ALLIES BY END OF MARCH IS THE BELIEF

Government at Athens Thought To ENEMY'S LOSSES Have Already Decided

Only Word of Formal Entrance Into Conflict of Nations Now Awaited - Berlin Enraged and Greatly Excited Over The News

Rome, March 6—That Greece and Italy will enter the war on the side of the allies before the end of March, was the prediction made by a prominent diplomat here today. He asserted that the government at Athens had already decided to cast its lot with the foes of Germany, Austria and Turkey, and that this action would also force Italy's participation.

It became known today that the Russian ambassador to Italy, A. Kroupenski, had resigned. He had been the dominant member of the allies' diplomatic corps here, and has balked at every turn the efforts of Ambassador von Buelow, the German envoy, to persuade the Italian government to support the Triple Alliance.

Feeling that this has at last been accomplished, M. Kroupenski, who has been in ill-health for some time, has asked his government to relieve and his request has been granted.

Only the formal entrance of Greece into the war is now awaited here. The participation of that country and the rewards she might receive in the Balkan peninsula, would gravely menace the interests of Italy.

British Eye Witness Praises Canadians For Attack on a German Trench-**Enemy's Bread Rations Cut Down**

London, March 6.—The British official eye witness at the front in his latest report dated March 2, says:

"In the last few days there has been little to record beyond further success on the part of our artillery and one minor infantry action which was brilliantly executed. The British advance north of the Bethune la Bassee road has now worked forward closer to the enemy's lines.

"Our guns have maintained their superiority in the daily artillery duel. On the right centre, two German machine guns were knocked out by direct

hits, and on the left, south of the Ypres-Comines canal, a hostile saphead was

"In cases where a few of the enemy have established themselves in line with our trenches, they have stretched wire netting across the top of their trenches fixed at a slant, so that bombs roll off it. GALLANT WORK OF PATRICIAS

Boers who fought England a decade ago fought for her last summer against their own flesh and blood. Such an Empire has not even begun to grow old, but can look forward through the clouds of war to the brightness of tomorrow, when she can continue her history and be the power that spread throughout the world the principles of constitutional government and civil and religious liberty. But we have a stern task. A premature peace, a patched-up peace would mean disaster in the fu-
