Laying these matters to heart before our God, may we all continue to labor so faithfully this year that it may be truly said of us as a people :- "They go from strength to strength."

SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Board of Managers of Melville Church,

COTE ST. ANTOINE.

The Board of Managers beg to present their report for the year just past, being the sixth.

In reference to the financial statement which will be read by the Treasurer. It will be seen that the whole of the floating debt has now been paid off and that there is a balance on hand of \$256.08, towards reduction of the mortgage debt, which however, cannot be paid on account until we have one thousand dollars on hand.

The ordinary expenditure has been greater in the past year, but has been met by an increase in revenue. It is worthy of note however, that the plate collections have decreased in amount somewhat.

The Board would again impress upon you the necessity for continued efforts towards the final extinction of this whole debt. At present there are 115 contributors to ordinary revenue, of whom only 45 have adopted the scheme for reduction of debt, inaugurated two

In accordance with resolution adopted at a special meeting held on 23rd December last, a contract had been entered into for the wiring and fitting up of the Church and rooms to light them by electricity. It is expected that the new light will be introduced at an early day. The Managers recommend that a special subscription to defray this expense, be made.

The Managers have pleasure in recommending that the Pastor's salary be increased by \$100, for the ensuing year.

In conclusion your Board would tender sincere thanks to the Pastor, Kirk Session, and the various organizations connected with the Church, for their hearty co-operation and assistance when required.

FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT OF The Melville Church Missionary Society. for Year ending January 13, 1892.

As will be seen by the financial statement the amounts contributed in 1891 fall short of the amounts contributed in 1890 by \$25:46, the present report shewing \$171.00 as compared with last statement \$196.46. It is not easy to account for this decrease, but perhaps the subject of Missionary contributions has not been as prominently kept before the congregation during the past year as upon former years. Your Committee hoped that the free distribution to the congregation of the Missionary Record would have the effect of keeping the wants of the different fields constantly before your notice. This object may have been attained, but it evidently has not had the effect of increasing the contributions.

Your Committee have continued the free distribution of the Record for another year notwithstanding that the price has increased, in the hope that good and generous results will prove the wisdom of this action. Your Committee are aware that the amounts contributed through this Society are not the only amounts contributed to missions and benevolent works,—Sabbath-school Missions, Mission Bands, Ladies' Aids, as well as other good and useful schemes have been maintained, and it may be that what is deficient in this department may have been more than made up in the other departments.

ANNUAL REPORT OF The Ladies' Aid Society of Melville Church.

The Ladies' Aid Society present the following report of their work for the past year, and of the work undertaken for the year 1802.

At the annual meeting of the Society held last October, several pressing claims for assistance presented themselves. After careful consideration it was resolved to clothe a girl in the Mackay Institute who was entirely destitute and had no friends, and also to continue to clothe one boy in the same institution. In addition to assuming this obligation, the Society have continued to do sewing for a member of the congregation afflicted with blindness. These three cases have provided ample work for the members of the Society at their meetings every Tuesday afternoon.

Finding that the Society was in lack of funds to carry on their work, an appeal was made last autumn to the congregation for assistance. We are grateful to acknowledge the responses to our appeal which enabled us to continue our good work.

During last summer the Society received a request from the Secretary of the Y.M.C.A. asking the Society to bear, along with other churches in the city, the cost of furnishing their new building on Dominion Square. Some members of the Society undertook the work, and were successful in raising the sum of \$32.50 which has been paid over to the Secretary of the Association.

In all our labour we have experienced the joy which is gained by ministering to the wants of others, and which in return blesses our own lives.

or an average, including teachers and officers, of 196 per Sabbath as against 203 for 1890.

The decrease is probably owing largely to the influence of the dread disease which overshadowed our town during the autumn and which in its ravages carried off more than one of our scholars.

Contrary to the custom of former years it was decided as an experiment to continue the school session during the month of July, and we think the attendance was sufficiently encouraging to warrant the continuance of the school during the twelve months of next year.

MISSIONARY COLLECTIONS.—The receipts per class boxes during the year have been \$184.03 and per special plate collections \$33.62, a total of \$217.65, as compared with \$215.76 last year.

LIBRARY.—During the year ninety-six new books were added to the Library at the cost of \$49.62; \$16.00 of this was subscribed by an officer of the school, the balance, \$33.62, being raised by special collection in the school. The books are kept in thorough repair by the librarians and now number 957 volumes.

PIC-NIC.—The annual pic-nic was held at Otterburn Park on the 20th June, and was enjoyed by a large number of the scholars and their friends.

MISSION BAND.—The members of this Band continue to make garments for the needy, and still support a cot in the children's ward of the General Hospital.

Band of Hope.—The Band of Hope continued its work until the end of the spring season. At the re-opening of the school in September, after very fully considering the matter, the teachers deemed it unwise to continue the fortnightly meetings for the winter, but have decided to bring the matter more definitely before the scholars in the school, and with this in view have placed the temperance pledge within reach of every scholar. Already quite a number have availed themselves of the opportunity of signing.

In presenting this our second annual report we would gratefully acknowledge God's goodness in guiding us through another year.

At the close of this year our roll shows 35 active and 13 associate members, making quite a decrease in numbers owing principally to removals from the vicinity and other causes, only a few new members being added to the roll. But although our numbers are fewer, we trust that a greater spirit of earnestness and an increased desire for usefulness in the Master's service, has sprung up among our young people and is showing itself in various channels.

The Charitable Committee, have under their special care an aged couple, who are most deserving of the help given them in various ways, they have also assisted in other deserving cases.

The Missionary Committee, have adopted a new system of collecting money, by each member voluntarily giving two cents a week for Missions, and the result so far is quite satisfactory, they have also collected and sent Sunday School, Missionary and Illustrated papers and Magazines to different parts of Cauada.

The Flower Committee have kept the pulpit supplied with a bouquet every Sunday and on a few occasions special decorations have been made. The society is deeply indebted to several members of the Church for flowers sent them during the year. The other committees have attended faithfully to their several duties as occasions demanded.

Judging from the results of our delegates' visit to the St. Louis convention last year, we deemed it a necessity to send another to the Minneapolis convention. Our president, Miss Robina Kerr, was chosen and accompanied by three of our members, attended the convention. Judging from her very full report read to the society on her return, showed that our choice had been well made.

Altogether we have cause for much thankfulness, and our earnest prayer is that God may still continue to guide and direct us in the future as He has done in the past.
