Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Council
of the Strathcona Trust Fund.

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Extention of duration
of Course for Grade

"B" certificate. (Chief of the General Staff). It was decided that the duration of the course for the Grade "B" Physical Training Certificate be extended from 30 hours to a minimum of 45 hours - instruction received at Normal Schools in Physiology, Anatomy & Hygiene to count towards this period where necessary.

Consideration will be given to special conditions existing in Nova Scotia where summer courses for teachers are conducted.

Change in
Grade "B"
Certificate.

The requirements for the Grade "B" certificate which at present are, ability to instruct in the exercises contained in the first twenty-four tables of the manual (exercises for children, age 7 to 9 years), were modified to read, ability to perform correctly and instruct in the exercises contained in the first eight tables of each section of the manual, and, in addition, ability to instruct in all steps and games contained in appendix "A".

Adoption of Syllabus
of Physical Training
1919.

It was decided that the present manual should be superseded by the Syllabus of Physical Training for Schools 1919, and the requirements for Grade "B" Certificate be, ability to perform correctly and instruct in -

Dear Dean Laird:-

In reply to your letter of May 16th, I wish to submit the following report on the High School.

The total enrolment for the present term has reached the figure 272, the largest since the opening of the High School. According to municipalities, the enrolment is as follows - Ste. Annes 134, College 44, Baie d'Urfe 41, Senneville 27, Vaudreuil 3, Non-Resident 16, Roman Catholics 7.

The average daily attendance has throughout the year been 195. The outbreak of whooping cough affected this figure greatly and considerable illness during the winter months also brought it down. New admissions to the school since September 1920 total 103.

The enrolment in the various grades of the school is as follows -

The only change in the staff this year is caused by the departure of Miss Perrier, French teacher. French is to be taken by Mr. Amaron next year while Miss Grace England, B. A. joins as class teacher.


Owing to the increased size of most of the classes this year, it is likely that a scheme for having Grades IV and V separate will have to be drawn up for next year. For this purpose, the Assembly Hall would have to be used as a classroom in the mornings. For the above reason and in order to increase

the efficiency of the practice teaching, desks preferably of a moveable type such as the Mculthrop, should be provided for the Hall. Thirty such desks would be required.

There is an urgent need for more water closets in both the girls' and the boys' basements, and also for a modern and sanitary system of individual urinals in the latter.

With the growth of Grade I and the Kindergarten the room in the basement used at present by the Kindergarten should be repainted, and a floor put in with stationary desks.
