Farm Garden and How to Manage it Satisfactorily. Every farm should have a "kitchen garden" of ample proportions. A good many farmers have a notion that it is not a matter of their consideration, and leave the cultivation of a little patch to the "women folk," who already have quite enough, with their household cares, to occupy their time and attention. This is poor economy, for no part of the farm pays better in respect to health, comfort and money than a well-managed vegetable garden, with a liberal complement of small fruits.

For such a garden select the smallest location and the best soil. There are two ways of planting a garden. One is to cut it up into beds, with rows of small fruits crossing the plot in both directions, like hedges around little fields. This is the best method in the cultivation, and handwork only. A much better way is to lay out the garden in long rows, so that the greater part of the soil is in the rows and not in the alleys. This makes a vast saving of labor, and fits the cultivation of the vegetable and garden crops into the category of farm operations.

On this favored plot grow a variety of vegetables, and a few small fruits, such as strawberries, raspberries, currants, which may be saved from the waste by the judicious application of the hoe or even a dusting of coal ashes, and grapes trained on low trellises or arched stakes may be appropriately placed in such a garden, and the soil between the rows of grapes trained on low trellises or arched stakes may be saved from the waste by the judicious application of the hoe or even a dusting of coal ashes.
