On Gas Stock Purchase Plan—A "Jaunt" Headed Off.

The board of control yesterday awarded the contract for laying the six-foot steel conduit at the Island to Frank Simpson, of Toronto, for \$84,745.

A watchman will be placed at the Cherry-street crossing. It was recommended that the engineer, alone go to the St. Louis convention of the Municipal Improvement Society.

On Oct. 22 ratepayers will vote on the gas stock purchase scheme. It was agreed to allow a sheepskin factory to locate on River-street.

After an inspection of car fenders by the mayor and Architect McCallum, it is reported that fully 25 per cent. are out of order.

City Treasurer Coody reported that the total amount of tax is \$93,365, an increase in the amount really due of \$28,510.

The city engineer's department will take up the matter of the pollution of the Canfield Pond in High Park through a drain connection from Toronto Junction.

The Canadian Pacific Railway has been given permission to construct a siding on Liberty-street, for the benefit of manufacturing industries in that district.

The Municipal Handbook, compiled by City Clerk Littlejohn, has been issued, and is indeed handy and complete.

Judging from the number of visitors to town who can be seen sitting along the city hall steps, it would not have been a bad idea if the park commission had placed a few seats on the lawn for the time being.

WAR AMONG DRUG MEN. Proprietary Medicine Association May Withhold Supplies.

A special meeting of the executive board of the Proprietary Medicine Association was held Wednesday.

The members are much incensed over the action of the wholesale druggists in attempting to coerce the retailers into purchasing supplies direct.

Some of the smaller dealers have already complied with the wholesalers' demands, but most of them—especially the larger ones—are protesting.

A committee was named to investigate the matter, and to consider the withholding of supplies from wholesalers if the latter refused to comply.

Action was deferred until the annual meeting, which will be held during the first week of November.

The association approved of the boycotting system as a legitimate means to the extension of business.
