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## Canadians To Blame, Says Rev. Dr. Milliken

An impassioned appeal to Canadians to realize their responsibilities to the non-English speaking residents in their midst, characterized a striking sermon delivered Sunday evening at Metropolitan Methodist church at Regina by the pastor, Rev. Dr. Milliken. The appeal, it was evident, struck a responsive chord in the congregation and will result in considerable discussion relative to the immigration problem. Dr. Milliken deplored the tendency, all too common in certain quarters, to belittle anyone of non-English speaking descent and to regard these people of having no contribution to make to our Canadian nationalism. If it was true that they were unable to take their proper place in our national life, he wondered who was to blame for it. In this connection he spoke in the strongest terms of those who had taken advantage of these people to further their own political and selfish ends. The history of some sections of the west fairly reeked with stories of the deprivations of those who made their gains by taking advantage of those ignorant of Canadian laws and customs. Closing of Branch Libraries It was not to the credit of the people of Regina that the East End branch of the Regina library had been closed because of lack of funds to keep this reading room open. Librarian Honeyman had told him, Dr. Milliken stated, that the very finest class of literature was demanded by the people who patronized the eastern branch, and it was with a feeling of shame that he passed by the building the other day and found it boarded up, and this means of enlightenment barred to the people of this section of the city because Regina citizens would not put up the funds. Night classes for the benefit of the non-English had also been denied these people, also for lack of funds, while Wetmore school, the finest equipped building of the kind in the west stood idle at night. Dr. Milliken said that he would like to see this school going at full blast, day and night, and the splendid facilities of the building placed at the disposal of the non-English at all times. He looked with some trepidation upon the movement which had grown out of the war which viewed with derision anything which was non-English. He believed that these non-English people had a contribution to make to Canadian national life which would become more evident the closer one became acquainted with these new Canadians.

Fall Plowing To Kill Grasshoppers The first serious outbreak of grasshoppers or locusts in Saskatchewan occurred this year, threatening returns showing that the damage to the crop affected was much more serious than first anticipated. Reports received from the field representatives of the words and seed branch of the Saskatchewan department of agriculture, which is directing the campaign against the grasshopper pest, give abundant evidence that grasshoppers have already spread over a wide area of the province outside of the districts where most damage was reported this year. F. H. Auld, deputy minister of agriculture, is anxious that farmers whose crops were infested, as well as farmers in adjoining districts, and in any part of the province where grasshoppers were noticed in unusual numbers, should realize the importance of plowing as deeply as possible their stubble land, if a much more serious outbreak of grasshoppers over a much wider area is to be averted next year. Heavy flights of grasshoppers were observed in the southeastern part of the province, where the outbreak was first observed and where the greatest damage was wrought, an advisor who flew at Carlyle stating that he had encountered large number of grasshoppers at an altitude of several hundred feet. Forty-six municipalities reported damage to the crop by grasshoppers this year. The department of

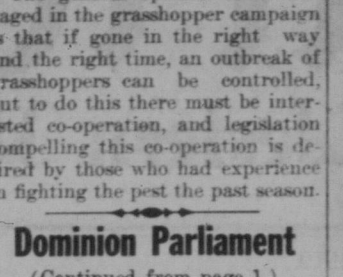
