It cost \$80,000, but, in consequence of a storm, its flooring and other portions of its superstructure had been destroyed, entailing an expense of some \$25,000, making the cost to the company something more than \$100,000. The top structure that had been restored was a very superior one, and the bridge is in excellent condition. The Government felt that if it could be purchased for \$65,000 it would be justified in asking the House for authority to issue debentures to that amount. It is not absolutely certain, however, that the stockholders will sell the bridge, as a three-fifths vote is required to authorize the sale. That vote, however, will, in all probability, be obtained, and then it will be the duty of the Government, under this bill, to purchase and make the bridge free. The bill was finally agreed to, as was also the bill for the establishment of a police force and lock-up at Caraquet. The latter bill was also
