Cap. 40, respecting the Militia and De fence of the Dominion of Canada, but who have served as Officers in such Corps during the full period prescribed in General Orders as necessary to entitle them to retire retaining rank, will be permitted to do so, so soon as it appears that the arms and other public stores issued for the use of such Corps have been satisfactorily accounted for and handed over to the proper officer appointed to receive them.

Officers holding certificates from any of the Schools of Military Instruction, who have been appointed "Temporary" to the Volunteer Force, and who now hold such "Temporary" rank therein, are hereby confirmed in their several grades from the dates of their appointments respectively.

Gentlemen who hold certificates from any of the Schools of Military Instruction, may hereafter be appointed substantively to commissions in the Volunteer Militia.

Tms week's issue of the Review contains eight additional pages, to make room for the large increase of Militia Orders, so that our readers may have in this and other numbers complete details of the Militia organization of the whole Dominion.

Having been snowed in at the Capital the usual correspondence has not reached us for this issue.

The heavy snow storms which have prevailed of late interrupting the passage of mails and setting the whole current of travel astray, will, to our subscribers at a distance, account for any irregularity in the delivery of the Review.

REORGANIZATION of the Reserve Militia is now nearly complete and before very long Canada will be in possession of the most complete militia system ever devised on this continent. Upon the merits of the details of this law it is not our present purpose to enter, as we are well convinced that the time has not yet come when the wisdom of the measure will be acknow. ledged. Personally many of us who have labored in the volunteer cause feel aggrived or neglected, but the question is not a parsonal one, it rests on its merits in anational sense, and we are bound as good citizens and soldiers to accept it, give it a fair trial, and if, after that, it is found inadequate, our duty will be to strive for something better. Living in an age preeminently material and at the same time loftily speculative, we must, if we desire to keep pace with the times, lift ourselves above the narrowness of personal considerations, and from the higher standpoint of progressive thought observe the current of events and strive to adapt ourselves to the age in which we

acknowledge, but novertheless of tremendous force, and not the least singular of its indications is the application of science to the art of destruction. Intimately connected with this is another question of vital importance to the nations, and one which has occupied the attention of ruling minds on the continent of Europe for many years of late, and that is the problem of national defence Austria neglected the study and received a terrible punishment for her ignorance; Italy, Spain, and Turkey, are likewise examples, and one after another they will be made to pay with blood and trea sure for the national sin of omission. Despite the preachings and teachings of transcendental philosophers the age is aggressive, decidedly so; it is a hard, practical, selfish age wherein the grand object sought is power. Power, not for the furtherance of good, but for national or personal aggrandizement, hence the wars which have within the lifetime of our readers shaken the whole political fabric, and to which other wars must succeed before the material age will merge into the philosophic. Such being the condition of the world it behaves the weaker nations to look closely into and study deeply the powers inherent in themselves for protection against the possible desire of an overgrown neighbor to absorb them. In the comity of nations they bear the same relation to the powerful as, in the kingdom of nature, the weaker animals bear to the stronger. To continue the simile, an animal may be small and apparently weak and yet be endowed with such powers as make it formidable in its own defence. So is it with nations which, though small in territory and population, are yet dangerous to the aggressor by reason of the courage, compactness and determination of their people joined with that organization which a public power must perpetuate for the preservation of its independence. Herein we may then observe the germ of that principle which has won almost universal acceptation in all civilized communities, and which is known as armed nations in contradistinction to national armies. Or, to put i ' other words the people themselves must compose the national force for defence, and every citizen be a soldier when his services are required. As nothing can be more danger ous to liberty than a huge standing army, so nothing provides for it a surer safeguard than a popular citizen force. The one is an engine that may at any time be used to subvert the liberties of the people, the other, on the contrary, furnishes a bulwark the most daring would hardly venture to assail From the earliest ages down to the present time history teems with examples of what we have endeavoured to point out. We have but to refer to the citizen armies of Greece and Rome the lustre of whose conquests are reflected to day in our language,

live. It is an ago of revolutions, quiet we so diffused, as has been strikingly remarked by Macauley, so long as civilization exists; and that will be as long as the power of mind sways the functions of inert matter. To come nearer to our own days we find the force of a nation delivered, as it were, through the arm of one man prostrating and annihilating fabrics whose foundations were laid so long ago that people believed them indestructable. They "mistook the slumbering Leviathan for an island." and like the venturous sailor suddenly found themselves in the midst of a sea of unknown dangers. Again, to come to our own day, we have seen how Prussia, a nation of soldiers, overthrew in two terrific weeks the gigantic standing armics of Austria; and how, in Italy, the sound of "Il chimeso Rosso" was sufficient to cause a stampede among the mercenaries, while in the American States we have beneld two portions of the people rushing at each others throats, stabbing, biting, and gouging like two of their own bullies until one overcome by exhaustion was compelled to succumb.

> In none of these instances however have we an exact parallel to what may at some future time occur to Canada, but nevertheless the lessons they convey impress upon our minds the necessity for preparation. If we are prepared we need not fear invasion, nor revolution, nor oppression. Finally, while we maintain the principle of armed nationality, we provide for all possible contingencies. To the people is entrusted the duty of defending themselves, their homes and liberties, and, while guarding against outward attack, render innoxious more insiduous intestino dangers. Upon this principle Sir G. E. Cartier framed his famous Militia Bill and we believe the time is not far distant when those who have decried the measure will acknowledge its wisdom. We do not pretend to defend all the provisions of that act, by and bye, perhaps, we will see some modifications; but the idea upon which it was framed is the most correct that could be conceived, inasmuch as it enforces the duty of every citizen to defend the country, and no longer leaves the patriotic willing few to bear the burthens of many.

On entering the army the chief lesson impressed upon the mind of the recruit is obedience, which he is informed is his first duty; the keystone in fact of the whole system of which he forms a unit. The principle is one which must be enforced at all hazards. even should it, as in some cases which have come under our own observation, bear hardly and perhaps, unjustly, upon the unoffending. We all know that for the successful administration of a military force unquestioning obedience is an absolute necessity, as much to the popular leader of a revolutionary army of volunteers, as the Imperial General of disciplined masses. This being established laws and literature, and will continue to be it necessarily follows that every man who

joins a military body surrenders, according to the circumstances, a greater or less share of his personal liberty. That he may be of use to the cause he has espoused he must to content to pbey those who are placed above him: hence insubordination is regarded as the worst of crimes in the military calender, and one punishable by the severest penalties. Cases may sometimes be modified by circumstances, as, for instance, the same amount of discipline is not expected nor insisted upon in a volunteer corps as in a regular regiment, the former is a part of the people and partakes in a great extent of the passions and feelings of the populace, the latter is entirely distinct and has objects and associations entirely apart from what may be supposed to sway other classes of the people. In Canada our military organization is essentially popular, and partakes of the same nature as our other political institutions, but that fact does not destroy the principle of discipline, inasmuch as we by volunteering place ourselves under the command of others, and by doing so bind ourselves to obey them.

Apropos to the circumstances which elicited these remarks we would call the attention of officers of the Canadian Militia and Volunteers to an historical instance of peculiar significance. In the year 1782 the Irish volunteers were considered the best drilled organized and equipped force in the three kingdoms; but unfortunately they formed themselves into a political league for the purpose of enforcing the passage through Parliament of certain measures with which, as vol unteers, they had nothing whatever to do. The Irish Parliament was then in session at Dublin and the delegates from the volunteers met at the Rotunda, the latter to overawe the former and compel them to accede to their demands. Things were growing serious, and, to save the country from a military insurrection, the Earl of Charlemont virtual. ly disbanded the volunteers by dissolving the convention.

In this circumstance we behold the evils arising from the endeavour to make a popular military organization an engine for the furtherance of political objects. Both are essentially different and the attempt to make one subservient to the other is sure to lead to the demoralization and consequent destruction of the military element which, dependent through its various grades upon the central authority, must cease to exist when that authority is withdrawn. With reference therefore to the organization of associations of volunteers we would ask those who have undertaken that object to pause and consider well what they are about. When in our remarks upon this same subject some weeks ago, we spoke of such an association, we recommended the officers of the Force to "united action when questions which affect them as volunteers come before them in their capacity of civilians," we had too lively a knowledge of a soldier's position

to counsel forgetfulness of his first duty. Under the circumstances the advice which we tender, and which we hope wilt not be taken amiss, is, that if the volunteers have, or consider they have, just cause of complaint against the Parliament which passed the law by which they are governed, and are bound to have their wrongs redress. ed by forming an association for that purpose, let them associate themselves not m their capacity as volunteers, but as civilians and citizens. If they should be so ill advised as to connect such an organization with the Volunteers they will strike a deadly blow to its efficiency and highest interests, and, mayhap, discover their folly when it will be too late to remedy the mistake. From those who have undertaken the mauguration of this movement we would claim a close and careful consideration of all its bearings; above all let them not for get this axiom, which cannot be disputed, that no military organization can be made a political engine without destroying its highest attributes and endangering the liberties of the people.

NEVER perhaps did that arena for the desplay of ignorance and self conceit, the United States Congress, bear witness to such foul and unjust animadversions as was lately cast upon the character of Omar Pasha within its hearing. This august assembly which cham pions every ragamuffin revolution from St. Giles to Timbuctoo and at the same time practices the most uncompromising tyranny towards the conquered South has been anxious to intermeddle between Greece and Turkey; and one of its members took opportunity of late to asperse the character of one of the best and bravest soldiers of modern days. To those who remember the earlier scenes of the last Russian War the name of Omar Pacha will be familiar, and the singular courage and ability with which he defended Kalifat and Sllestria, and how on the banks of the Daunbe he successfully resisted the armies of the Czar. Indeed, since it is his character which has been assailed, we have no hesitation in saying that not one among the model pet Generals of the Northern Army of the United States would stand a moment's comparison with him as a brave soldier and kind-hearted gentlemen, and we would not have to travel very far from our office to find those who can bear evidence to his kind and amiable nature.

The following is the tribute of an American Officer :--

"Colonel Burr Porter, formerly an officer of Massachusetts volunteers commanding at one time the Fortieth Regiment of Infantry, and afterwards the Third Begiment of Cavalry, has sent the following communication to the New York "Evoning Post," in answer to certain charges against Omar Pacha, on whose staff Col. Porter served during the Chimean war:

In a speech recently delivered in Congress, the greatest of Ottoman Generals, Omar Pacha, is called the Turkish Haynan, and barbartites that shock human nature are nitributed to him. Allow one who served on his staff during nearly the whole of the Crimean war to testify in his defence.

Omar Pacha bogan life as an Austrian or er of Engineers. He early, however entered the Tur-kish service, and soon took high grade on account of his skill in construction of field works. The high estimation in which he was held by the Tur-kish military authorities was should by high estimation in which he was held by the Turkish military authorities was abundantly justified by the manuer in which the forts of his construction, defended by him, resisted the assaults of the Russians at Kalfat, Silistria and Eupatoria. At the close of the Crimean war he was made a Kuight Commander of the Bath, by queen Victoria, in honor rarely accorded to foreigners, and when the Crimean war closed, there was not a state man bis character.

when the Crimean war closed, there was not a stain upon his character.

When on his staff I remember several instances when he sacrificed temporary military success to the sentiment of humanity, and particularly in two instances, by leaving in inactivity the half barbarous but very effective Arab regiments of cavairy that had come as volunteers from Arabia and Central Asia to the support of the Saltan. I have had many conversations with English and French officers who had relations with Omar Pacha, and their uniform testimony was, that he was a kind courteous and humans rentleman. He treated me and all Americans who came near him with marked kindness, and often expressed great adm 'ration for American institutions."

CORRESPONDENCE.

FROM BROCKVILLE.

[BY OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT.]

The late railway accident at Shannonville bridge has brought weeping and mourning in one family here. Poor Gunn, one of the victims who leaves a wife and child unprovided for, aftera few days suffering, succumbed to his injuries. He was late of the 47th Regiment, with which he served through the Crimean campaign, and for which he was presented with the usual medals and clasps. Being lately employed on the G.T. railway, he was a corporal in No 4 company, Capt. Bell's, of the Rifle Battalion connected therewith, and was buried with initiary honors on the 16th inst., Nos. 3 and 4 Cos. G. T. Rifles, and No 2 Co. 42nd Battalion turned out on the occasion. The cortege was headed by a firing party from deceased's company, after the mourners came the volunteers, following which, I noticed Major McKechnie and officers of the two G. T. Railway companies, Capt. Cole, 41st Battalion, Lt.-Col. Buell and Lieut. Wilkinson 42nd Battalion, and Lt. Colonels Atcherley and Jackson, District Staff. As the mournful procession wound itself through the burying ground, deceased being borne on the shoulders of eight of his stalwert comrades, the somber uniforms of the Volunteers relieved by the snow white pall which covered the earth, with the zephers wafting through the evergreens, caused one to contemplate on the end of man, and doubtless prepared those present to join with proper reverence in the solemn and impressive service of the church of England

which was said on this occasion by the es teemed rector Mr. Lane, at the conclusion of which the firing party fired three vollies in the air, the procession reformed and marched off.

Permit me to say, the firing party under the command of Sergeant Morrison performed their post admirably, the men were very steady, and the vollies were fired with great precision, one cannot but think of poor Gunn, who though wounded, braved the Russian bullets for months, to meet his more ignominious death by this monster Railway.

The snow has scarcely ceased to fall for the past ten days, consequently the roads are almost impassible, causing but few country people to visit the town, and the mails, particularly from the east, are very irregular.

As the withdrawal of the troops in the spring will throw the whole delence of the Dominion on the Volunteers, would it not be well for the Commons at its next Session to make a provision for at least 100,000 Volunteer or Active Militia? and to provide tor them, the very best equipment. I presume, at the present time, one half of the accoutrements in possession of the Volunteers are unserviceable, they being very old and in fact a great portion condemned by the regular troops previous to their being palmed off on our Government, knapsacks and new water bottles are also wanted, and when issued, it is to be hoped that they will not only be perfect in the manufacture, but of the latest and most approved pattern.

VOLUNTEERING IN NEW BRUNSWICK.

SAINT JOHN. N.B., 15th February, 1869. To the Editor of THE VOLUNTEER REVIEW.

Sin, -- During the whole period of the Ame-

rican War, the men of the "Loyal Volunteer Artillery' took their full share of duty, for the protection of the property of their fellow citizens: while, for the more immediate protection of property around the harbor of Saint John and its contiguous shores; a force of "Sea Fencibles" was organized, composed of the branch pilots and others connected with the navigation of the Port; and so great had become their discipline, and rigid adherence to duty, that the moment the bugle sounded, or the drum beat to quarters, whether at night or day, every man would be bund at his proper

In its ranks, were a large number of the sons of the Loyalists of '83, and sons of the old 42nd Highlanders, who had been disbanded at the close of the Revolutionary War, and came here with the Loyalists: and sons of the Englishmen, Irishmen and Scotchmen who had immigrated into this Province prior to the year 1813; and amongst its officers, were to be found some as brave men, as ever wore a sword. The

place, at the proper time. In the latter

part of the year 1812, the gallant 104th

Regiment, was raised in New Brunswick.

Regiment left Saint John, on the 13th day of February, 1813, for Quebec, by the Valley of the Saint John. After a brief halt at Quebec, the Regiment again resumed its march for Upper Canada where on its arrival in the vicinity of the battle-ground, the men were marched into immediate action.

place in those days in Upper Canada, is, without doubt, familiar to the numerous readers of The Voluntein Review, and it is therefore unnecessary to repeat them now: suffice it to say, that, if the Captains, Subaltern Officers and Men of the gallant 104th were "Only Colonisis," they performed deeds of ralor, which, if done by some of the Veteran Ballalions of Britain, would have been extolled as the very refinement of heroism, and caused a medal to have been placed upon the breast of every one of the survivors at the close of the War.

The achievements of the 104th during us brief existence and career in Uppe. Canada, have left an impress apon the minds of the people of this Province, which will not be very soon eradicated. When the Regiment left New Brunswick, it was up to the full strength required; on its return home at the time of its reduction in 1817, their was hardly one third of its original number remaining; all the others, having left their bones on the soil, which they had left here to defend.

The only man of the Regiment now living in Saint John is William Munford, who was one of its Drummers during the whole period of its existence. For several years subsequent to the close of the war in 1815. the militia of this Province, had permission to "stand at ease," but the volunteer artiflery, never lost its vitality, and could every year, muster the requisite number of men to fire the Royal salutes on the 4th day of June, in honor of the birth day of Old King George the Third, up to the close of his life in 1819. In consequence of the sudden death of Captain Andrew Crookshank, about 1816, the command of the Artillery devolved on Captain David Water berry, who, with two of his sons had joined the Battery some years, before, and during his command, the muster roll once more attained to its full strength. After the decease of Captain Waterberry; the command was given to his son John Waterbery, who held it for several years; and then made way for Thomas Barlow, Merchant. who was appointed Captain: and it was during the term of his command that the writer of these papers joined the Battery in 1827.


