The Secretify for Ireland

John E. Redmond, M. P., said in the House of Commons the other day that the British constitution in its working bristled with anomalies. The Irish secretaryship is a very striking illustration of this familiar truth. The secretary for Ireland, as he is properly called, has become essentially the prime minister to the viceroy, and is the member of the cabinet or dinarily responsible for directing and ordering the conduct of the lord-lieutenant, by whom he is nominally appointed, although the "chief secretary to the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland," to give him his strict official style, is, unlike the lord-lieutenant, a cabinet minister. The practice whereby a secretary to the lord-lieutenant acts as a minister in the House of Commons has its origin in the circumstances that the office of Irish secretary of state was for upwards of a century before the union a mere sinecure post. It was on one occasion made hereditary for three generations in one family.
