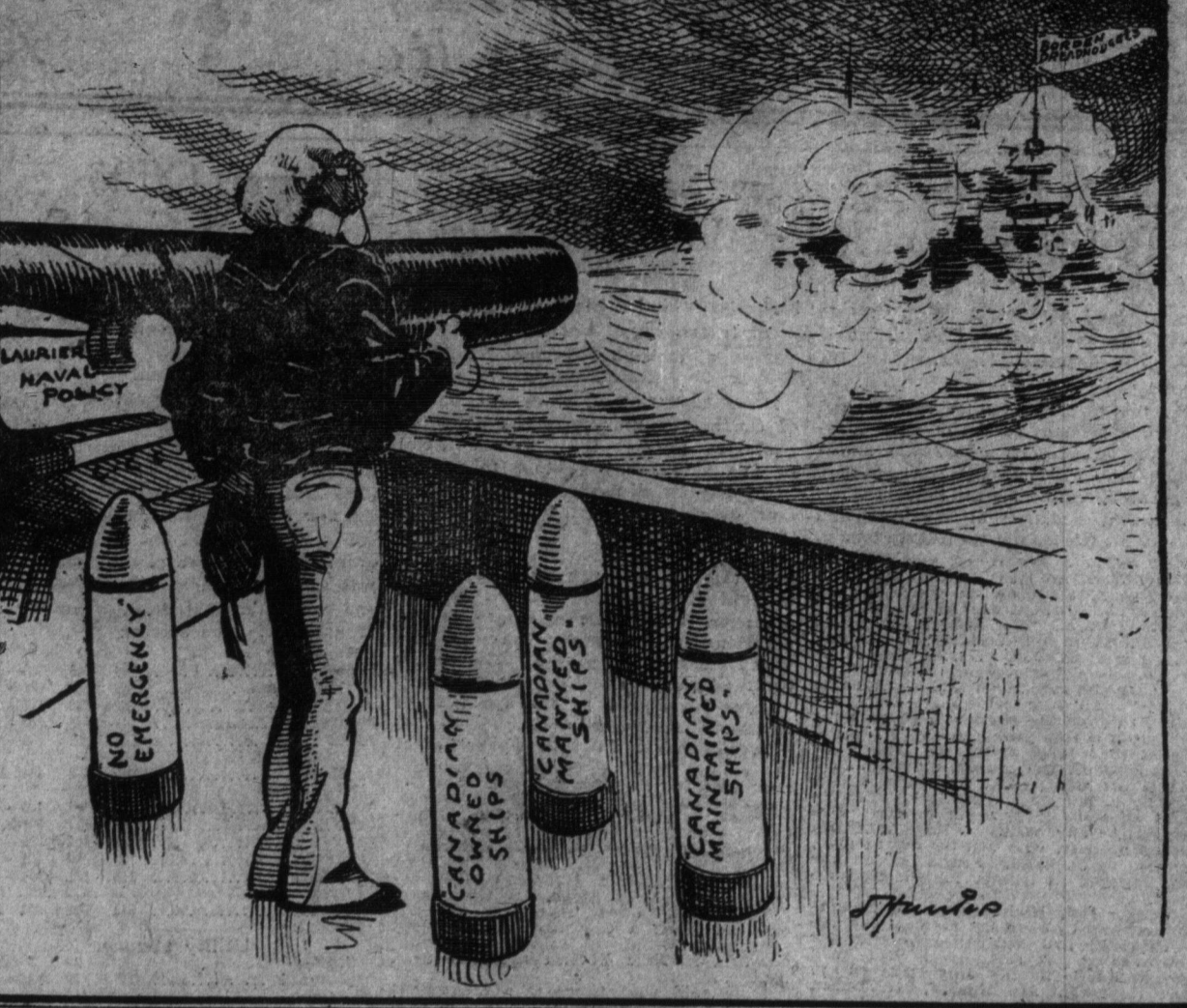

WHAT WE SAID in yesterday's newspapers regarding the wonderful decrease in the past decade in the deaths from tuberculosis in Ontario hardly made clear this really astounding fact that in one year the falling-off was one thousand. Put in the concrete: In 1901 the official records show 3,284 deaths from tuberculosis. In 1910 the deaths from tuberculosis in the province were 2,287, or 97 of a decrease. This despite the large increase in population within the last decade, including a large foreign element, whose habits of living are not always the most sanitary. So the decrease exceeded the thousand mark by a good percentage. This is the work that is being accomplished by the

A. T. Emmerson, M.D., G6derich:—"I have a young female patient with incipient Tuberculosis, about three months since first symptoms, with good family history, has worked as stenographer; cannot pay much, but would prefer to stay at home and die rather than have it come out (so it would) that the Crown was paying her keep there. If the Municipality are called upon to contribute for keep, what, may I ask, are they to pay? My reason for asking this is that someone might be found to pay that amount; also, when would there likely be a vacancy?"

The progressive party of North Toronto was handicapped for a long time by the less progressive citizens of the town in the matter educational. For several years the matter of a high school hung fire, but last Saturday the decision was laid for a high school building of four rooms, at which function the Provincial High School Inspector Houston remarked that inside of five years the building under construction will assume a dimension ten times that of a one-story building at the present time. A week previously Trustee C. A. H. Brown, chairman of the Education Committee of the City of Toronto, and he sent word to the Ratepayers' Association meeting last Saturday that his prediction has taken form already.

It now looks as though what is now North Toronto will become the educational centre of the City of Toronto, and it is not out of the way to recapitulate what is now under construction and what is contemplated.

At the present time North Toronto has three public schools with 29 rooms and a new building with four rooms is under construction and a four-acre site is waiting to receive another building. A high school building is under construction at St. Clement's College for boys and one for girls have been under operations for several years, and at the recent banquet for the erection of an up-to-date college has been donated, which will be ready as soon as the lease of the present building runs out, a year hence, at the southwestern corner of the present town is Upper Canada College, the University will erect their college halls on Edlington avenue west, and a short distance north of the town St. Andrew's College for girls will be erected.

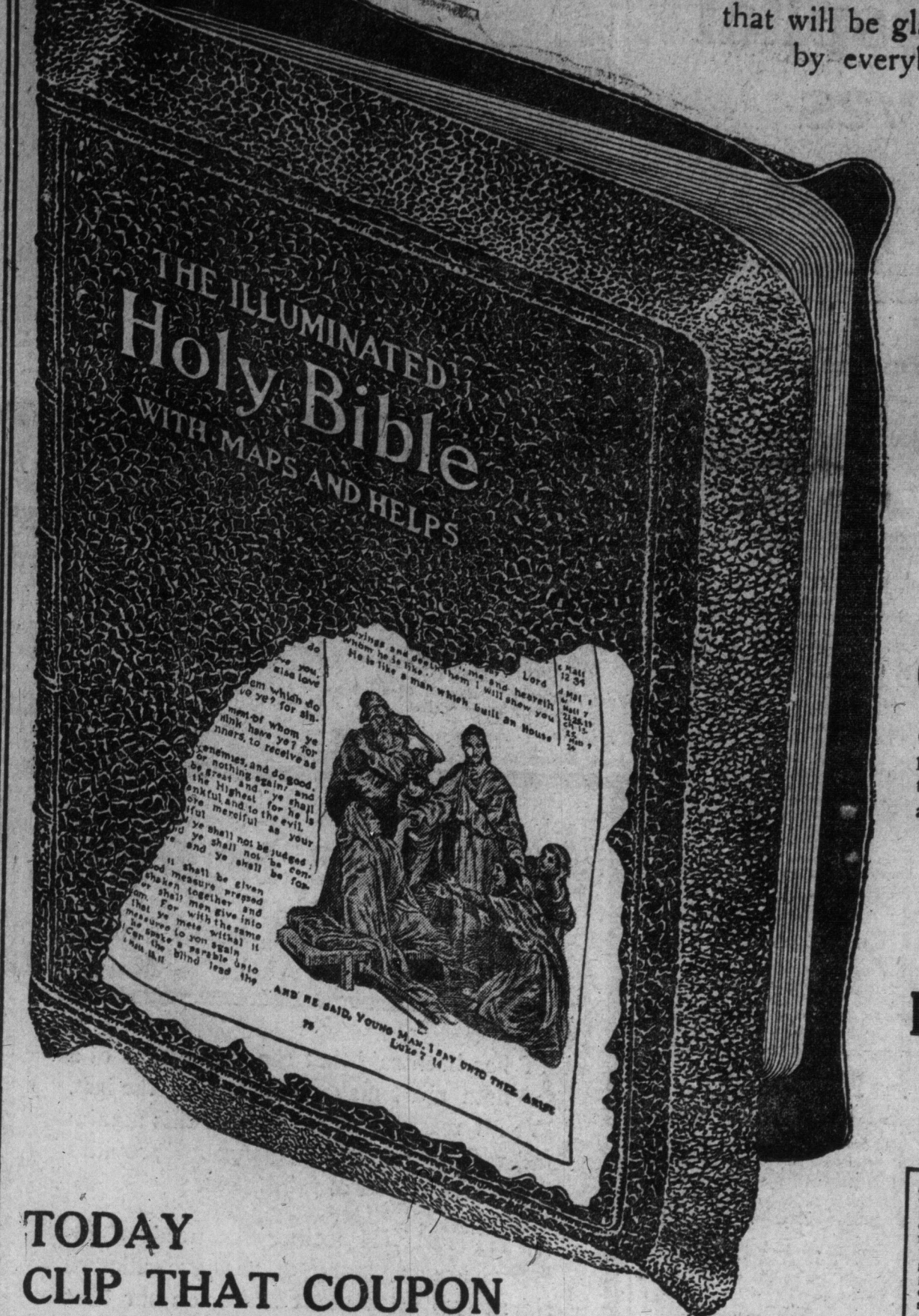
