### The Annual Meeting of the Society.

- The Twenty-Third Annual Meeting of the MISSIONARY SOCIETY of the W. M. CHURCH IN CANADA, was held in the Wesleyan Church, Belleville, on Monday Evening the 12th day of June, 1948, Rev. James Dixon, D. D., in the Chair. The Meeting having been opened with singing and prayer, and an abstract of the Report having been read by the Rev. Enoch Wood, Superintendent of Missions, the following Resolutions were unanimously adopted:—
- I. Moved by the Rev. WILLIAM CASE, seconded by the Rev. Thomas BEVITT,—

That the Financial Statement now read be received, and a Report of the operations of our Mission Work be printed and circulated.

II. Moved by the Rev. WILLIAM RYERSON, seconded by the Rev. John Sunday.—

That with devout gratitude to God for the success which continues to attend Missionary labours in this and every other portion of our Lord's vineyard, this meeting affectionately and earnestly recommends to all the Members of the Wesleyan Church in Canada that constant prayer be made to God for the outpouring of the Spirit, that the Kingdom of Christ may speedily and universally prevail.

III. Moved by the Rev. M. RICHEY, D.D., seconded by the Rev. Peter Jones, and supported by the Rev. E. RYERSON, D.D.,—

That this Meeting, cordially concurring in the arrangements recently made between the Parent Wesleyan Missionary Society and that of the Canadian Church, recognizes the duty of the Members of the Canadian Church to sustain the Holy Missionary enterprize in common with all other Evangelical communities, and pledges itself to continued efforts to enlarge the resources of the Society.

V. Moved by the Rev. Henry Wilkinson, and seconded by the Rev. RICHARD JONES,—

That the very cordial thanks of this Meeting are presented to the Officers and Collectors of the different Branch Societies, and to the Subscribers and Donors, for the generous assistance they have afforded during the past year.

## REPORT.

To every right-minded follower of Christ, nothing can be more interesting than the prosperity of the Saviour's Kingdom in his own heart, and the extension of it throughout the world. What the star is to the mariner in a night of storms; what the cooling fountain is to the pilgrim beneath a burning sky; what the costly pearl is to the Eastern merchant seeking after goodly treasures; what the sun is to the Laplander under the extreme rigours of a polar winter, who is deprived of its generous influences near half the year, and who welcomes its return with songs of joy; such is Christ to a believer's mind. Having felt the excellency of the knowledge of Christ himself, he would have the sufferings of the world mitigated by publishing the good tidings of salvation. We have to tell of a Saviour incarnate, a Saviour crucified, a Saviour exalted and enthroned. Our calling is to proclaim the riches of Him whom we revere and worship—to gladden others with the tidings that have gladdened us—to enrich others with the treasures that have enriched us—to comfort others with the same consolation wherewith we have been comforted of God. Like the lepers in the camp of Israel, we ought to say one to another,—"This day is a day of good tidings, and we do not well to hold our peace."

The duty of arranging the most interesting items of religious intelligence, coming within the range of the Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada, and sending them forth in the Annual Report of her Missionary Society, is this year unusually pleasant. can survey the oneness of our Ecclesiastical Institutions without devout gratitude to the God of Peace that, by a series of movements His Providence has signally guided and blessed, the members of the primitive and legitimate household of Methodism are again gathered into one fold? The tone of complaint which in some past years has been heard of domestic estrangement and hostility, no longer exists; but, with a decided and willing mind, the members of the Canadian Wesleyan Family are now beheld in harmonious effort, laying broader and deeper the foundations of their Zion, and expanding the influences of those ordinances by which, in their own souls, they have been edified and blessed. Throughout the wide field of Missionary labour, both Indian and Domestic, which now invites the zeal, judgment, and sanctified talent of the Wesleyan Church, never could her best friends have stronger ground for holy exultation when reviewing the past; never could they have stronger ground for hope and excitement to duty when surveying the present. In the regenerated lives and triumphant death of Pagan converts; and in the salvation of many who have been followed into the wilderness of Canada by the pioneers of organized churches, when that wilderness has literally become a fruitful field, we see the effects of that Word which is mighty and transforming in its nature and results; while the increasing calls for help, as a Macedonian cry, issuing from the groves of Indan Reserves, and the distant and

yet solitary homes of settlers forbid any suspension of labour or offerings, but are incentive to both; from others we have freely received; now let our sympathies and efforts be commensurate with our obligations and our love, and answerable to the claims of thousands who look to us for the Bread of Life.

Supplementary to the "preaching of the Word," in raising the moral feeling of the Indian tribes, Sabbath and Day-Schools have contributed their portion of assistance. In addition to these efforts, more effectual measures are being adopted by the formation of Industrial Schools, where one section of the Indian youth will be taught practical Agriculture, and the other trained up to a knowledge and observance of Domestic Economy. enterprise forms a new feature in our Missionary operations, and gives us new claims to the prayers and benevolence of the generous supporters of our Missions. His Excellency Lord ELGIN the Governor-General, by written communication, and personal interview with the Superintendent of the Missions, has manifested deep interest in this work, and is prepared to give his countenance to any plans designed to concentrate small tribes which are now widely scattered, that by associating them in larger communities these benevolent designs may be more efficiently conducted. Upon the pages of this Report will be found some extracts from His Lordship's Despatch, containing evidence of his desire to diffuse the blessings of social improvement, based upon the soundest Christian philosophy. This interesting theme is reserved for a future page.

It is with no small degree of satisfaction that a reference is made to the appointment of a Superintendent of Missions, under whose special care and supervision this interesting department of the work is now placed. Devoting himself exclusively to highly-important and responsible duties, it is that the wisdom of such an arrangement will be justified in the growing temporal and spiritual prosperity of the Missions at large.

Judging from the success that has attended the labours of Missions during the past twelve months, we cannot withhold the expression of our strong conviction that under the present arrangement the Missions will possess an efficiency and power that will be cheering to the hearts of all the friends of Zion.

We shall commence as usual by presenting an outline of our operations for the past year on the Indian and Domestic Missions.

## INDIAN MISSIONS.

### ST. CLAIR.

This Mission is in a prosperous state. During the year just closed the Lord has graciously poured out his Spirit, and several conversions have taken place. Thirty of the subjects of the gracious work united with the Church on probation. Two deaths among the members on the Mission have taken place; but the last hours of the departed Indians furnished delightful evidences of the power of the Gospel and the sufficiency of grace. The expiring red men triumphed in death! There are 46 scholars in the day-school, 30 in the Sabbath-school, and 207 Church members on the Mission. Under date, May 26th, the Rev. Thomas Fawcett, the Superintendent, writes:—

"Your Missionary took the charge of this Station on the 31st of October last, and immediately commenced endeavoring to promote the present and eternal interests of the red men in these regions,—being efficiently aided by our indefatigable and intelligent Interpreter, H. P. Chase, formerly a member of the Rock River Conference, in the United States. Through him I was enabled to communicate the word of life to the Indians generally upon this Reserve; as also to some of those residing near the Sable, where there are about seventeen families in a state of pagan superstition and sin. But we hope soon to hear of their determination to flee for refuge to the sinners only Friend.

"Our congregations are very large and attentive, and, blessed be God! His presence is frequently and forcibly felt, to the joy and rejoicing of his true Israel. About thirty have united with us on probation: two have died triumphantly happy in God.

"It is delightful to behold those who a few years ago were in a state of paganism and palpable gloom, now happy in a Saviour's love, and then leaving the world in holy triumph to unite with the redeemed of the Lord

"Our day-school is in very efficient operation. The number of children therein is 46, 19 girls and 27 boys. We have also recently established a Sabbath-school of 30 scholars."

### MUNCEY.

The subjoined report from the pen of the Rev. Peter Jones, exhibits to the reader a clear and faithful view of the present state of this interesting Mission. Although there appeared to be evidences of spiritual languor when this excellent Missionary resumed his labours at this place, yet, we rejoice that there are now signs of a spiritual awakening, and that greater zeal and fervency characterize the devotion of the membership. On this highly-important Mission there are 3 Missionaries; 2 Interpreters; and 112 members. Brother Jones says:—

"On entering upon the charge of this Mission we were grieved to find that in general the Indians had made little or no progress in religion and civilization since we left the Mission in the year 1844. There appeared to be a partial return to paganism and drunkenness. Drunken frolics were openly held in the settlement. During the three years we were stationed here on a former occasion we never saw a drunken Indian on the Reserve; but now it is not an uncommon thing to see Indians under the influence of strong drink. This state of things has been truly disheartening to us, and has caused much anxiety of mind as to the final end of our Indian brethren on this Mission.

"We therefore entered upon our duties under great discouragements. We met and prayed for the blessing of God to rest upon our labours. The Lord in answer to our prayers often cheered and encouraged our hearts by the presence of the good Spirit. On one Sabbath day we had a most remarkable manifestation of the presence of the Holy Spirit in the congregation: so much so that the Missionary was unable to proceed with his discourse in the usual way; the congregation joined in lifting up their voices in prayer and praise. We felt it good to be there, and after having thanked God, we took courage, notwithstanding our trials. In the midst of our discouragements we have been made to rejoice in seeing that our work of faith and labour of love has not been in vain in the Lord, in listening to the dving testimonies of several of our Indian brethren who have died happy in the Lord and have gone home to glory. To hear the oncedark pagan Indian say as he is about leaving this world, "I am not afraid to die; I am going to Jesus, in ishpeming," is truly music in the Missionaries' ears.

"The Rev. Thomas Harmon laboured with us for several weeks with great acceptability and with much profit to those who could understand him.

"The School amongst the Ojebways has been kept up part of the year with an average attendance of about 25 scholars. Owing to the partial failure of their potatoe and corn crops and the limited state of their farming operations most of the families were under the necessity of going abroad in search of food, and with much regret we were obliged to stop the School for want of scholars.

"Brother W. Sickles taught the Oneida School during most part of the year, with an average attendance of 30 scholars. The Oneida brethren have expressed a strong desire to have their children taught in the English language, and it is to be hoped that your Society will be able to give them an English Teacher.

"The Munceys have also expressed a wish to have a school established among them.

"At the close of the year our numbers were 198 Indians and 14 whites. The Muncey Mission embraces three separate Indian nations, the Ojebways, Munceys, and Oneidas, with remnants of other tribes. We have a chapel at each of the principal nations, forming as it were three of our ordinary stations in other parts of the country. The Indian Settlement extends about ten miles along the banks of the Thames, and occupy about 20,000 acres of the finest land in the Province.

"Many persons who have heard and read of Muncywtown have been led into an error with regard to the formation of the Settlement; they imagine that it is a regular town, with the houses close together, whereas the Settlement is spread along the banks and vicinity of the river. The friends of Indian improvement will be glad to learn that our Indians have sown and planted more this spring than they have done for some years past. It is to be hoped that this is the beginning of better days among them."

#### SAHGEENG.

On this isolated and distant Mission many inconveniences are necessarily experienced, and the work is prosecuted under serious disadvantages. But still the God of Missions continues to bless and prosper the labours of his servants. Cherished by his presence the Missionary toils on cheerfully and rejoices in witnessing the pleasure of the Lord prospering in his hand. There is here a day-school for the Indian youth, and also a Sabbath-school. The number of Indian Church members is 107, showing an increase on the number reported last year. The Rev. J. K. Williston presents the following statements:—

"In comparing the present state of the Mission with what it was two years ago, I think I can say that there is a decided improvement among this people in almost everything connected with them. "Our last Quarterly Meeting was truly a refreshing season. The Indians spoke in Love-feast apparently with more real Christian feeling than heretofore. At the close of the meeting 16 parents came to the altar to offer their children to God in the ordinance of holy baptism. Thus fulfilling the command of Christ, "Suffer little children to come unto me, and forbid them not;" and to a certain extent realizing the fulfillment of the word of God which says, "The promise is unto you, and to your children." In their morals the Indians show the influence of the Gospel upon them. They are strict in the observance of the Sabbath, and pretty generally attend the means of grace. Even in the spring, when three and four miles from home at their sugar camps, they are nearly all at the house of God on the Sabbath.

"But few cases of intoxication occur among them. Occasionally some ungodly white men come here from Goderich to trade for the furs and sugar of the Indians, and then some are induced to drink the fire water. Our distance from the authorities enables them to give the Indian the liquor with impunity.

"In their temporal affairs they have made some improvement. I think they grow more corn and potatoes than they did; and the increased attention they pay to their dwellings and household matters show that they have some desire for improvement. The gardens connected with their dwellings give them an air of neatness and comfort.

"Attention has been paid to the Sabbath and week day schools through the year, and the children are making a little improvement. At our Missionary Meeting last winter a subscription was circulated and £4 2s, 4d. was obtained for the Missionary Society. There was also a requisition sent from this place to Montreal last winter by the Indians for £15 for the Missionary Society.

## GRAND RIVER.

An ample and interesting report of the state of the Grand River Mission has been furnished by the Missionaries. Although more than usually lengthy it is deemed the friends of our Missions will be pleased rather than otherwise that it is given without abridgement. Two Missionaries are labouring on this field in which are comprehended a large number of white persons as well as Indians. It will be seen that of the latter 143 are Church members, and of the former 145, making a total of 288 members in Society. The Lord has been graciously pleased to bless the labours of his servants. Twelve Indians and ten whites have been converted. Deeply painful is it to witness the constant opposition manifested to the Missionaries by parties from whom other things might be expected. The Missionaries report:—

"The termination of another Conference has imposed upon us the profitable duty of reviewing the transactions of the past, and of communicating an account of our doings on this Mission the past year. When we received an appointment at the late Conference, which held its session at the City of Toronto, we hastened to our field of labour as speedily as circumstances would allow. We entered upon the weighty duties of our vocation under new and advantageous circumstances in consequence of the Union with the That measure was well received by the people of our British Conference. charge. Our Indian brethren and friends heartily engaged in it at once. When they were made acquainted with it they immediately abandoned the Chapel on the north side of the river, where they had been accustomed to assemble for religious purposes for years, and congregated in the log chapel on the south side of the river, formerly occupied by the British brethren, and there they have assembled twice a Sabbath ever since to worship God. By the Union we have received an increase to our numbers of about 50 Indians, a few whites, and some additional appointments. We have now eight classes among the whites which contain 145 members; and five classes among the Indians consisting of 143 members, making a total of Church members of 288. During the year we have received 12 Indians on trial, and ten whites. We have excluded 14 whites and 8 Indians. Three whites have died and five Indians. Six whites have moved away and ten Indians. So by dropping &c., we have lost 46 of our members. Of those who died we cannot refrain mentioning two Indians, whose death will be greatly felt on the Grand River. The one is David G. Hill; the other, Joseph Doxtater. The former was an acceptable Local Preacher, who sustained a very respectable and useful standing in our Church. The latter was a truly amiable and interesting character, whose patriarchal simplicity, and unbending uprightness, together with his persevering industry in things temporal and things spiritual, endeared him very much to the pious who knew him. In them the Church militant has sustained a loss that is severely felt on the Grand River. They left. the shores of mortality in the blessed triumphs of faith, and have gone to that region where they will fully realize the truth of that declaration, "Blessed are the dead that die in the Lord, even so saith the Spirit for they rest from their labours and their works do follow them."

"We exceedingly regret that it is not in our power to render a more cheering and gratifying report. But when we consider the opposition in its endless shapes and forms which we have constantly had to contend with, we have reason to "thank God and take courage," that we not only maintain our ground, but gain a little. Perhaps it may not be improper here to advert to some causes of just and loud complaint—the conduct of certain clergymen, to whom we referred in our last report. They employ a variety of means and artifices to paralyze our efforts, to alienate the people from us, and to draw them over to what they are pleased to call the True Church. They have also agents employed to accomplish the same and.

requesting to see him before he died. When the messenger arrived Mr. Heyland was from home; but on his return, learning that the above message was left for him, he without delay set out for the sick man's residence. But before he arrived at the place he was informed that the man was dead, and that nearly the last words which he uttered were. "Tell Mr. Hevland I am a member of his Church: I wish him, therefore, to attend my funeral, and to bury me according to the rites of the Weslevan Methodist Church." Mr. Heyland was made acquainted with this, and he, therefore, prepared himself to attend to the request of the dying man. The place and time of interment were appointed, and to all appearance everything was going on in accordance with the desires of the widow and family. But some of Mr. Walker's relations were determined to frustrate the wishes of the deceased, as above expressed, and those of his family. Hence they secretly made arrangements with the Rev. Messrs. Nelles and Elliott, to have him buried according to the formularies of the Church of England. When the friends of Mr. Walker removed the body from his late residence to the grave-yard, a distance of five or six miles, they had to pass by the house in which Divine service is held by Mr. Nelles, in order to get to the Methodist Chapel. When opposite the door of said house, they were ordered to stop. The coffin, containing the body, was unceremoniously taken out of their hands, and, to their great surprise and mortification, was conveyed by other hands into the aforementioned place of worship, and the funeral service of the Church of England was performed by Messrs. Nelles and Elliott. This is a specimen of the kind of hostility we have to encounter from that quarter in the prosecution of our ministerial duties.

"Intemperance forms a formidable barrier to the spread of scriptural piety among this people. It is a circumstance, in our judgment, deeply to be deplored, that the magistracy of the Gore District allow so many taverns and grogeries to exist along the Grand River, to which the Indians go with their means of subsistence, and exchange them for ardent spirits, which occasions the destruction of everything that ought to be dear to a human being. Not less than five individuals came to a tragical end last winter by means of drunkenness. One was murdered while in a state of helpless intoxication. The other four were either frozen to death on the banks of the river, in the night season, or drowned while attempting to cross the river when in a state of beastly drunkenness. These five individuals were thus ushered into the presence of that Being who has declared no drunkard shall inherit the kingdom of God. This destruction of human life, character, and property, is much lamented by the Government's especial commissioner David Thorburn, Esq., who avails himself of all the means within his reach to inculcate habits of industry, morality, and sobriety upon them. Indeed, we have good reasons for saying that the urbanity of his manners, his diligent attention to business, the wisdom of his decisions in adjusting the conflicting claims that are put forth to numberless portions of the lands he has to dispose of, and the lively interest he takes in the temporal and educational welfare of the people with whom he has to do, show that he is eminently qualified for an efficient discharge of the perplexing and laborious duties of his commission. STOREGISTED STREET

"The want of Education is still severely felt on this Mission. It is true that from the beginning of our Missionary operations among them, we have had one or more schools established which have done much good in this department; but what are they among so many? According to the best accounts we can obtain, there are now, belonging to the Six Nations on this river, 550 children between the ages of 5 and 16 years : and out of that number there are only 120 or 130 receiving education from all the schools that exist on the river. This leaves a vast majority of them wholly destitute of any education at all. We think our school is in as flourishing a condition as any on the river, if not more so; and yet we have reason to complain that the parents take so little interest in the education of their children. However, we are looking for more prosperous times in this part of the work, as well as other parts of it; and expect that under the management of our present Teacher, education will progress among our children. On the whole, we would say that whoever takes an impartial and enlightened survey of the moral and educational wants of this people, must be satisfied that vigorous efforts, on a more extended scale than has ever yet been employed, is absolutely necessary to meet their peculiarly pressing exigencies."

### SNAKE ISLAND.

The Superintendent of the Snake Island Mission, the Rev. W. Young, writes, in relation to this part of his charge:—

"The Indian Tribe belonging to this Island numbers 144 souls. Men, 33; women, 40; children, from 5 to 15 years of age, 41; children, under 5 years of age, 28.

"The School is under the judicious management of Mr. William Law, and consists of 33 scholars, 19 boys, and 14 girls. Learning the alphabet, spelling, reading, writing, and arithmetic, comprise the principal studies.

"The number of Church members is the same as last year, viz., 52. Their moral and religious conduct is such as to adorn the doctrines of the gospel of Christ. The Divine power and grace are frequently most signally displayed in their meetings for religious worship. We have more than once found it good to be there.

"The Island is too small for extensive agricultural pursuits. The brethren, however, to a limited extent, are farmers. If they could be induced, in connexion with other tribes, to settle upon a larger tract of land, where they could enjoy the benefits of a manual-labour school, I have no doubt but they would much more rapidly improve in civilization."

### SCHOOGOG.

ously and from the small number of Indians residing upon it, it is highly desirable that the Indians there unite themselves with the larger body of their brethren at Alnwick. This, or a similar step is essential to their prosperity; but at present they have no disposition to take it. They must be abandoned, or the Missionary must be content to labour with them under the greatest disadvantages, discouraged with the prospect of doing little good, and disposed to make a large sacrifice of health and comfort. The latter alternative continues to be adopted, as the idea of abandoning any portion of our flock cannot easily be entertained. The Missionary writes:—

"The Indians on this Mission, who are members of our Church, have not manifested those decided indications of deep piety that I could have desired. Yet their reverence for the Sabbath, and attachment to the worship of God on that day, are remarkable.

"So far as I have been able to ascertain, no cases of intemperance have occurred since my arrival among them. This spring they have exerted themselves considerably in tilling their lands, and have sown about thirty bushels of wheat. Last year they raised about 370 bushels of corn, and about 196 of potatoes. The reason they assign for not paying more attention to the cultivation of their lands, is, that the Government wishes them to remove elsewhere. A short time since they received an official communication from His Excellency, proposing to such of them as should think proper to remove to Alnwick, to reside there permanently, in order to avail themselves of the benefit of the Industrial School for their children, &c. They declined, however, to a man, I believe, acceding to this proposal; and on the contrary, just before I left them, I prepared, at their request, a letter to Captain Anderson, requesting the erection of seven additional dwelling-houses. Heartily concurring in the views of His Excellency, I have, from the commencement of my residence amongst them, used my most judicious and persevering endeavours to induce them to comply.

"The number of schelars in the Day-School is 21; viz., 12 boys and 9 girls. The attendance has been exceedingly irregular, owing, I think, partly to defective parentsl control, and partly to the poverty of the parents, rendering it necessary that the older children should hunt or fish for their subsistence, and that the younger should accompany their parents in their meanderings, in order to obtain food by the sale of baskets, &c.; and perhaps, I might say, attributable likewise, in part, to the want of a more energetic Schoolmaster, or one light of foot like themselves, and both able and willing to run them down, and hunt them up. Of the above 21 scholars, 11 read in the Testament, and I think all the rest read in the Spelling Book, excepting two or three who do not yet know the alphabet. Three or perhaps four of the boys can write.

"The better provision they have now made by sowing wheat, will, I would

fain hope, prevent next year, in some measure, the very frequent absence of so many of the children from the school.

"The entire Indian population is 64. Beside these, the Island contains about 100 Whites of 14 years of age and upwards. On these I have bestowed some labour, and an earnest desire has been expressed for part of the labours of the Missionary stationed among the Indians.

"If it be within the compass of possibility, an Interpreter ought to be supplied; for the females cannot understand English preaching, and the males but imperfectly, and without this help the Missionary cannot receive from his flock any statement of experience, as they are unable to make any in English."

### RAMA.

The Missionary, the Rev. Horace Dean, in forwarding the following report, refers to the offering of £12 10s. presented by the Tribe here to the Missionary Society out of their annuities. Such instances, and we rejoice that they are not rare among our Indian brethren, cannot fail to afford the liveliest satisfaction to the benevolent individuals, by whose liberality our Missions have been established. They show that the word of God has done much in destroying the selfishness and parsimoniousness of human nature; for not until such a destruction is effected would a small Tribe of Indians in their poverty voluntarily offer so commendable a gift, even for the most benevolent purpose. The Missionary writes:—

"The year which has just closed has been more healthy than the preceding one. A few deaths however have occurred. We have lost three of our best members and a few children. One of the former was the oldest Chief, as well as the oldest individual belonging to this Tribe. He was supposed to be one hundred and fifteen years of age at his decease. He retained much of his mental, as well as his physical vigour to the last. He was a steady, sober, Christian man for many years past, and died in peace. The second was attacked with the prevailing fever of last season, and was taken away after a few days illness. He was a steady man; sober and industrious; and died trusting in the Saviour,—looking for a better inheritance above.

"The third was a faithful and excellent Class-leader. He had been a a great sufferer for nearly three years previous to his death; but he bore all with Christian patience; and died in the triumphs of faith. The evening previous to his death, he said that the very trees of the woods would witness for him how he had loved and prayed to the blessed Jesus ever since he had paid attention to the words of the good Missionary, which was twenty years ago.

had been a but he bore The evenroods would d Jesus ever nary, which "There has been a steady attendance upon the means of grace when at home; and, we trust, some advancement made in Christianity, as well as in civilization. There are four classes, with 67 Indian members; four local preachers; two Exhorters; and five white members; 72 in all, belonging to Rama Mission proper. I say Rama proper because there are four appointments, formerly supplied by the Barrie Preachers, which for six months have, by direction of the Chairman, been attached to Rama Mission. This part of the work is composed altogether of white people, mostly from Great Britain and Ireland. There are three classes, comprising 23 members, connected with this part of the Mission. There is also a prosperous, though small Sabbath School, having three teachers and 21 schoolars. The Indian School is much the same as reported last year. The children are unsteady in their attendance. Indeed, this will always be the case, more or less, until the children are taken entirely from under the controul of their parents.

"The Indians have granted £12 10s. out of their annuities for the purpose of assisting your Society, and have raised for the Connexional Funds of our Church £1 18s. 8½d..

"I have raised for the white part of the Mission for Missionary purposes £2 1s. 9d."

### OWEN'S SOUND.

The Missionaries here, in addition to the Indian work, have to supply a large extent of country, rapidly filling up with new settlers from different parts of Great Britain. Their sphere is a large one; their difficulties numerous; their work arduous; and their responsibilities great. In a subsequent part of this Report a more distinct reference will be made to the work among the new settlers in this section. In this place we give the following extract from the communication of the Missionary, referring to the Indians at the Sound and at Newash:—

"In the Indian department the work goes on steadily. The Lord seems to bless the untiring efforts of our excellent Brother Sawyer, (Native labourer.) There is another considerable Indian Settlement near the extremity of Sturgeon (Colpay's) Bay, some forty miles from the Village of Newash. The Chief of this Settlement waited on me shortly after my arrival at the Sound, and requested me to visit his people. I thought it my duty to comply with his request, and have accordingly held two Sacramental Services among the Indian brethren in that location."

### BEAUSOLEIL ISLAND.

On this recently formed Mission tokens of encouragement are graciously vouchsafed to the devoted Native labourer, the Rev. W. Herkimer, in his work of faith and labour of love. During the year an increase of thirteen members has taken place, having, after deaths and removals have been deducted, a membership consisting of 45 persons. There are 28 children in the school, receiving instruction regularly, both on the Sabbath and the weekday. Br. Herkimer writes:—

"These Indians have suffered very much from the ague during the last two summer seasons, owing to the fall of the waters in the bay, a circumstance for which we cannot easily account.

"Piety is evidently spreading among our people in this place. One woman, the wife of a converted chief, had long clung to pagan superstitions in despite of the many efforts made use of to convince her of the truths of our holy religion. On Sabbath morning last she said to her husband, 'Now I do believe these people feel what they say they do.' After a little time tears were seen trickling down her cheeks, expressive of deep sorrow. In the evening I invited those who felt penitent to come forward and engage in prayer, which was no sooner spoken than she rushed forward, exclaiming,—'O Kestemunedoo! neen gatemahgezeyon payah tahzeyun shawaneneshin keen tabanegayun;'—that is—'O God have mercy on me, a poor sinner!

"Remarks of the Teacher:—The School is opened and closed with singing and prayer, generally in the Indian language. The former part of the day is spent in recitations and ciphering, as well as reading and translating, which latter exercise is found the most efficient means of securing to the Indian children a permanent knowledge of what is taught them. The after-part of the day is devoted to mental arithmetic and writing—the younger classes occupying intermediate times. In most or all of these exercises the head chief and many of his warriors frequently engage in good earnest. Many have made some advancement, and the chief himself will soon write a fair hand.

"The Sabbath School, for the prosperity of which we have most earnestly prayed, is now flourishing. Who is wiser than God, or more kind than He?

"Many thanks are due to the Missionary Board for aiding this Mission to books, stationery, &c."

## FRENCH RIVER.

The Missionary at Beausoleil Island continues to spend as much of his time as possible at this distant post. Preparations were made by him for the erection of a School-house; but it

to spend as Preparations ouse; but it was deemed unadvisable to urge forward the work, as the Indians there expressed their intention of uniting with the bands of scattered Aborigines, and of permanently establishing themselves at a suitable place some fifty miles distant. The report of the Missionary is as follows:—

""I herewith transmit to you the report of that portion of our Mission field known as the French River Mission. God has looked upon the Indians of this place in mercy. None have died. There is an increase of three over the return of last year; two by emigration and one by conversion.

"I had prepared and sent both nails, boards, sash and glass for erecting and completing a School-house; but upon my arrival I found that the people were determined to 'leave that place very soon, and to congregate together; thus forming larger villages. Believing this course would meet the wishes of the Missionary Board and the Government authorities, I did not insist upon the erection of the house immediately. It is altogether probable that the Indians scattered in different parts of this section will collect at Shahwahahgah, 50 miles from French River, and 50 from this Island. The Chiefs say that there is plenty of good land there.

"The members of the French River class, 15 in number, are faithful in the discharge of their duty. This is my cause of rejoicing among them."

### RICE AND MUD LAKES.

The Rev. R. BROOKING, who spent several years of his life as a Missionary in Ashantee, Africa, has been labouring during the past year among the Indians at Rice Lake and at Mud Lake. Although the settlements are distant they have both enjoyed the advantages of Mr. B.'s labours. At the former place there are 31 Indian members, and at the latter 34, making a total of 65. The average number of attendance on public worship is 195. There are also 23 scholars in the school. In presenting his Report the Missionary has given an account of the state of the work first at Rice Lake and then at Mud Lake, which we subjoin:—

#### RICE LAKE.

"We have much reason to be grateful to Almighty God for the success with which he has favoured us during the past year. I had no official account of the membership of this Mission on my arrival, but by reference to the class papers I found the names of thirty-two, out of which number one has died, three have removed to other places, and two were expelled, leaving twenty-six. There are now 34 members in Society. We have

during the year received four from other places, and admitted four into Society; and there are now two on trial, making a total of 36; so that there is a nett increase in the Society at this place, exclusive of those who have come from other places, and those on trial of four.

"On account of the absence of a Missionary at this place, I found, on my arrival, much existing that gave cause for regret, though upon the whole, the Society was in a better state than might have been expected, from the circumstances in which they were placed. I am happy to state that now, for the most part, the Society is in a prosperous condition. The means of grace are well attended when the Indians are at home,—a lively interest generally is felt, and we have frequently had some refreshing seasons.

"It is much to be regretted that so large a portion of the time of the Indians is spent in hunting. This wandering habit, which seems part of their nature. operates very injuriously both to their spiritual and temporal interests, inasmuch as it prevents them from attending to the means of grace for from six weeks to two months together; and it so happens that these hunting seasons occur about the time when they ought to be busily engaged in their agricultural occupations. The consequence has been that, when they should have gathered in large crops, they have found that they had but little to gather. Many of them have been great sufferers in consequence. I am happy to state, however, that they are now beginning to see the evil of this, and the community have this year offered to supply those who shall remain at home and prepare their ground as much seed wheat as they may want. I am happy to state that a marked improvement has taken place in the temporal affairs of this community during the year. I have ever regarded it as being indispensably necessary, that the people under the care of a Missionary should be taught by example as well as by precept. Indeed, in order to the prosperity of a people like the Indians, the two cannot possibly be separated. In accordance with the above view of the subject, I have with some expense, and considerable labour during the spring, improved our Mission Ground, by laying out a garden and breaking up about two acres of ground. I am thankful to say that this has had its anticipated effect. Almost all the Indians have now tolerable gardens, and some have gone so far as to prune their fruit trees. Most of them have also brought a third more ground under crop this year than they ever did before, and some of them nearly as much again. There is also an improvement in their domestic affairs. Last year I succeeded in getting them to whitewash the inside of their houses and otherwise to clean them; this year they will not only do so on the inside but on the outside also; for which purpose they are now bringing the lime themselves. They are also going to beautify their neat little chapel, by whitewashing and painting it, and by erecting a tower. They are about to erect two new houses, one of them for a widow, and all the above work they are going to do themselves.

"Our School has been in successful operation during the last six months. The school-master writes in a note at the close of the winter quarter, "There has been a good attendance during the past quarter, particularly of

st six months. vinter quarter, particularly of young men, who will no doubt resume their labours on their respective farms. The progress of the pupils has been pleasing. Some of the young men have done well in figures, one in particular."

Exclusive of some young men, whose names are not entered, we had on the Register the names of twenty-eight scholars, with an average attendance of twenty-one. We have during the present quarter twenty-three names, with an average attendance of twenty. The reason of the decrease is principally owing to the removal of some of our scholars to the "Alderville Industrial School." Mr. Fletcher, our schoolmaster, is admirably adapted to conduct our Indian School, and deserves every encouragement.

#### MUD LAKE.

At this station also we have much cause for thankfulness. Although they have not had that amount of Ministerial attention from me which I could have wished to bestow upon them, on account of circumstances over which I had no controul, yet they have made commendable proficiency in spiritual things. On my taking charge of this station I found the names of twenty-five persons on our class-papers. Now we have thirty-four members in Society and four on trial, making a total of thirty-eight, so that exclusive of those on trial we have an increase of nine. In consequence of this addition we have been obliged to form a third class.

There is not the same amount of temporal prosperity at Mud Lake as at Rice Lake: this, however, may be accounted for in several ways. The Government wishes their removal, and therefore does not offer them any encouragement. The place is not well adapted to agricultural operations, and it is withal very unhealthy. Some of them are about to remove to Rice Lake, and some others of them elsewhere, so that there is no doubt but that in a little time the settlement will be broken up. There are a few, however, whose attachment to the place is strong; but I should think if proper, measures be adopted, they will all, sooner or later be induced to join themselves to the larger settlement.

#### ALDERVILLE.

The Venerable Apostle of the Indians in Canada, the Rev. WILLIAM CASE, superintends this flourishing and important Mission. His report, dated June, is appended with much pleasure, fully persuaded that no one can peruse it without being deeply impressed with the blessed results which have followed the introduction of the Gospel among the once ignorant, deprayed, and abandoned sons of our forests:—

"In presenting our report of the operations of the Alderville Mission we feel we have cause of gratitude to God for tokens of the divine blessing, increasing seriousness of the people, a gracious influence on the minds of most of the children in the Mission family, belonging to the Industrial

School, a regular attendance on the means of grace, and several conversions among the white population. During a season of illness the past summer, the attention of the Mission family has been called to attend the sick and the dying. In many instances medical relief has been afforded, and several have died in the faith of the Gospel, who, we have reason to believe, would have gone down to death without hope but for timely religious instruction. Beside religious services in the Indian Village, we have four preaching places in surrounding new settlements, affording the means of instruction and grace to many European families, several of whom have been brought to the knowledge of God.

"To the Indians we preach twice on the Lord's day, once in the English, and generally once through the medium of an Interpreter.

"Of the settlement of Alderville we may say what may be said of few white settlements, that an intoxicated man is seldom seen. There are still five old men who continue to use ardent spirits, when abroad among white people, but not an Indian woman is known to take it at all. In this circumstance is seen the power of the Gospel, as there were no exceptions among the Indians previous to the introduction of the Gospel.

"The settlement is this year enlarging. Six dwelling houses are now building, for young families, the work of which is done mostly by the Indians themselves, they having acquired the knowledge of carpenter and joiner work since their conversion. The building of these houses and that of the large house for the Industrial School presents a busy scene. The driving of teams, ploughing of fields, the sound of the axe, the lowing of herds, the bleating of flocks, the song of the milk-maid, are certainly indications of civilized life, none of which were known among the Indians previous to the introduction of the Gospel; and then a whole settlement, with the exception of three men and one woman, come up to the worship of God on the Lord's day. Though the chapel was enlarged a year ago, it has again become too small, especially on quarterly occasions.

## INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS.

For many years the impression has been cherished by the Missionary Committee and the Friends of the Indian tribes, that, in addition to the direct spiritual efforts which have been successfully made on their behalf, some systematic plan should be devised and executed for the special purpose of improving their temporal condition. None has appeared more feasible, or likely to be more permanent in its results, than training the Indian youth of both sexes to industrious habits in connection with agricultural and domestic life. To a limited extent, an experiment has been made at Grape Island and Alderville; the fruits of which

We present an extract from the Governor-General's despatch regarding this branch of our benevolent exertions, and a Report from one of the Society's oldest and most successful labourers, the Rev. William Case, engaged in the Alderville Mission, replete with interest and encouragement. In addition to that institution, contracts have been made for an Industrial School at Muncey-Town.

### Extracts, dated August 18th, 1847.

"It must ever be borne in mind that the object which the Government has in view in promoting the establishment of manual labor boarding schools for Indian children, is not to confer special privileges on a few individuals. but to imbue the rising generation with the love of industry and order. and to wean them, in so far as it may be possible to do so, from the low morality and desultory habits which they contract while residing with their parents. This object will, it is manifest, be very imperfectly obtained if the benefit of these Institutions be confined to a small number of children selected from each tribe; and there is even some reason to apprehend that an educational system, so limited in its operation, might produce an effect the very opposite of that proposed, and tend to depress the body of the Indians rather than to raise it, by engendering arrogance and self-conceit among those who directly profit by it, and indisposing them to share, at its close, the pursuits and fortunes of their less favoured brethren. Every precaution should be taken to prevent an attempt at self-improvement (in which the Indians have so cordially engaged) from having so disastrous an issue; and it is therefore most important, on the one hand, that their Institutions should be rendered as inclusive as possible; and on the other. that the youths who are brought up at them should carry with them, on their return to their families and tribes, simple and homely tastes and the habit of steady labor; these several ends are attainable by means which are identical-economy in management, moderation in diet, and clothing, and the carrying out of industrial training under such practical and intelligent regulation as may render the farm attached to the school productive."

#### ALDERVILLE INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL.

- 1. The number of Indian children in the school is twenty-four. The Wesleyan Conference year of Canada not expiring till the month of June, the present report is made for twelve children only, supported from the funds of Indians;—the remaining twelve children, as well as the superintendent and teachers of the school, being paid by the Wesleyan Missionary Society.
- 2. That the band of Indians at Mud Lake and Schoogog Lake having neglected to send in their children, according to the expectations of the

Government, though repeatedly urged to do so, the number has been completed from the children of the Alawick Tribe.

- 3. The former appropriation of the Alnwick Tribe of £100 annually for the education of their children, not expiring till the 20th November, 1847, the school, according to the new arrangement, did not commence till that date, which made 44 months only, up to the 1st April, 1848, the time of the Indians' annual payment.
- 4. The health of the children continued good till the month of March, when the measles commenced, affecting eight of them; they are now free from this dangerous disease, without the loss of life, and without expense.
- 5. The school consists of two departments, and entirely separate from each other. The boys are taught by Mr. Allan Salt, a native, educated in the Mission School. Mr. Salt is fully competent to his task and possesses an unusual aptitude for teaching; the girls by Miss Cook, many years a teacher in the Mission School, always acceptable and useful.
- 6. The branches taught are reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, book-keeping, and English grammar. The boys are instructed in the business of the farm. The girls are taught the economy of the house, such as cooking, dairy, spinning, making up clothing, ornamental needle work, knitting, &cc. The children possess capacity for improvement in these several branches, and their progress in several cases is highly commendable. A strict regard is paid to the morals of the children, and vigilance is such that none are allowed beyond the immediate inspection of the teachers.
- 7. Agriculture.—In the month of October last the Indians of this community appropriated a lot of land of 200 acres, for the use of the Industrial School. It is situated at the west end of the village. The land is partly a sandy loam, suitable for summer crops and clover; the other part a rich clay soil, proper for wheat, pease, and timothy grass. The whole farm is mostly free from stones, and after the first operation of clearing away the shrubbery, subduing the sod, and uprooting the stumps, will be easy of cultivation, and therefore suitable for training boys to agreeable and productive labour.

The lateness of the season before we obtained the land precluded the hope of a spring crop, but the winter, of alternate frost and thaws, so favourable for pulverising the soil, induced us to make a trial of pease. Should we obtain a good crop it will aid us in making pork, thereby lessening the expense of the table.

8. We have all feared hiring a farmer, or purchasing oxen, till this spring. It was less expensive hiring the ploughing than keeping the man and team through the winter. Without much expense we hope for a good crop of pease this season, and a crop of wheat on the school farm, of sixteen acres the season following.

### BLANSHARD.

WE regret that no report has been received from the Ministers labouring upon this Mission. The tract of country embraced in the Mission is an important one. Situated in the London District, with a fertile soil, and an industrious class of emigrants. at no distant day it will likely be among the efficient Circuits of our work. Many of the inhabitants have sat under an able Wesleyan Ministry in the Old Country; and the efforts of the Society to favour them in their new abodes in a strange land with the advantages of a Ministry, dear to them by a thousand recollections, are highly, and we trust suitably appreciated.

### GOSFIELD AND AMHERSTBURGH.

The following communication from the Superintendent Missionary will put the reader in possession of the present state and circumstances of this large—vastly too large—field of Missionary toil and privation:-

"The Gosfield and Amherstburgh Mission is one of the largest in the Province, including the Townships of Sandwich, Anderdon, Malden, Colchester, Gosfield, Mersea, Romney, East Tilbury, and the South part of West Tilbury, Rochester, and Maidstone. It is about fifty-five miles from East to West; and from four to twenty-five from North to South.

"During the year now past many have been the toils and conflicts with which your ministers have had to contend on this Mission. Infidelity, Popery, and general wickedness are our ostensible foes; but the form of godliness without the power is a more fatal barrier to true religion in the western District than all other causes combined. The utter impracticability of rendering that amount of pastoral care necessary to the well-being of so large a Circuit is a source of grief. On the whole, our small success is a cause of humiliation, and has cost us many tears and much heart-searching. A large debt on the Amherstburgh Chapel has operated very detrimentally, and will continue to do until it is paid. But all is not dark here. We have many good warm-hearted, christian brethren; we enjoy general peace, a good understanding; have never had a poor love-feast, and some most heavenly ones; and many sweet times in our other meetings. We have had 10 conversions, 31 admitted from other circuits, 77 removed, 3 deaths. There now remain in church fellowship 10 Indians, and 358 Whites: total, 363."

### ADELAIDE.

With the venerable brother who has passed through a year distinguished by abundant labours and such success, we sympathize and rejoice. We are glad the toils of a laborious missionary field met with corresponding zeal and patient endurance and perseverance. May the seed sown yield a rich harvest of heavenly peace and love, Brother Corson writes,—

"We have just closed our fourth Quarterly Meeting, and I am prepared to say we have had hard times. 1. We have had to do the work that required three preachers last last year. 2. We have had to reconcile those who were opposed to the union. The Missionary who had the charge of our brethren in connexion with the British Conference was opposed to the union. In addition to this, some of our local preachers were opposed: in fact, my colleague and self have had to labour night and day in order to save the church from divisions. However, we have succeeded thus far, with one exception. We have had some conversions and will have a small increase. The Mission embraces five townships, viz.: Adelaide, Bosanquet, Warwick, Plymyton, and Metcalf. The distance round the mission is 225 miles. We have eight local preachers and four exhorters. There are twenty regular appointments : also several places where we preach occasionally. We have had a number of special meetings for the benefit of the Mission. It was the intention of the Committee to meet all our claims, and recommended me to secure a comfortable house for to live in. But in this I have failed, as we could not obtain comfortable houses for both of us. Hence we have had to live in poor log houses, and pay rent. This is a mission, and we cannot secure comfortable houses in this new country."

## SYDENHAM.

Amidst the anxieties of ministerial life in a new country, and scattered population, nothing is more animating to the true shepherd than the affectionate regard of the flock over whom he watches in the Lord. The testimony borne by brother J. Williams in the following report of this station is gratifying to record:—

"In closing the labours of another Conference year, I am led to review the preserving mercies of God with peculiar feelings of gratitude. It has never fallen to my lot to labour where, according to the number of the inhabitants, there has been so great an amount of affliction and so great a number during to Lord had not all

ed to review ude. It has mber of the and so great a number of deaths, as in the immediate neighborhood of Wallaceburg during the past year; yet, amid the prevalency of so much sickness, the Lord has brought us through. 'Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits.'

"In regard to the prospects of Methodism on this Mission, there are some things to be deplored, while there are others that cheer and greatly encourage. The scattered state of the members militates very much against the spiritual and temporal prosperity of our Church; while again the eagerness with which the people receive the Gospel message, and the large and increasing congregations, are truly gratifying to the servant of Christ. I had contemplated holding a series of protracted meetings during the past winter, but indisposition prevented these special efforts. This I much regretted, as the people were so anxious for these meetings, and our prospect was so fair and flattering. During the past nine months I had repeated attacks or relapses of the chill fever, which naturally affected my efficiency, both in the spiritual charge and financial business of the Mission; yet I think we stand as well as could be expected; the people are increasingly liberal, and I have no doubt, if all the members on this mission (instead of being so scattered) could be organized in regular classes, they would be nearly able to support their preacher, without having to draw on the missionary fund. I can safely say that Methodism on this Mission is exerting a growing influence. If I may judge from the universal and unremitting kindness, and the courteous respect, together with the benevolent and charitable disposition evinced by the people, I may safely predict that Methodism will yet be a great thing in the west. The field must be cultivated by men influenced by the true missionary and self-denying spirit; instant in season; visiting and preaching must be their favourite employment.

"We return 122 members, many of them, as I have stated, are scattered over a vast tract of country; and my successor should be careful in searching out the flock. We have had five deaths during the year, and a few removals; some have been dropped, and some added.

"In parting with my dear friends of Sydenham, it would be only right for me to remark, that for the space of two years I have found them to be a kind, affectionate, and liberal people. May God bless them! and may he lead them forward in the good work, untill I meet them 'where the wicked cease from troubling and the weary are at rest.'"

## GODERICH.

Some hostilities to Methodistic law and usage exercised the patience and wisdom of the Society's labourers on this Mission, which by Divine blessing have been overcome; and now the Church has rest. The following will be read with painful interest, exhibiting a lamentable instance of profanity, and a mighty display of the grace of God:—

"Your Missionaries commenced the labours of the year under rather inauspicious circumstances, owing to some prejudices against the Union; however, by the blessing of the great Head of the Church on our feeble endeavours, affairs were so arranged as that all parties expressed their entire satisfaction, and became united in heart, feeling, and effort, to promote the glory of God, and the best interests of Methodism.

"During the latter part of the year we have enjoyed peace and prosperity, and God has added to us a number of souls, such, we trust, as shall be eternally saved. Amongst the most remarkable of these was the conversion of a disciple of Voltaire: he had been at a pleasure party one evening with others of his companions and acquaintances, who of course tried every amusement calculated to gratify an unholy heart, and to put on the climax of their carnal enjoyments, Methodism was carricatured, and the individual alluded to became the Preacher. In the perpetration of this awful wickedness he knelt down to make a mock prayer, of which it seems groaning was the principal characteristic; but Jesus, who still vindicates his cause and asserts the rights of his Church, arrested this bold persecutor, saying, in effect, 'Why persecutest thou me?" The sinner sunk beneath the weight of his guilt, aggravated still more by this recent outrage against God, religion, and decency; the thought, to use his own words, irresistibly struck him-' perhaps I shall yet groan in earnest?' However, after endeavouring to pacify his conscience any way, and every way but the right way, he was driven to the extremity of seeking the salvation of his soul at a Methodist Prayer-meeting. He is now rejoicing in 'God, with all his house,' having dedicated his three children to God in the holy ordinance of baptism.

"We found on the Mission, at the commencement of the year, 200 members in all; 145 belonging to the British Conference, and 55 to the Canada Conference. We have received 55 during the year, 40 from the world, and 15 from other Circuits. Expelled 28, dropped 8; two have died, one withdrawn—in all 39; leaving now in membership 216. There are 14 classes, 22 regular appointments, and 4 occasional ones. Here are good congregations, and an ardent desire, not only on the part of the membership, but of the community at large, that your Society would continue to supply the Mission with two labourers, as one is incompetent for this extensive field."

### WARDSVILLE.

"This Mission embraces six townships, viz.: Westminster, Delaware, Caradoc, Ekfrid, Mosa, and Zone; also the Indian Tract, including four considerable villages, two of which should have preaching each Sabbath, where we should secure a general attendance; but in order to this, two ministers must be employed. The people are favourable to Methodism, and gladly receive our ministers. All are calling for Sabbath preaching. The Classes, having been abandoned by other Circuits, required re-organization, and delinquents dropped, to which we have had a small accession by conversions, and members from other Circuits. A Chapel lot is secured to us in Wardsville. In consequence of illness of myself and family, who were

### GUELPH.

"The junction of the British and Canadian Conferences in June 1847, considerably augmented the extent of travel and the amount of labour on this Mission.

"I cannot review the past year without alluding to the deleterious influence which violent political partisanship has had upon the personal and relative piety of some of our church members. I am thankful to be enabled to state that now our people generally are walking in the fear of God, and in the comforts of the Holy Ghost. The demands for the Sabbath services of your Missionaries are more numerous than the existing exigencies of the work will permit to be met. The congregations are numerously attended, and some cheering indications are, we trust, the happy preludes to a gracious revival of religion.

"Our Sabbath Schools, which are well filled with eager learners, are in a prosperous state; and afford encouragement to hope that they may still be made, as they have hitherto been, the agencies of God in filling up the wastes of His Church.

"It is hoped that this Mission is beginning to fulfil the desires of the Committee, and that it will soon occupy the place and discharge the obligations of a regular Circuit."

### CHIPPE WA.

"This is a most important as well as interesting field of labour. During my residence on this Circuit, we have succeeded in building a plain but comfortable brick Parsonage, 26 by 36 feet; for which we are chiefly indebted to the exertions and liberality of the brethren, William and A. Vanalstine, Jesse Baxter, and D. Davis. The Parsonage is pleasantly situated in the village of Crowland, nearly in the centre of the Circuit. There are five Chapels on the Circuit, and one in the course of erection. There are 15 appointments, and 147 members. It is not for the want of liberality on the part of our members, that we are under the necessity of receiving aid out of the funds of your society; but it is for the want of numerical strength. No doubt, in a few years they will take their stand by the side of, and rank with the best Circuits in the Hamilton District.

"We had not so large an increase of membership as we could have wished for; but we have the satisfaction of knowing that some were converted, and others reclaimed from a backsliding state, and the members generally quickened, and built up, on their most holy faith."

### STRATFORD AND PEEL.

"The good Lord has given us a few happy souls, who seem to be useful and consistent members. In the name of the Holy Trinity 96 adults and infants received Christian Baptism, in a few months. In the absence of better accommodations, all our meetings, one excepted, were held in private houses; and the privilege of a shanty, even without a window is truly great. We hope to see the end of another ecclesiastical year, and witness better things. In Stratford building lots are granted, and materials on the ground, waiting a simultaneous effort. Midway to Hayesville, on the Huron road, a house of worship is almost completed, and in Wellesley we have a good frame finishing off. The two latter we hope to occupy immediately,—and when done are the first houses of our own in these parts."

### MONO.

"This is the hardest field of labour I have had assigned me since I have been in the itinerant work. I have to travel about one hundred and forty miles every fortnight, and preach sixteen times. We have 158 members."

### NOTTAWASAGA.

This Mission, which up to last Conference formed a part of the Mono Mission, is situated on the Nottawasaga Bay, and comprises the townships of Sunnidale, Nottawasaga, Collingwood, and Melancthon. At that time there was no regular weekly Class-meetings, and only very few to own God's cause. Many were the discouragements that presented themselves to the mind of the Missionary; but God has been with his unworthy servant in this part of his moral vineyard. We have on the Mission 3 classes, with 39 members, some having moved to other parts. There are several others on the Mission who would feel it a privilege to belong to our Church, but who have not as yet class-meeting within their reach; but we labour in hope, and sow the seed of Eternal Life in hope, knowing that the bread cast upon the waters shall appear after many days. We have 12 appointments; the congregations are in general large and attentive. We have also got three flourishing Sabbath Schools organized in connexion with our Church. The people on this Mission are in general poor, and consequently not able to do much for the support of the Gospel; their willingness appears equal with their ability." "We have on this Mission Class Leaders 13, Local Preachers 3, Exhorters 5, members 165. During the year we commenced one Sabbath School, which is doing very well, and we hope soon to get others in operation. We have two chapels on the Mission, and another in the way of being built. Our congregations, particularly on Sabbath are good, and I may say increasingly so. Our societies are in a quiet, and in some places in a somewhat prosperous state."

### ST. VINCENT.

"We travel to the back woods and enter into the smallest shanty, and to the inmates declare the joyful sound of gospel grace. During the year that now closes many families I have visited who are settling in those new townships—cold, and sometimes hungry and tired, after plodding through the mud, striving to save the souls of men; and thank God it has not been in vain.

"On this Mission there are at present eleven appointments for every two weeks, eight classes, and seventy members in good standing, and our congregations are increased the one-half since last Conference."

### SHANNONVILLE,

"Situated in the Victoria District, and in the township of Tyendenaga, including parts of the townships of Thurlow and Richmond, is becoming a more interesting and promising field of labour than formerly.

"During the past year the increase in membership and persons on trial is upwards of 40. We have at present 7 classes, amounting in all to 122.

"We feel much the want of a suitable place of worship, particularly for our Quarterly Meetings and other special services, at which we desire and expect a general attendance of our members of society and other friends.

"As we have witnessed much immorality in parts of this Mission, especially in the particular of Sabbath desecration, it has been our aim to impress the minds of our hearers with the vast importance of Sabbath School instruction; two have accordingly been organized, and more are contemplated."

### NORWOOD.

"In the year now ending we took ten into Society,—I think ten removals, four deaths and about twenty dropt; and like the mustering after a battle, a number could not be found among either the living, dead, or wounded, so that our returns this year are under that of last. This Mission takes in the following townships: Dummer, Otonabe, and Asphodel, on the North side the River Trent,—Seymore and Percy on the South. The time is near when a single man can be supported, and ought to be stationed on the two townships South of the Trent. Between the three townships North of the Trent and the two South there is a rough, untoward, unsettled space for several miles. 'Our past difficulties we will try to forget; our present hindrances we will try to overcome, and hope for future prosperity."

## MARMORA.

"There is a small increase in the membership. I have also the pleasure of saying, that, in addition to the very acceptable labours, occasionally, of Brother Harrison, an esteemed Local Preacher, residing in Elzevir, we have now a useful Exhorter.

"As, in all probability, the stationing committee may think proper to remove me for the ensuing year from this field of labour, having been now on it for three years, I would just say to the respected Brother who may succeed me, that he not expect either a plank or macadamized road on which to travel; neither, when he comes to a river, creek, or swamp, a smooth plank bridge on which to pass over; but that, in all these emergencies, he must get along the best way he can,—never to be discouraged, and never say 'I can't.' Of one thing we can assure him, and that is, if he is faithful and punctual, he will find himself among a warm-hearted and affectionate people.

"I cannot close this unvarnished sketch, without again adverting to (not the 'far west,' but) the far north, or intermediate space of the now wilderness country lying between the Marmora Mission and the Madawaska. During the past autumn and winter, large surveys, by the authority of Government, have been going on in this region, and the time will yet come, when, by the blessing of God upon our Missionary efforts, there will be found in our Minutes at some future day, this, or some other appropriate designation, 'The Madawaska Mission.' Confident I am, visionary as this may now appear, it will ultimately be the case. Methodism has not only a heart to feel for the lost and lonely condition of the backwoodsman, but also an ear to hear, and, following the sound of the woodman's axe, the faithful Missionary, influenced by the spirit of Christ, and thirsting for the salvation of his fellow-men, directs his course accordingly; and, as has frequently been the case, leaves his horse, leaps from log to log, or gets along the best way he can, until he reaches the humble shanty of the hardy settler, and then, in his blessed Master's name, declares to the inmates of the humble dwelling, and to the scattered population which may be called in, that Christ hath power on earth to forgive sins, and that his blood cleanses from all unrighteousness. Keep it in view !"

### SHEFFIELD.

"In taking charge of this Mission I found 103 members reported, and although the Word had been faithfully preached religion in general was quite low. Class and prayer-meetings in some places entirely abandoned, and as a natural consequence, the love of many had grown cold; but there were a few names in Sheffield who had not defiled their garments, who were looking for redemption in Christ, in the only Scriptural way, by fervently and faithfully praying, "O Lord, revive thy work." With such, and in accordance with a general wish we commenced holding a series of protracted efforts, each of which resulted in good; in quickening believers, reclaiming backsliders, and in the conversion of sinners. There has been an addition to the Church of 103 members, and after deducting 36 removals to other Circuits and places, enables us to report 170; the most of whom are doing well. We have seven classes, and each in charge of efficient Leaders. There are also several new openings, from which is heard the Macedonian cry, "Come over and help us."

### LINDSAY.

"Lindsay is situated on the banks of the Schoogog, in the township of Ops, and embraces the townships of Fenelon, Verulam, and part of Mariposa. The inhabitants of the Township of Ops are principally Irish, and in profession are Roman Catholics. They have a chapel and priest in the village. The settlers of the other townships are generally emigrants from Ireland; a few English, some Canadians, and in Verulam there is a small settlement of Scotch. The Missionary in his tour rides round Sturgeon Lake; it lies in the Township of Verulam, receiving the stream of the Schoogog from the South, and of Balsam and Bexley Lakes from the North-west. The river, in its course to Sturgeon Lake rolls over Fenelon Falls, a beautiful cascade of 21 feet high.

"The inhabitants of those townships for two years past have been greatly afflicted with fever and ague, which in many cases has been fatal. There are nine appointments on the Mission. The number of members that I found on it when I came was 27; there are now 41."

### GANANOQUE.

During the past year eight members have been dropped; twelve removed, and one died. The number now in full Church membership is sixtytwo, twelve being added to the Church. The congregations on this Mission during the latter part of the year have been good. The amount of Missionary money raised larger than last year. Many of the members are living in a high state of Christian attainment, and all for the most part are walking in the fear of God and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit. Present appearances are encouraging, and I have no doubt that under the efficient administration of my worthy successor, the Mission will become one of much importance."

## CORNWALL

"The bounds of this Mission remain very nearly the same as last year; the only alteration is, Ancaster is annexed to the Coteau Mission, and we have taken up two new appointments farther back in the Township of Finch, which increase the amount of labour. At these two appointments, the one at the Cockburn Settlement, the other at Chrislers' Mill, our congregations have been good, considering the employment of the people, the most of whom follow the lumbering business, and the time of our meetings, viz., on a week day evening. Some pleasing indications of a revival have lately appeared in this part of the work, which I think should encourage the Committee to continue their labours in this but long-neglected Township. Our appointments in Roxborough and Charlotenburgh are still attended with encouraging prospects. Our bounds might be much enlarged in this direction; "there remaineth yet much land to be possessed."

## OSGOODE.

"Our borders have been enlarged during the year now closing. We have taken up three new appointments, which will be attended regular

once in four weeks; also, three others attended occasionally. These added to the former appointments, ten in number, make the travelling extensive and the labours severe, scattered as they are through five townships in a new country, and the roads extremely bad. The greater part of this field of labour is emphatically Missionary ground.

"During the year 31 have professed to find peace with God, and united with us in Church-fellowship, and are giving satisfactory evidence of the genuineness of the work of Divine grace upon their hearts. Four have been received by certificate, thirteen have removed to other parts, eight dropped for nonattendance, two have died, and one expelled, leaving an increase of eleven. We have three Sabbath Schools in efficient operation, in which there are about 130 scholars, and fourteen teachers. Two of these have been organized during the year, and two Sunday School Libraries purchased from the Book Room.

"The time has arrived when the labours of a second preacher are much required to cultivate this field. The destitution of the means of grace in several new settlements within the compass of this Mission is very great, and in many instances the people are hungering for the bread of life, but are not possessed of pecuniary means for supporting the gospel as they wish. It is unanimously admitted by the members that there is sufficient labour for two preachers; and it is generally thought that two would be as well, if not better, supported than one is now. I think if the Conference could send two the ensuing year there might be a large ingathering of redeemed souls into the fold of Christ;—the blessing of heaven secured, and the money expended in sending the gospel to the destitute within the bounds of this Mission will be refunded in the course of time."

### COTEAU LANDING.

"Coteau Landing.—During the past year I have preached at this place every Sabbath, except on Quarterly Meeting and other extraordinary occasions. Those of the inhabitants who are Protestants are Presbyterians and Episcopalians. We have an intelligent and (all things considered) tolerably large congregation; and a deep and increasing interest is felt in the preaching of the Word. I have formed the nucleus of a class, and I indulge the hope that we will soon have a flourishing society at Coteau Landing. The people of the place have contributed several pounds towards the support of the Gospel on the Mission during the past year; and if they can have preaching every Sabbath, they will continue their support.

"Lancaster.—This place formerly belonged to the Glengarry Mission; but being about twice as far from Cornwall as from Coteau Landing, it has been attached to the last named place. The inhabitants are chiefly Scotch, though many of them are descendants of the U. E. Loyalists. Most of them belong to the Churches in connection with the Established and Free Churches of Scotland. We have a large and attentive congregation; among the members of which there are, I think, some serious

inquirers after truth. I feel very confident in the belief that Methodism will yet gain a permanent footing here, and be a blessing to the place.

"Fort, Coteau du Lac.—This place is three miles east of Coteau Landing. It is a Military post, kept by a small detachment of the Royal Canadian Rifle Regiment. Some of them are pious, and most of them have regularly attended the meetings which I have held in a comfortable room, with which I was kindly furnished by Mr. T. Sanderson, Barrack-Sergeaut.

"Coté, St. Charles.—At this place we have a prosperous and interesting Society. The early settlers of the place were a few families from Cumberland, England, who, when they left their father-land, brought Religion with them as their best treasure. Methodism has had a footing here for many years, and, under God, has accomplished much good. It may, however, be said, 'there remaineth yet much land to be possessed.' Our 'ministrations' are attended by an overwhelming congregation; and as our friends do not like to be so sorely elbowed, as they frequently are when attending Divine service in the 'old school-house,' they have wisely determined to build a commodious chapel. I have secured a Chapel Deed, and the friends have already done much towards the erection of a comfortable building. Number in Society, 20.

"Coté St. Henry.—In this neighbourhood we have a small, though prosperous Society. Nearly all the Protestants in the place are members of our Church. The congregation is small, though it is as large as could be expected in any place similarly situated. Number in Society, 9.

"Ottawa Glass Works.—I have preached regularly at this place for several months past. There are several Protestant families in the neighbourhood, besides a number of Americans who are engaged in the factory. I am not without a hope that, if we make use of the means provided in the Gospel for the salvation of men, we shall yet see the accomplishment of the end in this part of the Mission.

"Besides preaching regularly at the above-named places, I have occasionally visited and preached in the Township of Newton, and also in St. Timothy and La Guerra, on the south side of Lake St. Francis. There are some Protestant settlements near the boundary line between Western and Eastern Canada in which Methodism is, as yet, but little known. Our principles are spreading, however; and I think that in the course of another year some more appointments may be added to this Mission."

## ST. ANDREWS.

"This Mission is situated on the north side of the Ottawa River, and is the eastern extent of the missionary work in connexion with the Canada Conference. The Mission embraces a country extending from east to west twenty-five miles, and nearly the same distance north from the river. The interior of the country is mountainous, and the roads exceedingly rough, making the travelling laborious, and in some places difficult. We have 17 regular appointments, and others which are occasional, in a month.

"During the past year, God has graciously smiled on our humble efforts to extend the Redeemer's Kingdom. More than 60 persons have united in church fellowship, as the result of several special efforts. We have, however, only an increase of 20 members, owing to removals and other causes. We are not discouraged in this department of the great missionary field. Our congregations are increasingly large; and in some of the settlements where we have formed Classes, there are intimations of a more extended work of God in the conversion of sinners."

## PEMBROKE.

"Notwithstanding our field of labour is in this nerthern frigid zone, there are many warm-hearted friends for whose kindness I shall ever feel grateful while reason holds her sway. Though the people were without spiritual instruction during the first quarter, yet they did not murmur, but sympathised with me in my afflictions. During the winter, brother G. B. Butcher came to reside on this Mission, by his assistance on the Sabbaths I was enabled to meet regularly all the appointments with the exception of two, yet frequently had to drive forty miles during the day and try to preach in the evening,—wearied nature oft became nearly exhausted, yet to miss an appointment is an unpardonable omission. We have not had that prosperity which we most sincerely desired. We have had to prune a little; but we now have peace and unanimity in all our borders. Within the last few weeks there appear some awakenings among the people, and some are anxiously enquiring what they must do to be saved."

### BONCHERE.

"This Mission extends from the mouth of the Madawaska River to Lake Darie, a distance of seventy miles, embracing the following townships, viz.: Macnab, Horton, Admiston, Bagot, Darlany, and Bromly. We have 14 regular appointments in three weeks. The roads in those parts are of the worst description, almost impassable in the Spring and Fall. We have 30 in Society; but our members being so situated, that there are but two regular Glasses. Our prospects throughout the Mission are more encouraging than they were."

The Committee deeply regret that from the following fields of labour upon which portions of the funds of the Society have been expended during the year, reports of the state of the work have not been received up to the time of finishing the Annual Report, viz.:—Amherstburg, York, Barrie, Amherst Isle, Sherbrook, Clarendon, Onslow, and Buckingham.
