ECLIPSES.

In the year 1837, there will be three Eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon, which will occur in the following order:
1st. on Wednesday April 5th, there will be a Partial Eclipse of the Sun, and invisible in the whole Northern Hemisphere of the Earth; it will only be seen in a small portion of the Southern Ocean.

2nd, On Thursday April 20th, there will be a Total Eclipse of the Moon but invisible at Halifax; the Eclipse being just over before rising of that Orb.

3rd, On Thursday May 4th, there will be a partial Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in Nova-Scotia, but visible in the Pacific and North Atlantic Oceans, and the greater part of North America.

4th, On Friday October 13th, there will be a total Eclipse of the Moon, visible as under.

No. B. All Calculations are in Mean Time, except the Sun's rising and setting, which are given in apparent time.

The effect of refraction will cause both the Sun and the Moon to appear three or four minutes earlier at rising, and later at setting, than that is given in the pages.
