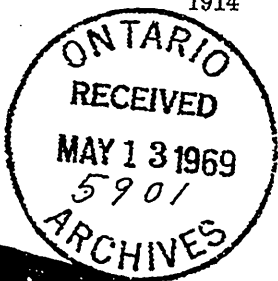

Although it is difficult to estimate the number of "Old Boys" now living or of those on active service, it is possibly not inaccurate to say that the proportion of the latter to the former is about one-third—a not inconsiderable state of affairs, seeing that not a few of those who survive are from 45 to 92 years of age.
