the appended resolutions passed:

OUR COUNCIL: IS IT AN ADVANTAGE TO THE WORK?

Resolved,—That whereas it has been proved by experience that our Mission Council has been an advantage to the work, we would regret any change in the plans of work that would lead to its abolishment.

WHERE AND WHEN SHALL OUR ANNUAL MEETING BE HELD?

The above was occasioned by a resolution to the Council of the Woman's Missionary Society, from the Council of the General Board, March 4th, clauses 3 and 4 of which were left to be considered at a time when "all" the members would be present—our annual meeting.

Resolved,—That whereas having carefully considered the proposal of the Council of the General Board, contained in clauses 3 and 4 of their communication of March 4th, to hold the annual meeting of the Japan Council of the Woman's Missionary Society at the same time and place as the annual Conference of the Methodist Church of Japan, and feeling that such a united meeting would be for the furtherance of the best interests of the common work in which we are engaged; therefore

Resolved, -That we endeavor to make such arrangements with the Boards of Managers of our country schools as will enable all our ladies to attend said conference, providing it be held in Tokyo during the first

week in July.

BIBLE-WOMEN'S SALARIES.

Resolved,-1st. That six yen be the maximum. 2nd. That jinrikisha expenses be paid where required, in going to and from work. 3rd. That in regard to house rent, length of service and ability, individual cases will have to be considered and decided upon by the Branches.

ESTABLISHMENT OF CHARITY SCHOOLS.

Resolved,—That having heard the reports of the schools established, we advise that such schools be established in all our Branches wherever practicable.

SUPPORTED STUDENTS IN OUR SCHOOLS, AND IS THE TEACHING OF ENGLISH TO SUCH ADVISABLE?

As our work broadens we meet with many girls earnestly desiring the advantages of education, but unable to defray the necessary expenses, who wish to be received into our schools as supported students; and as experience shows us that there is no more valuable work than that done by those trained in our schools, either in their own homes or as helpers in our work; therefore

Resolved, -1st. That wherever the case proves satisfactory the applicant be admitted into the school nearest her home, as a supported student. 2nd. That in cases where parents or guardians are able to bear any part of the expense, they shall be required to do so. 3rd. That considering it advisable to teach them to look upon all labor as honorable, as well as to give them an opportunity to help in meeting the expenses of their education, all supported students be required to assist in the domestic work of the school, such as cleaning of windows, lamps, floors, etc. 4th. As the discipline derived from coming in contact with foreign teachers in

the study of English, as well as the better literature which is opened up to them, tends to make our students better women, we deem it advisable to teach English to all students of a suitable age, who have proved satisfac-

tory after a three months' trial.

Once more we have been called to say farewell. Three of our number, Misses Morgan, Munro and Preston, are missing from our annual meeting, and while as a Council as well as personally, we cannot but regret the permanent severance of the pleasant associations of the past five years in the case of Miss Morgan, we trust that with Misses Munro and Preston it is "only for a season," and that with renewed health and vigor they will return to their work here after the year of needed rest in the home land. We desire to express our hearty appreciation of the faithful work of these ladies during their term of service here. We pray that God's richest blessings may rest upon them; that their presence may prove an inspiration to the Churches at home, and may help to strengthen the bond of unity between the home and foreign fields.

Resolved,—That owing to the nervous condition against which Miss Munro has had to contend during her residence in Japan, we respectfully request that no public work be required of her during her year in Canada.

Resolved,—That we, the members of the Japan Council of the Woman's Missionary Society, express our most hearty concurrence with the views expressed by Mrs. Large, Misses Munro and Preston, re salary for agent in their second and succeeding terms, and that we request the Board to rescind the action taken at our request, three years ago, and allow \$600 to be the maximum salary for Japan.

Miss L. Hart was re-appointed Recording Secretary for the year. The Japan Council of the Woman's Missionary Society send greetings to the members of the Woman's Missionary Society in Canada: "Truly our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ." Then

followed the hour of "prayer and praise," led by Miss Veazey.

The minutes of the last session were confirmed and the sixth annual meeting closed.

THE FRENCH WORK.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FRENCH WORK FOR 1892-93.

As we review the work of the past year our hearts are filled with thankfulness to God for the success which has attended the labors of our Bible women and teachers in our two schools. The seed has been sown with diligence, and surely we can leave results with Him who alone can give the increase.

Our West End school, held in La Salle Evangelique, De Lisle Street, has been taught by Miss Maynard to the best of her ability. Not having a thorough English education was a great drawback to her. As our former very efficient teacher, Miss Jackson, has been restored to health, we have re-engaged her, and recommended Miss Maynard to a course in the Institute.

Sixty-six pupils entered in September, but owing to sickness the average attendance has been only forty-six; of this number twenty-five are French-Canadians, eight Irish Catholics, and most of the others have one or other parent Catholic. All are learning both languages.

Miss Anderson, our Bible-woman, has done excellent work. In the morning she assists in the school, taking charge of the primary class, most of which is entirely new this year. In addition to their daily lessons, she tries to instil into their young hearts and minds many Bible truths, which we are sure will benefit them in after life. Every afternoon and Saturday she devotes to visiting the families, averaging 125 visits monthly, reading and praying with them, and also distributing tracts.

For some time past the work in the east end of the city has not been altogether satisfactory, owing, we think, principally to the fact that our Bible-woman did not work in harmony with the pastor of the church. This year, however, we open our work under an entirely new regime, having engaged as teacher Miss Matthieu, who worked for the French Missionary Society in the Rev. Mr. Beaudry's time. This reveals to us the encouraging fact that our converts are still holding fast to the Protestant faith.

As Bible-woman we have secured Madame Morin, a French lady, from the United States, who has been attending our French Institute for the past two years. Madame Morin and her husband were brought to Christ through the labors of the Rev. Mr. Benoit, who in turn learned the way of life from the Rev. Mr. Beaudry, so that she is, in a sense, the fruit of our labor in the past.

On the last Friday of the month we held a prayer-meeting and social tea. Quite a number of French ladies were present, and we hope to continue these meetings during the year. Madame Morin, who is the first thoroughly trained Bible-woman we have had, is anxious to organize a Mothers' Sewing Circle, where she can help them in cutting and sewing their garments, one of the ladies having kindly promised a sewing machine.

Altogether the outlook for the coming year is a very happy one, and we are hoping for grand results in this department of our work.

Number of pupils entered in the East End school in September, seventeen, but many others have promised to come.

Grants of \$50 each have been made during the year to the schools at St. Theodore and St. Faustin respectively.

FRENCH METHODIST INSTITUTE.

Our fourth year's work in the French Methodist Institute, Cote St. Antoine, came to a close on April 27th. As in preceding years, there are many encouraging and some discouraging things to chronicle. We are realizing more deeply with each session that it is the work of years, and not of a winter, to train and develop our mercurial French students into such earnest, persevering and practical Christians as will enable them to withstand the oft-times demoralizing influences of their home surroundings.

During the past session the number of students in attendance has been eighty-four, though, owing to this characteristic lack of patient continuance, the actual average has not been over sixty-five.

The girls have been, on the whole, much more reliable and persevering than the boys, and their number shows a steady increase, they having been quite in the minority when the two schools were amalgamated, and, during the last term, showing a majority of six. They were, with few

exceptions, earnest, pleasant pupils, ready and eager to do their utmost, and quite as cheerfully in regard to household duties as in the class-room. Madame Morin, our pupil teacher, who is this year acting as Bible-woman in connection with the French work in the east end of the city, was of great help to us in looking after the girls, while her happy, practical Christian life was a daily example to them.

Several girls are the objects of special prayer and help of Mission Bands or Sunday Schools, and we trust will be prepared to do good work in years to come.

A new departure was proposed by Mrs. Morton at the close of the last session, viz., the engaging of a tailoress to instruct our girls in this trade, and the experiment is, we hope, to be tried this winter.

It has often been said that we cannot make teachers or missionaries of all our pupils, and in thus widening the course of instruction, it is thought that many more may be enabled to make themselves useful at home, or to earn a comfortable livelihood elsewhere.

During the summer months a number of the girls have had situations as nurse-maids or mothers'-helps, and the unfailing testimonials we have received as to their tidy, useful ways, is most gratifying proof that the household training they receive whilst with us is quite as satisfactory as that of the school-room.

The class-work during the term has been conducted as in former years, most subjects being taught in both languages. A special course was given, as usual, in controversial doctrines, and a daily Bible study was conducted by the principal.

At the close of the session we were assisted in the written examinations by Mrs. Sawyer, formerly of the Normal School, Ottawa, the Revs. W. Groulx, of Sabrevois College, A. F. Rivard, Chas. E. Bland, B.D., and Prof. Patton of the Wesleyan Theological College. In most cases the results showed satisfactory progress. The drawing-class was again superintended by members of the Douglas Mission Band.

Sewing was taught by Madame Morin, and instruction in calisthenics given by the kindness of Mrs. Ames and Miss Hall.

The generosity of the Douglas Mission Band, as in past years, provided a Thanksgiving Social and Christmas Tree.

To many other kind friends we are indebted for most useful gifts of elothing, bedding, books, etc.

We have been mercifully preserved from epidemics or any serious illness throughout the session, and feel that we have deep cause for thankfulness to our heavenly Father for His continued care.

The time having come for the annual report, I recall the many mercies: of the past year with devout gratitude to our heavenly Father.

The case most requiring medical aid has been that of our bright little. Jessie, who, we feared, was not only going to lose the sight of one eye, but that the eye itself would have to be removed; but I am thankful that, although the sight is impaired, it has recovered. Dr. McKecknie most kindly gave her daily attendance for three or four weeks, and performed two operations. In the last he was assisted by Dr. Jones, and we looked to the Divine Healer, whose power is now not less than in the days of Hishumanity. Gertrude also had an operation performed on her eyelids by Drs. Hall and McKecknie, which was a great benefit to her sight. Some of the girls had slight attacks of influenza last winter, but we had no other serious illness.

It has been a year of contest with the iniquitous traffic in Chinese women and girls. One was rescued from the destroyer and brought to the Home two weeks after she arrived from China. Another was prevented from

erious hanklanding, and after being taken from port to port for some weeks was finally shipped back to China, thus helping to make the trade unprofitable to those engaged in it.

Another that we made a great effort to reach and hope to save is still in evil surroundings, but the time may soon come for her deliverance. The twelve persons named in the list are all now in the Home except Gertie, who is at present at New Westminster, but may return very soon. The woman Nun Yeo came voluntarily to escape the ill-usage of a first wife. She brought with her a bright little girl of about 6. I will give the circumstances more fully elsewhere. She seems very willing to learn and teachable. It is our hearts' desire and prayer that while they are here they may find the way of salvation, the peace of great price.

Our Friday afternoon prayer-meetings are now very well attended, and great interest appears to be taken in the scripture lesson by the married girls and a few others who have been in the habit of attending occasionally. No altogether new ones come. We have had as many as twenty-six Chinese women and children at one time. We trust that these meetings are times of spiritual help and refreshing.

Messrs. Hall and Ross still continue their generous donation of rice for the girls in the Home. Our thanks are due to them and the other friends who take an interest in "The Home" and manifest it by gifts and prayers.

The time has come for the annual report, and it is with a heart filled with gratitude that I attempt to prepare it. During the six months that I have been in the Home, my interest has been daily increasing in the work. At first it was rather discouraging, but as time passes and I become better acquainted with dispositions of the girls, I feel that surely the Lord has given me a great responsibility in the training of those precious sou's for whom He has given His life. May I be found worthy of His trust.

There have been four girls married from the Home during the year,

and one whose time was up left in July.

About this time there seemed to be an uneasiness among the people. Many of them were leaving for the fishing season, and wished to take their girls with them, as they generally earn good wages during the fishing. Those were girls that had only been in a short time. However, I think it has been for the best, as some of them were wielding a very bad influence over the others. Our Home has seemed so different since that we have cause to be very thankful, especially as we see quite a number of the girls putting their professions of faith to practical use, and I think they are improving in every way and are as happy as possible in the Home.

The summer has been very pleasant, and we have been enjoying the best of health. We have had no school for five weeks, but expect to begin again on Monday. It has been rather difficult to keep so many interested with so much spare time, and they seem very anxious to be in school

again. I am pleased with their anxiety in this respect.

Four other girls have sent application to get in the Home; two came to-day, but we have admitted none yet. One application was from a girl who left the Home over a year ago; she is very anxious to return. We will admit some of them soon.

Truly we feel that God is with us, and where He is, is fulness of joy.

Year Ending September 30th, 1893.

In taking a retrospective view of the work accomplished during the year just closed, we feel glad that the actual facts warrant our placing on record a good account of the pupils.

The year throughout has been characterized by a prevailing spirit of happy contentment; and, as happy children are usually good children, and good children do cheerfully what is required of them, satisfactory results are the natural outcome.

No serious sickness has entered our Home, and, at the end of the year, we find all the inmates in good health. Last year nineteen pupils were reported, and the appropriation made for that number. As a matter of fact, for a greater part of the time, that number has been exceeded, and at present there are twenty-six in residence. Owing to the kindness of friends who have sent clothing and goods, we have been able to provide comfortably for the increased number, and still have a small surplus.

A feature of our household arrangements is the prominent part the boys take in all duties connected therewith. We find them quite as efficient as the girls, and one boy, who aspires to become a finished cook, makes the greater part of the bread consumed in the establishment. Others of the boys and girls make bread occasionally, and it is quite interesting to note comparisons made by the different producers.

In the sewing department very satisfactory results have been attained. More work has been done this year than ever before. The girls have been clothed largely from second-hand garments, most of which had to be made over. Our pupils have been clothed neatly, comfortably, and economically. Considerable knitting has been done, and I think the most careful could have no reason to find the slightest fault as to the degree and extent of patching and darning, which is done almost entirely by the smaller girls.

The school work has gone on steadily, and though good progress has been made, still I know that better results might have been reached had fewer duties, outside the school, devolved upon the teacher.

Three of the girls have received instruction in instrumental music, and have made considerable progress. We are all taking singing lessons, in the tonic-sol-fa, from Mr. Tate. We find the study of this system so interesting the hour devoted to it, three times a week, passes before we are at all ready to stop.

With the aid of some hired help, the boys have brought the Woman's Missionary Society's property under thorough cultivation, and as a consequence, the land has produced abundantly. There is about an acre in potatoes, half an acre in hay, and the balance in vegetables.

We began the year with a staff of two teachers, Miss Elderkin and myself; Miss Somers having retired at the close of the previous year, after about three years in conscientious work in the sewing department. Miss Elderkin took her place and continued in charge until her marriage, July 5th, when Miss Burpee, of Woodstock, N.B., assumed the duties of sewing teacher. We hailed with delight the arrival of Miss Smith, from Maitland, N.S., the first week in September. She takes the school, while I have charge of the house-keeping.

No special revival has come to us, still we have seen evidences of renewed hearts in the consistent lives of many of the children. We endeavor in the daily teachings, in the Sabbath School, and in the prayer

and class-meetings, to teach Christ through His word; and we know that heavenly influences are reaching hearts and moulding lives into harmony with the divine will and purpose.

Much interest has centred in the new institute building, and as it has grown under the hands of the workmen, we have looked it over many times and would gladly have hastened its completion, had it been in our power to do so. However, we are still here in the mission house, and are content with our cramped accommodations, in prospect of the splendid new quarters in preparation for us. The equipments, when complete, will, I believe, be all that could be desired. With proper management, great good to the Indian race shall be accomplished through the agency of this school. May the Lord grant us prosperity in the future, as in the past, only more abundantly.

WESTERN BRANCH.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT, 1892-93.

In presenting the eleventh annual report of our Branch, we are thankful that, notwithstanding the hard times of which we hear so much, we are able to report an advance in every department of our work. We still have to regret that there are so many ladies in all our congregations who have not as yet identified themselves with this work, and so many of our churches still unorganized. With many of these, "so much to do at home" has kept them from hearing the Lord's call to them, "Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature." Our organizers are working on with much to encourage them. As a result of their efforts and also that of our ministers, twenty-two Auxiliaries and eight Mission Bands The Auxiliaries are: Alma, Arthur, Brantford have been organized. (Sydenham Street), Bartonville, Baker's, Blenheim, Burgessville, Caledonia, Currie's Crossing, DeCewsville, Delaware Township, Dundalk, Fergus, Forest, Grovesend, Kippen, Lambeth, Melbourne, Markdale, Shedden, Wolverton and Woodhouse. Besides these, some have organized lately, ready for next year, viz. : Bright, Flesherton, Grand Valley, Hensal, Oil City, Staffordville, Princeton and Woodslee. We are sorry to report some as having dropped out through the year: Eramosa, Erin, Ebenezer Appointment, Lynville, Nelson, Southampton and Thorndale. Kintore and Port Rowan, are working as Scattered Helpers. Mitchell (Trafalgar Street), Mount Vernon, Norwich, Simcoe, Tilsonburg, Verschoyle and Woodstock have organized Circles, and St. Mary's a Mission Band, during the year. The following have been organized lately, ready for work next year : Aylmer, Arva, Cainsville, Cayuga Band, Christie, London West, Mount Forest, Macville, Owen Sound, Owen Sound Band and Walkerton.

We report 159 Auxiliaries, increase 14; Mission Bands 50; annual members 3,700, increase 200; life-members 223, increase 24; total membership 3,923, increase 224; Mission Band members 1,731, increase 6; amount raised by Bands \$2,153.94, increase \$74.81; amount received by Branch Treasurers from all sources \$10,465.58, increase \$425.58; amount sent General Treasurer \$10,284.16, increase \$484.16. In addition to this, \$100 bequest from Miss Code's executors, Listowel, makes \$10,384.16 as the total received by the General Treasurer from the Western Branch for the year.

ELEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE WESTERN BRANCH.

Resolved, "That this Branch meeting recommends each Auxiliary in the Niagara Conference to make arrangements for Woman's Missionary Day as early in the year as will be agreeable to all concerned, especially as. towards the end of the Conference year other funds are needing attention."

A short address was given by Mrs. Dickson, of London, on "Our" French Work, the Difficulty and Discouragement of the Workers, and the Incentives to Continue."

From the Mission Band Committee:

1. Your Committee recommend that a member of each Mission Band, be appointed to work up an interest in and circulate Our Quarterly. also recommend that where there is no delegate from Mission Band or Circle, that the delegate from the Auxiliary be asked to notify the Mission, Band or Circle of this and other recommendations. - Carried.

2. In order to make an effort to scatter missionary literature, your Committee would recommend that the Mission Band Corresponding Secretary be requested to write to the Corresponding Secretary of Mission Band or Circle where next Branch meeting is to be held, authorizing her to purchase missionary literature, and charge the same to Branch meeting, so that she may acquaint herself with it, and thus be able to more intelligently. meet the needs of the various Mission Bands and Circles represented by delegates.—Carried.

From the Committee of Organizers:

1. Your Committee recommend that District Organizers presenting. themselves at the annual meeting of the Branch shall be entitled to the privileges of the convention and also to a billet.

2. Your Committee recommend the advisability of the District Organizers reporting half-yearly to the Conference Organizers, thereby keeping each other in close touch and communication.

3. Your Committee recommend that Organizers appoint some one lady on the unorganized circuits to distribute the Scattered Helpers and miteboxes, and that they use their influence with the Auxiliaries now organized

REPORT OF MISSION BAND CORRESPONDING SECRETARY, CENTRAL BRANCH.

In presenting the report of another year of Mission Band work in this Branch, we realize that much of the success of the year's work is due to the faithful labors of the organizers. They have pressed the formation of new Bands and the continuance of discouraged ones.

We report this year the formation of eighteen new Bands as follows: A Juvenile Band in Barrie, Bands in Bracebridge, Cannington, Cherrywood, Cobourg, (re-organized), Glen Orchard, Hampton, Huntsville Circuit, Keene, Newburgh, Newmarket, Moira, Ravenscliffe, Euclid Avenue (Toronto), Parkdale (Toronto), Unionville, Utterson, and in a Mission Church on Kingston Road; Bands in Marmora, Springbrook and Parry Sound have dropped from our list; also Sherbourne Street, Toronto, the Circle of which decided to leave our Woman's Missionary Society and become a Christian Endeavor Society. Having, however, sent our Treasurer an offering of \$125.00, we feel that they have not altogether forgotten us.

Deducting our losses and adding our gains, our report is as follows: 74 Bands; 1,923 members, including 56 life-members; and \$1,546.40 sent to the Treasurer.

The decrease in membership and fees is owing to the fact that only those paying twenty-five cents are counted as members this year (according to Constitution). Last year all names sent in were counted.

The falling off in receipts is no doubt owing to the fact that too often our young people forget that they are working under the Constitution of the Woman's Missionary Society, and when they are eloquently appealed to in behalf of some special object, their sympathies are drawn out, and without stopping to reason why, or to ask "Is this constitutional," they apportion ten or fifteen dollars, and the balance goes to the Woman's Missionary Society.

This is not quite fair to our General Board of Managers, who are depending on us for the maintenance of missionaries already in the field, and who know where our funds can best be applied to produce most good. We wish our Circles to remember this when appealed to either by voice or through the President.

BRITISH COLUMBIA BRANCH.

SECOND ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BRITISH COLUMBIA BRANCH, 1892-93.

The second annual meeting of this Branch was held in the Central Methodist Church, New Westminster, August 26th, 27th, and 28th, 1893. Mrs. (Rev.) C. Watson, President, occupied the chair. The reports of the various Auxiliaries with the exception of two, were read and adopted, several of them being very encouraging. The President, in her annual address, which was stimulating and helpful, showed with great force how the work was being carried on in the different mission fields. Miss Clarke, of the Coqualeetza Home at Chilliwhack, gave an interesting account of the work of the past year, reporting great improvement in the children. The public meeting held on Saturday evening was presided over by Rev. J. W. Hall, pastor of the church. Mrs. Pearson gave a most cordial address of welcome, which was responded to by Mrs. Nicolls. Mrs. J. Cunningham presented the report, in which the membership was announced as 235, of which 9 are life-members. Number of Auxiliaries, 12; amount raised, \$615.50; or \$2.68 per member. Mr. Cassidy, in Japanese costume, and Miss Cunningham gave addresses full of most interesting information on the work in Japan, while Dr. Hare, who was on his way as medical missionary to Chen-tu, in the far west of China, claimed our prayers and sympathy in his new and untried field of labor. The singing was appropriate and hearty, and the heart-stirring solo of Mrs. Robson was enjoyed by all. The cordial hospitality of the friends at New Westminster received a warm vote of thanks.

The presence at the convention of so many missionaries who were returning to their work, added greatly to the interest of the occasion. It was felt that such earnest addresses as were given by our faithful workers would lead us all to work and pray more for the great cause of Missions during the coming year.

2. They recommend that, where practicable, missionary "At-Homes" be held, the entertainment to be of a decidedly missionary character, and that it be understood that money is not so much the object of these gatherings as to quicken interest in mission work.

3. They also recommend that each Auxiliary, by its President or Corresponding Secretary, confer with the pastors of their respective churches, and ask that one of the ordinary prayer-meetings once a month be made a missionary prayer-meeting.

The Financial Report was submitted by Mrs. Wilson. This showed a net income of \$615.50, an increase of \$56.54 over last year.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Woman's Missionary Society

OF

THE METHODIST CHURCH.

ART. I.—NAME.

This Association shall be called "The Woman's Missionary Society of the Methodist Church."

ART. II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Society shall be to engage the efforts of Christian women in the evangelization of heathen women and children; to aid in sustaining female missionaries and teachers, or other special laborers in connection with mission work, in foreign and home fields; and to raise funds for the work of the Society.

ART. III.—MEMBERSHIP.

The payment of one dollar annually, either at one time or in instalments, shall constitute membership; and twenty-five dollars given by one person at one time, or in instalments during the year, shall constitute a Life-membership.

ART. IV.—ORGANIZATION.

The organization of this Society shall consist of a Board of Managers, co-ordinate Branches, Auxiliary Societies and Mission Bands, to be constituted and limited as laid down in subsequent articles.

ART. V.—BOARD OF MANAGERS.

Section 1.—The management and general administration of the affairs of the Society shall be vested in a Board of Managers, consisting of the Officers of the Society, the Corresponding Secretary of each Branch, the Editor of department in *Outlook*, Secretary-Treasurer of the Literature and Publication Department, and delegates from each Branch in the proportion of one to every four hundred members, or major fraction thereof, which delegates, together with two alternates, shall be elected at the Branch Annual Meetings, said meetings to be held within two months before the meeting of the Board of Managers, except in the case of the British Columbia Branch, which may hold its annual meeting during the session of the British Col-

SEC. 2.—The Officers of the Board of Managers shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting of the Board, and also the President of each Branch, who is by virtue of her office a Vice-President of the Board of Managers. Any vacancies occurring during the year shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

Sec. 3.—The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Managers and its Executive Committee; she shall sign all drafts and orders on the Treasurer, authorized by the Board of Managers and its Executive Committee; she shall call special meetings of the Executive Committee at the request of three of its members, of which not less than ten days' notice shall be given, except in cases of emergency. She is ex officio a member of all standing committees. Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in the absence of that officer. The Recording Secretary shall notify all meetings of the Board, and its Executive Committee, and shall keep a full record of the -proceedings. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society with our missionaries and the different Branches; she shall prepare the monthly letters for publication, and the report of the work during the year for presentation to the Annual Meeting. The Treasurer shall receive all contributions to the Society, keeping proper books of account, and shall make such disposition of the funds as the Board of Managers and its Executive Committee may direct, each order of the Board and its Executive Committee being duly signed by the President of the Society; and she shall present an audited statement to the Annual Meeting of the Board of Managers.

Sec. 4.—To transact business during the year, the Officers of the Board of Managers, with the Corresponding Secretary of each Branch, shall ex officio form an Executive Committee, seven of whom shall form a quorum.

SEC. 5.—The duties of the Board of Managers shall be: (1) To take into consideration the interests and demands of the entire work of the Society, as presented in the reports of the Branch Corresponding Secretaries, the reports of the agents employed by the Society, and the estimates of the needs of mission fields; to ascertain the financial condition of the Society, to appropriate its funds, to devise the means for the carrying forward of the work to be undertaken by each; suggesting the amount to be raised, employing suitable missionaries, as the work may require, and designating their fields of labor. (2) To appoint a committee to arrange for the publication of an Annual Report of the work of the Society. (3) To transact any other business that the interests of the Society may demand, provided all the plans and the directions of the Board shall be in harmony with the provisions of the Constitution.

ART. VI.—BRANCHES.

Section 1.—Branches may be organized according to Conferences. This plan, however, may be changed by an affirmative vote of three-fourths of the Board of Managers present at any Annual Meeting of the same.

SEC. 2.—The officers of each Branch of the Society shall consist of a President, three or more Vice-Presidents, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Mission Band Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and an Auditor, who shall be elected at the Branch Annual Meeting, and shall continue in office till others are elected. These, with the exception of Auditor, shall constitute an executive committee for the administration of the affairs of the Branch, five of whom shall be a quorum.

Sec. 3.—The President or one of the Vice-Presidents shall preside at all meetings of the Branch and of its Executive Committee. shall sign all drafts upon the treasury before they are paid. Recording Secretary shall notify all the meetings of the Branch, and of its Executive Committee, and shall keep a full record of the proceedings. The Corresponding Secretary shall, under the direction of the Executive Committee, conduct any official correspondence with the other Branches, with its Auxiliaries, hereinafter mentioned, and with the Secretary of the Board of Managers, and shall endeavor, by all practicable means, to form Auxiliary Societies within the prescribed territory of the Branch. It shall also be her duty to prepare for the Annual Meeting of the Board of Managers a report of the work of the Branch during the year, for publication in their Annual Report. The Treasurer shall receive all contributions to the Branch, keeping proper books of account, and shall forward the money quarterly to the Treasurer of the Board of Managers.

Sec. 4.—The Executive Committee shall meet at the call of the President and Secretary as often as may be necessary, to transact any business that may arise between the annual sessions of the Board.

SEC. 5.—No Branch shall project new work, or undertake the support of new missionaries, except by the direction or with the approval of the Board of Managers.

Sec. 6.—Each Branch may make its own by-laws, regulating its own meetings and those of its Executive Committee, also any others which may be deemed necessary to its efficiency, not inconsistent with this Constitution.

ART. VII.—AUXILIARY SOCIETIES.

Any number of women contributing at least one dollar each annually may form a Society auxiliary to that Branch of the Woman's Missionary Society within whose prescribed limits they may reside, by appointing a President, one or more Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer, who together shall constitute a local Executive Committee.

ART. VIII.—RELATION TO THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY.

Section 1.—This Society shall work in harmony with the authorities of the Missionary Society of the Methodist Church, and be subject to their approval, in the employment and remuneration of missionaries or other agents, the designation of fields of labor, and in the general plans and designs of the work.

SEC. 2.—All missionaries or other agents supported or aided by this Society shall be approved, before appointment, by the constituted authorities of the Methodist Church, and shall be subject to the same rules and regulations as other missionaries or agents of the said

Church.

ART. IX.—CHANGE OF CONSTITUTION.

This Constitution may be changed at any Annual Meeting of the Board of Managers by a two-thirds vote of each Branch delegation, notice of such amendment having been given to each Branch before its Annual Meeting; but Art. VIII. shall not be changed, except with the concurrence of the General Board of Missions of the Methodist Church.

By-Laws.

1. The Corresponding Secretary of each Branch shall be required to furnish in her report, in schedule form, to the Annual Meeting of the Board of Managers, the following items:—

- 3. The General Treasurer shall publish each quarter, in the Outlook, the moneys received by her.
- 4. Certificates of Membership may be granted to members of any Auxiliary who may be changing their place of residence, which shall constitute them members of the Auxiliary in the place to which they remove.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the Editor of the Woman's Missionary Society Department of the *Outlook* to publish articles relating to our own work; and also to select and publish items of interest concerning the work and modes of working of the Woman's Missionary Societies of other denominations.
- 6. All solicitations for funds for Special objects, excepting those legitimately belonging to the Supply Committee, before being introduced to the notice of our members, through any agency of this Society, shall be referred to and receive the approval of the proper authorities, namely, this Board or its Executive.
- 7. Any Branch may arrange for representation, by proxy, from the Branch within whose limits the Annual Meeting of the Board of Managers may, from time to time, be held.

8. All memorials and resolutions forwarded to the Board of Managers of this Society shall be officially signed and dated.

9. Relating to Japan.—If any money be not required for the object for which it was appropriated, it may be used for any other purpose which the Council may recommend and the Executive approve; and any surplus funds from native sources may be used under the direction of the Council.

RESOLUTIONS PASSED AT ANNUAL MEETINGS.

1883. Resolved,—That all expenses of the Annual Meetings of the Board, and of meetings of the Executive, including travelling expenses, shall be paid from the General Fund.

1884. Resolved,—That printed (or prepared) forms be issued by the General Board to all homes, refuges, schools, etc., supported by the Woman's Missionary Society, in order that proper returns may be made of the number, names, days' stay, age, sex, etc., of inmates, sources of income, and expenditure of the same, in detail, so that the cost of such institutions may be ascertained in order to have a basis on which grants may be made from the aforesaid Society to support such institutions, and that such reports be sent to the Corresponding Secretary of the General Board not later than the 1st of September each year.

CONSTITUTION FOR AN AUXILIARY.

ART. I.—NAME.

ART. II.—OBJECT.

Its object shall be to aid the Woman's Missionary Society of the Methodist Church in its work of engaging the efforts of Christian women in the evangelization of heathen women and children; to assist in sustaining female missionaries and teachers, or other special laborers, in foreign or home fields; and to raise funds for the work of this Society.

ART. III.—MEMBERSHIP.

Any person paying annually the sum of One Dollar, at one time or in instalments, to the funds of this Society, shall be deemed a member, and as such shall be entitled to be present at the Annual Meeting of the Society, and vote at the election of Officers. Twenty-five Dollars given by one person at one time, or in instalments during the year, shall constitute a Life-membership.

ART. IV.—OFFICERS.

The Officers shall consist of a President, one or more Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer, to be elected from among the members, at the Annual Meeting.

ART. V.—COMMITTEE.

A Committee of —— ladies shall be appointed annually, who, with the Officers, shall constitute an Executive Committee, who shall conduct the affairs of the Auxiliary during the year.

ART. VI.—ANNUAL MEETING.

An Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of September, at which the reports of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be presented, an abstract of which is to be forwarded immediately to the Secretary of that Branch of the Woman's Missionary Society to which the Auxiliary belongs; Officers, Auditor and Committee elected for the ensuing year, and such services held as may tend to promote the objects of the Society.

ART. VII.—FUNDS.

The funds of this Society shall be derived from membership fees, the proceeds of missionary socials, sewing circles, or the like, and from voluntary donations by friends.

ART. VIII.—APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS.

After meeting necessary local expenses, the funds raised by the Auxiliary shall be transmitted quarterly to the Branch Treasurer, to be applied to the support of such part of the work as the Central Board of Management may indicate.

Note.—Any Auxiliary having a preference for any special department of the work is at liberty to designate it.

By-Laws for Auxiliaries.

1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all the meetings of the Society, and to supervise its general interests. She shall call special meetings upon the request of three members, and shall be ex officio a member of all standing committees. She shall sign all drafts upon the treasury before they are paid.

2. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Presidents to perform the duties of the President in the absence of that officer, and to aid in devising means for the efficiency of the Society.

3. The Recording Secretary shall keep a fair record of the proceedings at all meetings of the Society or Committee, and give proper notice of all special and stated meetings.

4. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to report quarterly to the Corresponding Secretary of the Branch the amount sent to the Branch Treasurer for the quarter, and any other items indicating the state of the Society. She shall, in connection with the Recording Secretary, prepare the Annual Report.

- 5. The Treasurer shall receive, hold and keep an account of all money given to the Auxiliary, and shall transmit the same quarterly to the Branch Treasurer, not later than the 20th of the month.
- 6. Meetings of the Society for prayer and business shall be held—of each month. Once a quarter, if practicable, a public meeting shall be held, in which reports shall be read, addresses given, and every effort made to increase general missionary intelligence and zeal, as well as earnestness in the special work of the Society.
- 7. There shall be a Standing Committee of three or more to provide literary exercises of a missionary character for monthly and quarterly meetings, one of whom shall drop out each month, and another be elected to take her place.
- 8. If an office becomes vacant by death, resignation, or removal, it must be filled by the appointment of the Executive Committee, until the next Annual Meeting.
- 9. Each lady connected with this Society shall try to induce others to become members, and shall do what she can to add to the general interest, remembering in prayer daily the Society, its workers, missionaries, orphans, or other special interest.
- 10. At the Annual Meeting of each Auxiliary in September, or such other meeting as may be most convenient, delegates to the Branch Annual Meeting shall be elected in the proportion of one for every Auxiliary numbering under fifty, and two for every Auxiliary numbering fifty or more.
- 11. A lady shall be appointed in each Auxiliary to obtain subscribers for the *Outlook*.
- 12. Membership fees must be forwarded in full to the Branch Treasurer. Local expenses must be met out of other funds.

MISSION BANDS.

1. An Association of young people, banded together to aid the Woman's Missionary Society of the Methodist Church, shall be called a Mission Band Auxiliary to the Missionary Society of the Church in which it is found, or to the Branch in whose territory it is.

2. The object of Mission Bands shall be, primarily, to develop a missionary spirit, and secondarily, to raise funds to send the Gospel to the heathen.

3. Anyone may become a member of the Mission Band by the annual payment of twenty-five cents, and may become a life-member thereof by the payment of five dollars.

4. The Officers of a Mission Band shall be President, Vice-President, Recording and Corresponding Secretaries and Treasurer, and a Committee to arrange the best methods of work; these and an Auditor shall be elected annually.

5. The duty of the President shall be to preside at all stated meetings, and to have a general oversight of the work of the Band.

6. The duty of the Secretary shall be to keep a record of the proceedings of the Band, and make an annual report to the Missionary Society to which it is Auxiliary, or to the Branch in whose bounds it is.

7. The Treasurer shall receive and hold all funds, paying the same annually to the Treasurer of the Auxiliary or the Branch in which the Band is formed.

8. Each Mission Band must select an appropriate name not already in use, and report the same to the Society to which its money is sent.

9. Any Mission Band numbering forty members or over shall be entitled to send one delegate to the Branch Annual Meeting, but she shall not be eligible to any office in the Branch, or election to the Board of Managers, except she be a member of an Auxiliary.

REQUIREMENTS OF MISSIONARY CANDIDATES.

1. A missionary candidate must believe herself divinely called to the work of a foreign missionary, and assert her belief that she is actuated only by a desire to work in accordance with God's will.

2. She must here indicate her ability to work in a foreign field by Christian usefulness at home.

She must declare her intention to make foreign missionary work the service of her effective years, and agree to give at least five of these years of continuous service, as a single woman, to the work of the Woman's Missionary Society, unless prevented by ill-health; she must also assert her willingness to labor in any field, though her preference is always to be taken into account.

4. She must furnish satisfactory testimonials in regard to scholarship, and we regard some experience in teaching and a knowledge of

medicine and nursing as desirable qualifications.

5. The age of a candidate must not be less than twenty-two years, nor more than thirty. A thorough intellectual training, with a facility in acquiring languages, and a remarkable ability for Christian work, may be considered as a sufficient reason for deviation from this rule.

6. Financial and executive ability, and power of adaptation to circumstances are essential qualifications.

7. She must present a certificate of health from a competent physician, and give satisfactory answers to medical questions.

8. Resolved,—That every missionary candidate be required to sign the following contract:—

1st. I, ——, agree to conform to the above requirements and conditions while in the employ of the Woman's Missionary Society, and failing in this, to refund the amount of outfit and passage money.

2nd. After the adoption of a missionary candidate, she shall be regarded as under the direction of the General Executive Committee.

9. That missionary candidates be recommended by the Branch in which they reside, before their testimonials are considered by the General Executive, that there must be a personal interview with at least two members of the Executive before final acceptance.

INSTRUCTIONS TO MISSIONARIES.

They shall incur no expense during the year to be met by this Society for which estimates have not previously been submitted to, and approved by, the Board of Managers at its Annual Meeting, or by its Executive Committee.

They shall credit to the Society all donations received for the support of their work, and annually report the same with their financial statement.

All solicitations for funds for special work must be made through the proper official authorities, and missionaries are requested not to apply to private sources for aid for support of their work.

A medical missionary shall keep an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements. Such receipts may be used for necessary expenses in the medical work, and any surplus shall be credited to the Woman's Missionary Society, and her medical outfit shall be the property of the same.

We recommend that, when practicable, such arrangements shall be made for the duties of our missionaries, during their first year's service, as shall allow them considerable time for the study of the language, and that during the first year of service, their salaries shall be two-thirds of the fixed salary. But medical missionaries shall from the first receive full salary.

Our missionaries to foreign fields shall be allowed one hundred dollars (\$100), for personal outfit, and \$100 for house furnishings, when necessary—the latter to be the property of the W. M. S.

If there prove manifest unfitness for missionary labor, the Board of Managers may cancel its obligations to a missionary whom it has appointed—three months' notice having been given to such appointee by the Board or its Executive; return expenses to be paid by the Society, provided she return at the expiration of the three months.

In case of ill-health demanding her immediate return, she shall bring a certificate of disability from a physician and the lady missionary in charge, and she shall be entitled to one-half salary for the year.

GIVE and Bequeath to the Woman's Missionary Society of THE METHODIST CHURCH, the sum of dollars out of my pure personalty, to be paid, expended, and applied by the said Society for the benefit of the Missionary Fund of the said Society, and the support of the different Mission Stations of the said Society, or any of them, or for the aid and support of the [fill in the name of the Mission for which preference is had for instance, the Japan Mission, the French Missions, or otherwise as the case may be Missions of said Society, and the receipt or receipts of the Treasurer or Treasurers of the said Missionary Society, for the time being, shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors, and the published Report of the General Board of the said Society, containing the appointment of such Treasurer or Treasurers, shall be sufficient evidence of the authority upon which the said Treasurer or Treasurers may demand payment of the said bequest.
