To Quebec in 27 Hours.
A reporter of the Citizen took passage at 7.10 p. m. on the Intercolonial Railway for Quebec, which city was reached from Halifax in 27 hours. As this denotes the completion of a great feat, the completion of which our contemporary a description of the passenger.
The first part of the journey from Halifax to Moncton is so well known that no description is necessary; but after leaving Moncton, the Northern Division as it is called, commences, and of this the general public knows very little. From Moncton the road runs through an uninviting state of country with scarcely a house to vary the monotony of the scene until Miramichi is approached. At this point, which is reached by the Halifax night train at 12.20, the country begins to improve, and although the opportunities for sight-seeing at night are very limited, glimpses could be obtained of comfortable looking houses and farms, but it is not until after Campbellton is reached, that the best part of the journey commences. From Campbellton the scenery is simply wonderful in its beauty. The Metapedia River, along the banks of which the road runs, is a fine, rapid stream, with here and there an island, both the banks and the islands being covered with timber, and the water, either by hand or by machine, both for beauty and grandeur, which cannot be surpassed, we believe, anywhere. After passing Metapedia the road runs through a more level tract of country, a great deal of which seems to be devoted to agriculture.
