The world's record for a day's run by an eastbound Atlant& steamship has been broken by the Cunard Liner Lusitania. A wireless to New York from Capt. David Dow, of the Lusi-tania, says that between Thursday poon and Friday noon his vessels had covered 618 knots, an average speed of 28.70 knots an hour. This beats the previous record of 614 knots held by Mauretania.
