**RULES AND REGULATIONS**  
**OF THE**  
**OSSINGTON LAWN TENNIS CLUB**

---

1. The name of the Club shall be the **OSSINGTON LAWN TENNIS CLUB**.

2. The membership of the Club shall consist of (1) Ordinary members; (2) Lady members; (3) Honorary members.

3. Ordinary members shall pay a fee of \$— and an annual subscription of \$5, and shall be entitled to vote at all Annual or General Meetings, and shall have all the privileges of the Club.

4. Lady members, the wives, unmarried sisters and daughters of ordinary members, shall, after having been proposed by such members, be entitled without election to the use of the Club grounds and materials between the hours of 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. on three days of the week and on one afternoon in each week, as the Committee may decide, upon payment of an annual fee of \$1 for each lady so admitted; and any lady may be admit-

ted to the same privileges (as the above) after having been elected in the same manner as ordinary members, upon payment of an annual fee of \$2.

5. Candidates for admission as Honorary Members shall be elected like ordinary members, and shall pay an annual subscription of \$2.50. They shall in no case be allowed to play upon the grounds, but shall have the privilege of voting at the Annual Meeting of the Club.

6. The Annual Meeting of the Club shall be held some time during the winter months.

7. The officers of the Club shall be a President, Vice-President, and a Secretary-Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected at the Annual Meeting.

8. In addition to the officers of the Club (who shall, *ex officio*, be members of the Committee), there shall be elected at the Annual Meeting a Managing Committee composed of five members.

9. The Committee shall have power to decide all questions relating to the Club, except the alteration of the Constitution.

10. The duty of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be to carry out all instructions of the Committee; to keep a book showing the names of all the members; to conduct all correspondence; to notify all members of the time and place of holding meetings; to receive all fees and dues from the various members; and to pay all disbursements.

11. That each candidate for admission shall be proposed by one member and seconded by another, which proposal shall be in writing, and shall state the candidate's usual residence and occupation, and shall be forwarded to the Secretary for the approval of the Committee at least seven days before the ballot.

12. At a Committee Meeting for the election of members, no ballot shall be valid unless five members of the Committee be actually present, and two black balls shall exclude. No rejected candidate shall be eligible for re-election during the same season.

13. At all meetings of the Club or Committee, the members qualified to vote shall have the vote, and the majority of votes shall decide any question; and in case the votes be equal, the Chairman presiding shall have the casting vote.

14. All entrance fees and subscriptions shall be paid to the Honorary Treasurer, the latter to be paid the first day of April in each year, or, in case of new members, immediately after election.

15. No member shall be allowed to enter the Club when his subscription or other indebtedness to the Club remains unpaid and two weeks overdue.

16. No member shall be allowed to play or take part in any proceedings of the Club, to vote on any subject connected therewith, or cast a ballot, or to be elected to

any office in the Club, until he shall have paid all arrears due to the Club.

17. That the Managing Committee shall meet at such time as they shall think necessary, and shall fill any vacancies in their numbers that may occur from time to time.

18. Three shall form a quorum at Committee Meetings.

19. Any member who shall conduct himself in such a manner as to bring discredit to the Club or annoyance to its members, shall be liable to have his name struck off the list of members. Such a case must be investigated and decided upon by the Committee, when five shall form a quorum.

20. Any member wishing to resign must do so in writing, addressed to the Secretary; but his resignation cannot be accepted until all arrears are paid.

21. Ordinary members shall have the power of admitting to the privileges of the Club as a visitor, for a period not exceeding two weeks, any person not residing in Toronto or within five miles thereof, providing such person is proposed by one member and seconded by another, and approved of by the Committee.

22. No member shall be allowed to bring within the Club grounds a male resident of the City of Toronto, or one living within five miles thereof.

23. No dogs shall be allowed on the grounds.

24. No member shall be allowed to walk, or play upon the courts of the Club, unless such member is at the time wearing tennis shoes.

25. That the Committee shall have power to appoint one afternoon in each week as "Ladies' Day," and cards of invitation shall be issued under the direction of the Committee, but on that day no lady member shall be allowed to play.

26. The Committee shall at all times decide whether all or any of the courts shall be closed by reason of the weather, or otherwise, and they shall instruct the caretaker accordingly.

27. No one is permitted to walk or play upon any of the courts with heeled shoes.

28. All games and matches shall be played under the Rules of the M. C. C. and A. E. L. T. C.



## - RULES -

For the Government of Members using the  
Grounds, as adopted by the Managing  
Committee.



(a). Lady members shall have the use of the Club grounds and materials on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings and Tuesday afternoon of each week, as per clause 4 of the Constitution.

(b). Saturday afternoon shall be "Ladies' Day," as per clause 25 of Constitution.

(c). When there are members on the ground waiting to play, no person shall play more than one set in succession; also, that when all the courts are in use, the members shall not play the single game if there are other members waiting to play; but in case the single set was commenced prior to the arrival of other members, the players shall have liberty to finish the set.
