

HO, FOR WOODBINE PARK!

ALL ABOARD FOR THE JOCKEY CLUBS RACES!

Old Probs Promise Fine Weather For This Afternoon. The First Event Begins At 2 P.M.—The Horses You Should Not On Splendid Fields For Six Numbers on the Program.

Today the Ontario Jockey Club will inaugurate what will most likely prove the greatest racing in the history of the club and the best race of Canada.

The Governor-General and party arrived last night and will drive down in time to see the first night race at 8. The most fashionable of Canada's citizens will be present to see Her Majesty's guinea contest for. Fine weather is promised and everything points to an auspicious opening of the meet.

At last the worthy vice-president, to whom a great deal of credit is due, is about to witness his fond hopes realized. Toronto becomes one of the leading racing points of the continent. Through yet in its infancy, everything certainly points that this is the decision of all visiting American horsemen and great was the surprise when Woodbine Park was bestowed on the club and its grounds.

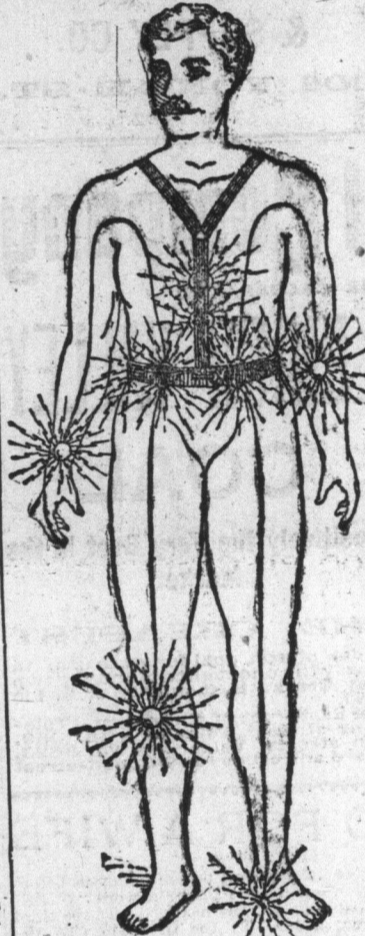

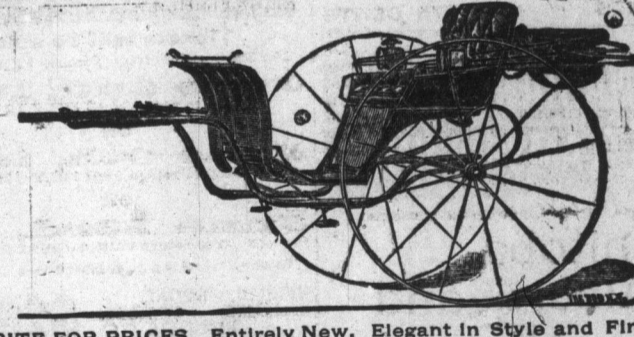
