This sum will be sufficient to pay the present salaries for the next ensuing eighteen months, when it is hoped the new Cathedral will be fit for occupation and yield the requisite revenue.

The expenditure for the necessary repairs and alterations in the Chapel, during the past year, has been heavy but as these are now completed, it may confidently be assumed that during the ensuing year the money borrrowed from the Finance and Building Committee for the purchase of the organ, can be repaid from the pew-rents.
