Watch the Cat Jump. The following letter is one of those which show the way the wind is blowing at the City Hall.

In reply to a communication of this date from Mr. Donald, I beg to submit to you a proposal I made to him some time ago in regard to the St. Lawrence Market improvement. I have such confidence in the estimate submitted in the Commission's report that I am willing to prepare and furnish complete plans, specifications and details of the work, subject to the approval of your Board, so that tenders for the entire work may be advertised for and obtained. Should the tenders aggregate more than the appropriation of \$150,000, the complete work, I will make no charge whatever for the plans, etc. I am also willing that the plans, when prepared, should be submitted to an engineer, who would be mutually agreed on, to report on all questions of construction, so that your Board may be confident of the accuracy of the estimate of the building has not been sacrificed in order to keep within the appropriation. The plans and specifications could be ready within any reasonable time allowed by your Board.

Employ 125 Hands. Assessment Commissioner Fleming, in reply to the demand of the Mayor's Board of Control, intimates that the new Queen and York-street tin works, or rather the burning of the tin works, are to employ a minimum of 125 hands throughout the year. They are to erect a \$250,000 building, which is to be a storey one.

Let the Government Pay. Ald. Lamb introduced the question as to whether the city was not entitled to compensation from the Government, on the grounds that the two cases had emanated from Cobourg, Ont. Dr. Sheard collected that Cobourg had been compensated in this way, and if the cases proved to be similar, let the Government pay.

Crane Again Chairman. It was the Board of Health's first meeting, and it seemed almost as though this was a misnomer, for those well enough to attend had an after-taking look about them. Ald. Crane was deservedly re-elected chairman, and made a short inaugural address.

Tuberculosis and Stale Milk. Ald. Lamb had an asthma after-effects, cough, and it is not strange that he should take tuberculosis and stale milk.

The M.H.O. reported no danger unless the milk were affected. The English Royal Commission had quitted doubt on that score. But he had taken the precaution to have Inspector Aird, who he suburban country inspectors cover and other milk appliances to secure the city consumers from danger.

For this he was much applauded. Ald. Lamb also raised the question as to preventing the delivery of Sunday milk on Monday morning. But there seemed no way out of it but to drink stale milk. Railways don't run from the north, and other things are not allowed to happen on Sundays. Dr. Sheard, however, will work out a plan, if possible, to obtain fresh Monday milk.

Dr. Sheard further reported the broad bylaw, enforcing a three-pound loaf standard, to be working successfully, as formerly.

The Isolation Enlargement. A new wing is reported by the Health Officer as necessary to accommodate scarlet fever and other cases of contagion at the Isolation Hospital. To permit of enlargement the surrounding grounds, enlarged, too, that the statute providing for an isolated radius may be complied with.

On motion of Ald. Lamb and Saunders, the City Solicitor will take the necessary steps to apply for legislation or order in Council sanctioning enlargement to 150 feet on the east side of the grounds.

The meetings of the board will be on the first Wednesday of the month, as formerly.

MEANS MUCH TO UNCLE SAM

Former U. S. Minister to Spain Says It Will Be a Mistake Not to

Shanghai, Jan. 17.—Mr. John Barrett, formerly United States Minister to Spain, in an address before the Shanghai Chamber of Commerce to-day on the question of American control of the Philippines, said he feared that the opponents at home of such control did not appreciate its vital importance to the extension of American commerce and influence in the far East, where immeasurable opportunities would otherwise be lost.

The failure to assume and maintain control, said Mr. Barrett, would forever relegate the United States to a secondary place in the Pacific, not to mention the fact that governing the archipelago, they had been much exaggerated. Aguinaldo and his followers could be pushed with a mixture of diplomacy and firmness; nor would the Monroe doctrine be violated, for the occupation of the Philippines by the United States was not a direct act of conquest, but the inevitable result of a war in which grave responsibilities had been unavoidably entailed. Mr. Barrett emphasized the fact that the nations which, like England, were chiefly concerned, approved of permanent American control.
